### **JANUARY 4, FRIDAY**

*Feast of St. John Neumann:*

### **JANUARY 25, FRIDAY**

*Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle:*

"It is Faith in Jesus Christ that brings salvation. May we always realize that our good works are a thanksgiving and response for this gift"

### **FEBRUARY 1, FRIDAY**

*First Friday of February:*

"That we may grow in our devotion for the poor and the sick"
