

### **Oplatki—Christmas Wafers**

The word Bethlehem means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread is a sign of charity, unity, and friendship.





One of these beautiful Christmas customs is the Christmas Wafer. A Wafer bearing a simple design commemorative of Christ's birth is given to everyone present gathered together for the Christmas meal.

With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of the present and absent members of the family, the designated family member then invites everyone to go to another person, and with a gesture of a hug, kiss, or handshake, ask forgiveness for anything they may have done to hurt that family member in the past year, and to seek God's blessings upon them in the coming year.

Each person, as the words are said, then breaks a piece off of each other's Wafer and consumes the piece that has been broken off.

The spiritual lesson in this age old custom is unity of the family—the main pillar of society. The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist among the members of the family.

The members of the family are the links in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and the One Church. The family is part of the eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing to be always with one another, with God.

All this brings to mind clearly our charity for one another, to seek salvation together. Family customs remind us that we seek and obtain salvation with the help of others at all times.

These Christmas Wafers, and the home ritual surrounding their use, originated in Poland. This custom and ritual is also popular in Slovakia, Lithuania, Ukraine, and other parts of Catholic Eastern Europe.

Christmas Wafers (Oplatki) are available after Mass at the information Table on the plaza this weekend and in the coming weeks before Christmas. The Wafers are free, but donations will be accepted.

I encourage you to make this home ritual a part of your Christmas traditions.

We give thanks to Parishioners, Ed and Clarice Bednarz, who have provided us with these Christmas Wafers.

Please take advantage of this gift, and if you have already, start a new family Christmas tradition. —Fr. Mike



### Get on the Bus Program

Our Parish will be joining this very important endeavor. Get on the Bus brings children and their caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. This is so important! One of the worse things that can happen to a child is to come to believe that their parent has forgotten them or does not love them anymore. Many of these children come from families who cannot afford to travel to the prison on their own.

There are many ways to become involved in this program. In addition to providing the monies for the bus, the program offers travel bags for the children comfort bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, a special lunch at the prison with their parent and dinner on the way home, and a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post-event counseling.

Faith Formation is the particular responsibility of the home-church until January 11. What lesson are you teaching today on the Feast of the Holy Family within your dear and holy family?



### CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

God's Unconditional Gift to Us

Thanks be to our God of all joy and generosity! Imagine God loving us so much, unconditionally, that He gifted us with Jesus Christ, our Savior. We did nothing to earn this love, and yet it was freely given to us.

Our Savior was born into this world in circumstances completely unanticipated by nearly everyone in that time. What an attitude adjustment was in store for many.

Still today, many people think more of God as a Santa Claus type of deity. He's the one with the white beard who watches over us from heaven, monitoring our behavior, to see if we deserve pricey gifts for Christmas.

These folks only interact with God when they are in trouble or when they feel they need something. This is what I call the "gimme" principle. Any thread of a relationship here is based on what people feel God can do for them.
