NAME THAT TUNE!


Over the summer, a number of people asked me how music is chosen for Mass each week, and I thought that I would share with you some of the thinking that goes into the planning of the musical portion of our liturgies.

When I pick music for our congregation to sing each week, there are a number of criteria that go into the decision, including:

- Does the text of the song or hymn speak to the scriptures being proclaimed at that liturgy?
- Is the tune familiar so that we are promoting the Church's goal of the assembly's "full, active, and conscious participation" in the liturgy (our goal since Vatican II)?
- If a hymn or song is not familiar, do we present it often enough over a period of time so that the congregation can learn it well?
- Have we sung a piece too often in the recent past?
- Are there any special circumstances that warrant specific pieces? (For example, for First Communion liturgies, I choose songs that the children know so they are more inclined to sing at their special liturgy, especially those songs with references to children and to the Eucharist.)
- Have we included at least one traditional hymn almost every week?
- Have we included at least one song from the Monday Night Mass "repertoire" almost every week?
- Have we included at least one song or psalm that the organ can accompany if the Parish's volunteer organist is present?

Looking at the longer view—that is, our musical choices over the course of a year or throughout the three-year liturgical cycle—my thinking includes the following questions:

 Are we balancing our Parish's repertoire so that all of our members feel included in our congregational song? This is why we sing

Study Question for Chapter 5

Fr. Mike's Bookies returns on November 5, when Douglas Lynn will be leading a discussion of Why Catholics Can't Sing: The Culture of Catholicism and the Triumph of Bad Taste.

How is your reading going? Here's a question about Chapter 5 to think about as you read.

At the end of the chapter, the author makes a distinction between "horizontal" and "vertical" relationships among worshipers, clergy, and musicians. How do these relationships encourage or discourage congregational singing?

traditional hymns, contemporary songs suggested by the youth of the Parish, Gregorian chant (especially though Lent and in other seasons), and songs written more recently as part of the post-Vatican II ideal.

• Are we honoring the Church's musical past with music from different eras and styles? Over the past couple of years, the choirs have sung music from many different eras of music history, including Gregorian chant (13th and 14th century) and songs by Palestrina (Renaissance), by Bach (Baroque), by Mozart (Classical), and Russian music from the 19th century (Romantic), African-American spirituals (late 19th and early 20th century), and myriad songs from the last fifty years that are worthy of inclusion in the worship of God. This is why we sing "old" hymns and "new" praise songs.

Indeed, it is a balancing act, part science and part art, and one that I am honored to perform for this faith community.

Please let me know if you have questions or suggestions as we make music together, expressing our communal prayer and praise to our loving God.

Attitudes Count More Than Achievements

Jesus tells us that many are called to the Father's "heavenly banquet table." We are invited to this celebration as if it were a "wedding feast." Imagine a wedding feast invitation from God!

We know too well, however, that few are chosen. What a shame that this is due to the manner in which God's invitation is treated and/or avoided altogether. Amazingly enough, the "attitude of gratitude" is one that many choose to ignore.

How have we treated the Lord's invitation to participate in the banquet ~ the invitation ~ this week? What have we done to prepare ourselves for the feast that awaits us.

Jesus came to serve His Father and asks us to do the same. Doing God's will isn't always easy and even requires sacrifice. Giving of "our" time, talents and resources can really get in the way of a "comfy lifestyle" can't it?

It is important to remember that 'our' time, talents and resources are gifts from God. They are only on loan to us during this lifetime. How we handle our gifts is important and a key factor to entering God's kingdom after our time on earth has passed.

Rick Warren, author of *The Purpose-Driven Life*, has a true grasp of Christian Stewardship, part of which I share with you today:

Real servants don't try to use God for their purposes. They let God use them for God's purposes.

Service starts in your mind. God is more interested in *why* we do something than in what we do. Servants think like stewards (managers) and not owners and remember that *God owns it all*.

To become a real servant you are going to have to settle the issue of money in your life. Jesus said, "No servant can serve two masters. . . You cannot serve both God and money." He didn't say ministry and living for money are mutually exclusive goals.



Which one will you choose? Money has the greatest potential to replace God in your life. More people are sidetracked from God by materialism than by anything else, saying "After I achieve my financial goals, I'm going to serve God."

Wealth is certainly not a sin, but failing to use it for God's glory is. The Bible is clear: God uses money to test your faithfulness. That is why Jesus talked more about money than he did about either heaven or hell. He said, "If you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches."
