Faith and Family - Gifts To Be Nurtured

FAITH

By way of a fortune cookie, at the end of a meal in a restaurant, one of the best definitions of faith came my way: "Faith is the bird that feels the light and begins to sing while the dawn is still dark."

Faith is a gift given to us from God to see the world not as the world sees itself, but as God sees it.

We are called to be people of light in a world that is often filled with darkness.

This gift of faith doesn't just maintain itself. It must be nurtured if it is to grow and deepen into a way of life.

The Season of Lent provides an opportunity to tend to our faith. Through the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we have significant moments in which we can "grow the faith."

Why are we called to prayer?

Because we do not pray enough! There are 1,440 minutes in the course of every day. How many of those minutes are spent in

prayer? How many of those minutes are spent in connecting with God, the source of all that we are and all that we have?

Why are we called to fasting?

Because we live life in excess! Be it food, drink, recreation, shopping, time spent "just on me," or negative activities like gossiping, judging, condemning, ridiculing, etc., we live life in excess.

What things are we able to let go of, from which to fast, at least for awhile? And then when we feel the craving, the longing, the desire of that pleasure or activity, can we, in that moment, ask God to come in and fill that emptiness?

We fast in order to make room for God in our lives, to create ever greater space for God to come into our lives and to keep us focused and in the right direction, the direction that leads to God's Reign, and away from the things of this world which are all passing away right before our eyes.

Why do we give alms?

There will come a time in our lives when we will die and will have to give all that we are and all that we have back to God. There is no better time than now, to start getting ready, by giving alms.

Our closets are full, our garages are full, our storage units are full, our wallets and bank accounts are full. We are the richest nation on the face of the earth.

Giving alms now helps us to ready ourselves for the ultimate give-a-away!

And it provides for those who have less than us and are in need of the basic elements of life!

Faith is not just personal; it is also communal. We live our faith in community with our family, our parish family, and with the world around us.

Music Ministry at the Church of St. Thomas More Is...

...God-centered

"Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!"

—Psalm 95:2 (NRSV)

...Inclusive

Everyone in the parish will be made to feel welcome to participate in the music ministry.

... Appropriate

Music presented as part of Mass will always be offered in support of the scripture appointed for the day or in support of the message of the homily. On other occasions, it will support the theme of or the reason for the gathering.

...Eclectic

Our parish is comprised of people who represent many parts of the cultural, religious, and social spectra of our community. It therefore follows that our ministry must be varied in order to reach as many of these different backgrounds as possible. While we will not be able to reach everyone all the time, we will make every effort to touch most of the people as often as practically possible.

Varying musical approaches will be used: including the use of vocalists and instrumentalists available from within the parish as well as, on occasion, guest

musicians from outside the parish who might be brought in to fulfill a specific need not available from within.

Varying musical styles and genres will be used: including music from different historical periods that we might both celebrate our music past and explore today's creativity; and music from other cultures and countries and in other languages as befits the global nature of our church (non-English-language pieces will always be translated).

...Loving


Choirs and other music ensembles are necessarily social entities, and as such they will provide a loving and supportive environment in which people involved in these groups might flourish spiritually and emotionally.

...Educational

Each person involved with the ministry will continually be presented with the "tools of the trade" that they may become more able to understand the craft of musicmaking. This teaching will be both overt in the form of instructional moments during rehearsals and more subtle using other behind-the-scenes methods.

...Ecumenical

Music provides the opportunity for churches to come together to celebrate our oneness in God in spite of ongoing and sometimes divisive differences. We will participate in musical activities that help to bridge this gap among Christian denominations whenever possible.



This basic formation is required for all new ministers. Topics include: Theology and Celebration of the Eucharist, Ministry to the Sick, and The Role of the Extraordinary Minister.





CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP The Requirement

When Jesus asked the Samaritan woman for a drink of water, He opened the door for a life-changing relationship with Him. Scripture says her testimony also drew many others to Him.

We must be ready to respond whenever and wherever the Lord speaks to us. This means we need to be prepared to change our lives, and put our faith into action. Be prepared for a change in your comfort zone. It will feel good!

The story is told of a headmistress of a boarding school who used to say, "Don't go around with a Bible under your arm if you don't sweep under the bed." She was looking for a genuine faith, which means a faith that is practiced. There wasn't room for any spiritual talk coming out of a messy room, so to speak.

During Jesus' three years as an itinerant rabbi He knew what it was to be weary, hungry and homeless. The common people were glad to hear His message, but the religious elite could not stand Him. Jesus was often misquoted, misunderstood, misrepresented, misjudged and had every reason to feel lonely in the world of men, but it was thus that He "earned" and demonstrated for us the meaning of obedience—through the things that He suffered.

To walk with Jesus is to walk the Way of the Cross. If the cross we are asked to take up is not presented to us in the form of heroic action of some kind, martyrdom, dragons or labyrinths or even "ministry"—at least something that looks spiritual—are we to conclude that He has waived the requirement?

He never waives the requirement.

If we get stuck in the rut of thinking our gifts of time, talent and treasure need to be perfect, we will miss many an opportunity that God has planted squarely in front of us.



Future Support and Estate Planning Options

Towers of Faith is a grass-roots movement that has arisen due to the visionary leadership and overt generosity of several of our parishioners.



These individuals (several anonymous) have included the St. Thomas More in their estate planning. This helps to ensure their ongoing support and a legacy for our Parish.

Towers of Faith is our future support. Future support refers to gifts which are the result of a parishioner's various means of estate planning vehicles such as:


