
CATECHUMENS

Perhaps the change in our liturgical life since Vatican II that seems the strangest is the Sunday dismissal of those preparing for initiation into the Catholic church. Each week during much of the year, after the scripture readings and homily, the presider invites those who have publicly expressed a desire for full membership in the church to leave the assembled community and to continue to reflect on the riches of God's word with a trained leader called a catechist.

Those of us who are old enough might remember the pre-Vatican II division of the Mass into (1) The Mass of the Catechumens and (2) The Mass of the Faithful. This terminology reflected the ancient practice of dismissing catechumens (who are preparing for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil) immediately after the homily. What at first seems like an inhospitable act-sending someone out of our midst-is, on another level, an act of true hospitality. Those who are not yet able to eat with us at the Lord's table are sent out to be further nourished with the word of God. (It might be more inhospitable to eat and drink in front of them!)

The presence of those preparing for initiation is a blessing for any parish community. Each Sunday they remind us of the church's (often unspoken) invitation to visitors to join our ranks. But perhaps even more profound than that, the question, "Why are they leaving?" leads to the thought, "Why am I staying?" Seen through the eyes of the catechumens, who are not yet able to be nourished at the Lord's table, our Sunday obligation is transformed into a Sunday privilege.

St. Perpetua & St. Felicity

"When my father in his affection for me was trying to turn me from my purpose by arguments and thus weaken my faith, I said to him, 'Do you see this vessel—water pot or whatever it may be? Can it be called by any other name than what it is?' 'No,' he replied. 'So also I cannot call myself by any other name than what I am—a Christian.'"

So writes Perpetua, young, well-educated, a noblewoman of Carthage, mother of an infant son and chronicler of the persecution of the Christians by Emperor Septimius Severus.

Despite threats of persecution and death, Perpetua, Felicity (a slavewoman) and three companions, Revocatus, Secundulus and Saturninus, refused to renounce their Christian faith.

Persecution for religious beliefs is not confined to Christians in ancient times. Consider Anne Frank, the Jewish girl who, with her family, was forced into hiding and later died in Bergen-Belsen during World War II. Anne, like Perpetua and Felicity, endured hardship and suffering and finally death because she committed herself to God.


Perpetua, unwilling to renounce Christianity, comforted her father in his grief over her decision, "It shall happen as God shall choose, for assuredly we depend not on our own power but on the power of God."

Perpetua, Felicity, and their companions were killed in the Emperor's games.

Kid's Tough Questions

"My friends gossip about each other. Should I try to or just stop them keep quiet?"



- "Being quiet and not joining in gossip is a good start, but in time, the child might simply express something like, 'I'd rather not talk about them when they aren't here. I know I'd be hurt if others were talking about me this way."" ~ Karl Bastian
- "If you feel bold, ask your friends if they've talked about you lately when you weren't around. Then you might have a chance to stop gossip. Ask God to help you to be strong. It's hard to take a stand for what's right when others don't see what they're doing as wrong." ~ Lori Valenzisi
- "You can't 'push' your friends into doing what's right. But you can take the lead by walking away when they start gossiping. To stay says, 'I'm with you in hurting this person.' So be known as the person who speaks well of others, and take the lead in finding positive things to say about others." ~ John Trent
- "Start by asking, 'What do you think about gossiping?' By encouraging the child to think about what s/he already knows about gossiping, s/he'll most likely come to the conclusion that gossiping isn't the best thing to do with friends. How rewarding for a child when s/he comes to his/her own conclusion and is motivated to act wisely!" ~ Amy Dolan

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP From Fear To Trust

The emotion of fear alerts us to the presence of threat and triggers our natural systems of protection and survival, namely flight or fight. The gospel asks us to trust, but that trust—that fidelity to the gospel—s never instinctive. We find that trust only when we are aware of feelings of fear.

. . . But fear does more than alert us to the presence of danger; fear invites us to trust even when there is no assurance that everything will be all right. We should be afraid of the things that Jesus asks of us. (*They are not always easy requests!*)

When we feel fear in response to a gospel call to forgive those who have harmed us, to care for those who may be dangerous, to risk loving those who will not or cannot love us, to speak openly against wrong-doing or about what is truly important to us when it is not popular, fear can push us either toward hiding and inaction or toward aggression and hostility for those who do not support us.

But if fear is an invitation to trust, it calls forth a response to take significant risks. It is risky to come out of the boat in a storm.

We may have learned that fear is the mark of cowards; we may have learned that the strong and the brave are fearless. Nothing could be further from the truth. The fearless are often dangerous, senselessly risking their own lives and the lives of others.

Heroes and cowards alike share the feeling of fear. Their response is what makes them different: flight or fight for the coward; for the hero, the response is trust. (excerpted from Liguorian, February 2008)

Once again this weekend we hear about the blind man who was willing to let Jesus minister to him. One can only imagine that in those days this blind man had experienced fear many times, yet he willingly obeyed Jesus. The blind man's trust was evident.



Meanwhile, the Pharisees were so fearful of Jesus' message that they spent all their time and energy trying to disprove a miracle. How sad that their energy and efforts were the result of jealousy, insecurity and anger.


How sad, too, that today some spend incredible amounts of time, energy and money on efforts resulting from fear and mistrust.

As Bishop Brom mentioned when he visited STM in December, it is a good thing to examine our circumstance in life from time to time. We may not realize that while "This is not the ship I signed up for" it may very well be the ship that God assigned to us.

Lent is a good time to reflect upon what is happening in your life. Are you struggling with difficult issues and situations? Pray about them, and consider that they might be part of your assignment. Whatever the cross, carry it with love and trust.


