

Fighting Faithfully

Fighting faithfully is hard. Fighting faithfully is scary. We don't have any idea how another person is going to react. And, often, though we know what we are supposed to do, we do not have any idea of how to do it.

But if we look at Jesus' ministry, if we look at the way Jesus dealt with people, we can learn how to fight faithfully.

- 1. Jesus shows us that the resolution of conflict is always carried out in a caring and especially loving manner—never from a vengeful posture. Expressing our feelings (even our anger) is appropriate as long as it is not done in a destructive manner. And so when we confront or ask questions, we must be careful to state our position in such a way that we do not intentionally harm the other. And if a question is harmful, if it has an edge, we need to ask to have it rephrased in a more careful way.
- Attacking ideas is different from attacking the person and the person's motivation. Attacking an idea is not wounding. We can work to change, improve, defend, and explain an idea. However, attacking a person or a

person's motivation hurts. It ignores the issues, causes defensiveness, and only worsens the situation.

- 3. We watch our tongues. We do not use "always" or "never" statements. We avoid exaggeration and generalization, and are careful with the facts. Shouting is only a smoke screen to solving the issues; a smoke screen that generally suggests that one party does not really want to solve the issues or that it is time to take a break.
- 4. If someone says that they are hurt, we should not say, "Sorry you took it wrong. But I did not say anything wrong." Responses like that suggest that they are wrong, that they should not feel hurt, that they are too sensitive, and that I am unfeeling. If someone says that they are hurt, we say, "Thanks for telling me and expressing your hurt. I am sorry. I did not intend to hurt you. Forgive me." Responses like these show compassion. Apologies make us a better person. People expect us to make mistakes, but they need us to own up to the mistakes we

There will always be conflict, disagreement of ideas and positions, and mistakes will be made. How we handle them makes all the difference!

HOPING NOT TO LOSE MY JOB

Fr. Mike's Bookies returns this fall, and on November 5 your Director of Music puts his job on the line to lead a discussion of Thomas Day's provocatively titled book, *Why Catholics Can't Sing: The Culture of Catholicism and the Triumph of Bad Taste*.

In chapter one, Day sets the scene:

Contemplate this very odd situation.

Today, a large number of Roman Catholics in the United States who go to church regularly—perhaps the majority—rarely or barely sing any of the music. If you think about it, this stands out as a most curious development in the history of Christianity.

What could possibly cause this odd behavior of American Catholics? The problem is certainly not one of unfamiliarity. The "new music" and the practice of singing during a liturgy were introduced into the American "mainstream" parish over twenty years ago...Are American Catholics offering some kind of resistance to the liturgical innovations that hit them in the 1960s? If we can judge from all the polls, the answer is no. Most Catholics say they are in favor of "the changes," even though they do not seem to ratify them in song. What is going on here? Why do the polls tell us one thing and why does a visit to almost any parish seem to tell us that a sullen rebellion is taking place? Why won't Catholics sing?

This book is about the culture of American Christianity and what it does to our understanding of God, self, and community as reflected in the way Christians worship.

The Catholic world has been in a state of transition since the changes wrought by the Second Vatican Council that continues even to the present. Forty years on, we continue to adjust to this "new" approach—emotionally, liturgically, musically.

Written in 1990, Thomas Day's book can be seen as a response to the culture and practice of American Catholic music twenty years after the Vatican II.

Day grabs one's attention and does not let it go. Every page is interesting, and what he is writing strikes one a eminently true.

Little Rock Bible Studies: Working in the Desert: Amos, Hosea, and Micah

The books of Hosea, Amos, and Micah are three books of the Book of the Twelve, which is a collection of various shorter prophetic books that have frequently been called the Minor Prophets. The term "minor" refers to the length of composition, in comparison to those of Major Prophets; for example, Isaiah.

The prophetic books are not easy to read. The prophets were for the most part activists rather than authors, more engaged in preaching than in the activity of writing. "By prophecy, we understand not specifically or even principally the forecasting of the future—but rather the mediation and interpretation of the divine mind and will,"

Expressions of Stewardship

Each new day offers opportunities to reflect stewardship in the love of God and our neighbors. The readings today make very clear that we are, in fact, our brother's and sister's keepers. We are charged with the responsibility of helping others when that is possible and necessary.

Suzanne Erpenbach, Stewardship Director for the Diocese of Knoxville, Tennessee shares some very easy and common sense ways of expressing stewardship during September. These start with Labor Day, but work well anytime of the year:

- 1. Labor Day ~ This holiday celebrates the value and dignity of work and its role in the American way of life. Talents and abilities are gifts from God to be discovered, developed, used and responsibly shared with others. Trace careers/vocations of family members to appreciate the diversity and value of God's gifts to individuals.
- 2. Organize calendars/schedules for good use of time and talents.
- 3. Make a special effort to greet everyone you meet each day.
- Track your acts of kindness throughout the day. Make notes for expansion.
- 5. **Read a Book Day** ~ We learn and grown through our experiences of reading. Read to others and/or enjoy special reading time alone.
- 6. Evaluate the progress and accomplishments of the work week. Give thanks for God-given talents and abilities.
- 7. **National Grandparents Day** (today, September 7!) ~ Celebrate this generation of family with a meal, visit, phone call or a personal note.
- 8. Consider how the care of your property reflects your being a good neighbor to others.
- 9. Make a list of the things you've learned from your Christian stewardship efforts.
- 10.Positive Thinking Day ~ Our attitude reflects a mindset of stewardship. Consider the values and impressions positive thinking provides. (Remember that, no matter what, a smile is the shortest distance between two people. CS)



Guided by the Holy Spirit, we make our world a better place. Suzanne Erpenbach is on the right track, and we can be too. Taking care and charge of our God-given gifts (that means everything) is not optional. The way we do this is witnessed by God 24/7.
