

#### You Are Not Alone

Fr. Rich is coming back to St. Thomas More to help cover for me while I am on pilgrimage to see the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany. I am leading a group of 42 pilgrims who will experience this very special, spiritual event. I will be away from the Parish September 2-14.

With Fr. Rich coming back to us, I wanted to share a Pastor's Column that I wrote about him in the year 2000!

Fr. Rich Lewandowski, a close priest/friend of mine since college days in 1967, is a priest in the Diocese of Worcester, Massachusetts. He is the Newman Chaplain of Fitchburg State College and the Pastor of St. Camillus Parish in Fitchburg. In recent years he has become the author of (at last count) four children's books.

His most popular children's story, "The First Easter Bunny", has sold over 50,000 copies. Several years ago, Fr. Rich was with us, sharing with the children of the Parish his "The First Easter Bunny" tale.

As a college chaplain, pastor and successful author, Fr. Rich feels that one of his most prized accomplishments is his sobriety. For years, he wondered about his alcohol consumption. While not requiring a large quantity of alcohol, he did, nevertheless "need" a drink or two or three daily in order to function comfortably. As time went by, he realized that he was in the midst of an addictive cycle and sought help to break its bonds. Today, after almost

thirteen years of sobriety, he's both proud and humbled by the fact that he can "not drink."

His path to sobriety began with an acceptance of his addiction, a three-month stay at Guest House in Michigan, a residential alcohol-treatment center for priests, and then on-going participation in AA, Alcoholics Anonymous.

Whenever we are on vacation together, at least one evening in the week is devoted to attending an AA meeting. Miraculously, AA meetings are held everywhere around the world, everyday of the week, at almost anytime of day. You can always find a meeting!

Last week, Fr. Rich and I spent a few days in Palm Springs for some R & R. On Monday night, Fr. Rich attended an "open" meeting and I was invited to be there with him.

Spending an hour with honest and sincere people, who in complete vulnerability share their failures and victories, is always a rewarding experience.

What struck me most last Monday Night was a simple carved wooden piece on the table that read: "You Are Not Alone." Such a simple message, a cliché of great magnitude, but in the AA setting, a very profound reality.

One can find a meeting in any place and at almost any time in the world. Help and support are there just for the asking. What comfort and strength there is in that knowledge.

Also, in the AA setting, one begins to realize that despite our individuality, we are all very similar as human beings. We are not alone. We all have strengths and weaknesses, virtues and vices. We are all sinners striving, hopefully, to become saints.

In the Church setting, I pray that all of us can create together a climate in which we all realize that we are not alone; that all of us, as human beings and as Disciples of Jesus, have strengths and weaknesses, virtues and vices.

As sinners on the way to sainthood, we, as members of the Body of Christ, are present to each other to support and help each other in our weaknesses. We are to be present to each other to build each other up, not to tear each other down. What a great definition of Church! What a great mission statement for a Parish!

One of the great miracles of the 20th century has been the AA movement, the 12 Step Process which is the basis of AA, Gamblers Anonymous, Narcotics Anonymous, Sexual Addicts Anonymous, etc., etc. In these programs, God has been very active in healing people and helping them to celebrate life.

I truly believe that Parishes have much to learn from these programs. We need to continue to create a climate of vulnerability in which we can honestly, sincerely, and safely share our stories and unite our stories to the stories of Scripture.

I pray that our Parish continues to be a safe place in which we can tell our stories, support one another, and challenge one other in growing in "wholeness," in "holiness," into the image and likeness of Christ.

Today and every day, let us remember that: "YOU ARE NOT ALONE."

Fr. Rich is now celebrating 23 years of sobriety. Please congratulate him when you see him!

#### Consider JustFaith and Catholic Social Teaching

One of the most notable achievements of the Catholic Church over the past 120 years is the development of its social teaching. Catholic social doctrine has two main concerns:

- 1. the dignity of the human person, made in God's image, with the rights and duties which protect and enhance this dignity, and
- 2. the common good. Catholic social doctrine developed from a response to the problems of the Industrial Revolution which resulted in the exploitation of workers which continues today, dealing with the complex issues of technology and is effects, whether in the arms race, environmental destruction, or the widening gap between rich and poor.

St. Thomas More, together with five North County parishes, will be involved in the national program of JustFaith. JustFaith is an opportunity to grow spiritually by studying the Church's social doctrine in small groups at the homes of parishioners. JustFaith meets once a week from September to May with breaks for the holidays. It is a marvelous community-building experience. —Joe Dillon, St. Thomas More



#### Christian Stewardship . . . Cultivate Gifts

From the U.S. Bishops Pastoral Letter, Stewardship: A Disciples Response

- † Life as a Christian steward requires continued involvement in the human vocation to cultivate material creation.
- † Ecological stewardship means cultivating a heightened sense of human interdependence and solidarity.
- Baptism makes Christian stewards by grace, able to act explicitly on God's behalf in cultivating and serving the portion of the world entrusted to their care.

#### **For Parents**

People are sometimes unsure about the meaning of "cultivating gifts" as a necessary part of being a good steward. They think, "Well, perhaps if I were a musician or an artist, I would know how to cultivate that gift. But what about other sorts of gifts? How can I work to make those other kinds of gifts better?"

Fortunately there are many ways to cultivate our gifts – we might learn new ways of being good parents, for example, by reading a parenting magazine or taking a parenting class.

Cultivation means acquiring the knowledge and learning the skills that will make us better at all those everyday things good stewards do:

- becoming informed citizens
- taking care of our bodies and our health,
- learning new ways to manage our material resources, including planning for the future,
- practicing and learning more about our faith.

#### **Living Stewardship Together**

Planting a garden or taking care of house plants, parents and children together, can be a dramatic lesson in what cultivation really requires – patience, dependability, effort, and being open to learning what works and what doesn't.
