#### Love Deeply

The Christian call to be people of love is ever before us. The pain of love is most felt when we experience the death of a loved one.

As we celebrate this Feast of All Souls, we painfully remember all of our loved ones who have gone before us in death.

May these words of Fr. Henri Nouwen, taken from his book, *The* Inner Voice of Love, strengthen us to continue to be people of love, even as we experience, not only the joy of love, but also its pain:

Do not hesitate to love and to love deeply. You might be afraid of the pain that deep love can cause. When those you love deeply reject you, leave you, or die, your heart will be broken. But that should not hold you back from loving deeply. The pain that comes from deep love makes your love ever more fruitful. It is like a plow that breaks the ground to allow the seed to take root and grow into a strong plant. Every time you experience the pain of rejection, absence, or death, you are faced with a choice. You can become bitter and decide not to love again, or you can stand straight in

your pain and let the soil on which you stand become richer and more able to give life to new seeds.

The more you have loved and have allowed yourself to suffer because of your love, the more you will be able to let your heart grow wider and deeper. When your love is truly giving and receiving, those whom you love will not leave your heart even when they depart from you. They will become part of your self and thus gradually build a community within you.

Those you have deeply loved become part of you. The longer you live, there will always be more people to be loved by you and to become part of your inner community. The wider your inner community becomes, the more easily you will recognize your own brothers and sisters in the strangers around you. Those who are alive within you will recognize those who are alive around you. The wider the community of your heart, the wider the community around you. Thus the pain of rejection, absence, and death can become fruitful. Yes, as you love deeply the ground of your heart will be broken more and more, but you will rejoice in the abundance of the fruit it will bear.


The Parish's Book of the Dead will be available during this time so that we can inscribe the names of our beloved dead, inviting the Parish to remember them in prayer during the month.

# Worker Justice News: Living Wage Victory!

The San Diego City Council unanimously approved the Center for Policy Initiatives (CPI) package of proposals to strengthen and extend the Living Wage Ordinance! The vote on Monday, October 20, came after a rally and worker testimony organized by CPI, the San Diego-Imperial Counties Labor Council, and the Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice (ICWJ).

This important victory will greatly boost the impact of the living wage law enacted in 2005. It closes loopholes in the application of the law and creates a fair and open process for investigating and correcting violations by contractors.



#### Parish Social Justice Ministry at STM

It is the aim of the Parish Social Justice Committee to introduce you not only to what we at St. Thomas More are doing in the local community, but to what goes on in our greater church, that has called us to "Conversion and Action." Ever since Pope Leo XIII's Encyclical, "Rerum Novarum," and Pope Pius XI's "Quadragesimo Anno," the thinking of the laity began to change gradually. We slowly became (and are still becoming) aware of our rights and responsibilities of "Reconstructing the Social Order that decries the effects of greed and concentrated economic power on working people and society."

The popes propose a society based on subsidiarity. Our bishops, in their "Called to Faithful Citizenship" letter, emphasize that "this is a time to bring together the guidance of the Gospel and the opportunities of our democracy to shape a society more respectful of human life and dignity, and more committed to justice and peace." The Catholic Legislative Network," a partnership of all twelve California Dioceses and the California Catholic Conference (CCC), urges us to learn more about public policy, contact public officials on issues of concern, and help bring Catholic values into the public policy conversation taking place right now in California.

This parish ministry meets once a month with Sr. Maureen as facilitator. We have committed ourselves to continue to bring our congregation into the arena of Social Justice work, by reporting to you regularly on happenings of importance to all in our area here and the greater area of California.

# THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

#### **All Souls**

The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased kept such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of prayer for the departed members.

In the middle of the 11th century, the abbot of Cluny (France), decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on November 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church.

The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgment of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God.

"We must not make purgatory into a flaming concentration camp on the brink of hell—or even a 'hell for a short time...' St. Catherine of Genoa wrote that the 'fire' of purgatory is God's love 'burning' the soul so that, at last, the soul is wholly aflame. It is the pain of wanting to be made totally worthy of One who is seen as infinitely lovable, the pain of desire for union that is now absolutely assured, but not yet fully tasted." (Leonard Foley, OFM, *Believing in Jesus*).

In the dark, a child could dart between cars, resulting in a serious accident. . .we want to avoid such possibilities by releasing our young people into your care.

On the upper level, we sure appreciate the help of parents in putting the furniture away after the evening session. The catechists are trying to collect their materials, so if parents would help stack chairs, fold tables, and close walls, we could all get home much more quickly. I want to thank our young people who do a great job with helping!

All this spells "partnership". . .thanks for being on board with us!
