The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)—Time to "Pay It Forward"

This week we begin this year's Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). "Love letters" from me will be arriving in the homes of all of our registered households in the next few days.

Please take time to read and reflect on this information. I pray that it will move you to support this Appeal.

\$1 million of this year's goal of \$3.5 million will be directed to the Parishes in the Imperial Valley which greatly need our assistance to accommodate the phenomenal population growth they are experiencing.

As we, the Parish of St. Thomas More, have been helped by the Diocese, it is now our time to help our sister Parishes in our Diocese.

If you have not supported the ACA in the past, this is the year to begin to do so. If you have supported the ACA in the past, and you are in a position to increase your gift, this is the year to do so.

Here are some facts and figures that are important information for you to have as you reflect upon your gift to the ACA.

Know that all that you do is much appreciated by me!

Did You Know?

- 1. The ten acres of land on which our Parish Campus is being built was a GIFT from the Diocese of San Diego.
 - It has been the policy of the Diocese that it provides the land on which new Parishes will build their Campuses.
 - Our Parish purchased an additional five acres of land several years ago, enlarging our Campus to a total of fifteen acres.
- 2. The Diocese of San Diego provided St. Thomas More Parish with a \$2 million INTEREST FREE loan to help us in the building of our present Parish Center.
 - We have been paying down this loan at \$11,000/month for the last six years. Our last payment will be December, 2011.
- **3.** The Diocese of San Diego is providing St. Thomas More Parish with a **\$5.6 million loan** which is allowing us to move forward and build our Permanent Church and the Parish Office Building. Due to our good financial standing, the Diocese

granted us many exemptions to its loan policy so that we would be able to build in the present economy. **Building now** may save us up to \$1 million in construction costs.

- **4.** The **Annual Catholic Appeal** (ACA) is our yearly opportunity to engage in the Diocesan effort to participate in Jesus' mission of teaching, sanctifying, and serving.
- **5.** The goal of this year's ACA is **\$3.5 million**. The money will be directed for these purposes:
 - Imperial Valley Parish Development\$1 million
 - Catholic Charities \$500,000
- 6. Our Fair Share Assessment this year is \$48,000. This provides us with the opportunity "to pay it forward" and to assist not only the ongoing mission of Jesus on a Diocesan level, but to directly help other sister Parishes in our Diocese who are in need.

Just as we have been helped, it is now our turn to help other Parishes.

 Last year, only 320 STM households out of 1,000 chose to participate in the ACA. Last year our assessment was \$43,000.

We raised \$43,600 from 32% of the Parish. The average gift was \$136.25.

Let us double the number of households participating in the ACA this year. I know that we can do this.

8. 80% of the money raised over our \$48,000 assessment will be returned to our Parish and it will be directed to the Operations Budget to ensure that we continue to balance our bottom line.

Fr. Rich Lewandowski will arrive on Monday, March 7, and will be with us until Monday, March 28.

I am grateful for Fr. Rich. In him, I will have a "supply priest to cover the Parish," a caregiver, a housekeeper, a chauffeur, a dogsitter, and a good friend all rolled up in one person!

It is my hope to return to duty on a limited basis on April 1, "All Fools' Day." That seems appropriate!

All of the support, concern, and prayers from all of you these past weeks have been most appreciated.





THE WELL OF THE WORD

Like the unnamed woman who was visiting Jacob's Well (whose experience of Jesus is featured on March 27), believers, as individuals and as a community, return again and again to the wellspring of the word of God. Each week, we come with varying degrees of thirst to drink deeply or just to sip from that word. Besides satisfying our many thirsts, the word washes us clean with its truth and refreshes us with its goodness. Each week, we come with all the baggage we have accumulated—the baggage of worry, of guilt, of sadness and weariness, the baggage of conflict and anger, of greed and need. There, at the well of the word, we are invited to unburden ourselves so we can be freer to hear and more willing to heed the word. We also come to the well of the word to toss in the proverbial coin: all our wishes, desires, dreams, and visions.

We come to the well of the word to be liberated and transformed by its message. Thomas Merton once wrote that the basis of the Bible's power is its ability to answer the question: "What is this book?" with another question: "Who is it that reads it?" (Opening the Bible, The Liturgical Press, Collegeville, Minn.: 1970). The message of the Bible or God's good word is bound up with determining the true identity of its reader, a process that includes identifying God and entering into a loving and reciprocal relationship

with God. If, insisted Merton, we cease questioning the word and aren't questioned by it, then perhaps our reading is no longer serious. Every visit to the wellspring of the word commands our personal involvement. It is not an arbitrary experience that one can take or leave.

This month, our visits to the well of the word will urge our honest assessment of our loyalties to God, to grace, and to the gift of salvation. On the first Sunday of Lent, the authors of Genesis will remind us that we were created by God to be good and to be free, and when this freedom is misused, we, at our own volition, allow evil a foothold in our lives, in our world: that foothold has been shaken to its foundation by Jesus, who used his freedom to resist evil (Gospel, March 13) and who invites us to build our own sure foundations on him, as on a rock (Gospel, March 6).

To offer us encouragement, the word for Lent's Second Sunday will cite the example of Abram, whose deep personal involvement with the word has made him the father of all believers, Jewish, Christian, and Muslim. We will glimpse the transfigured Jesus with Peter, James, and John and try to carry that vision with us because, as the author of 2 Timothy has assured us, there are sure to be hardships for those who try to live each day in fidelity to the Gospel.

How carefully we must listen as Paul reminds us again and again (March 6, 13, 27) that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us and has justified us through grace. We, for our part, are to recognize this gift and appropriate it daily by faith. Our willing obedience to God's word is integral to this process of appropriating God's gifts.



On March 6, the Deuteronomic theologians will challenge us yet again to take God's word into our heart and soul. This being done, we are to carry that word with us wherever we go. Let it speak to us and within us as we meet one another in the Lord. What might that word have to say about the hungry who are not being fed? About the homeless who are not being sheltered? About the sick and the lonely who are not being attended? How does that word bless the good that we do and urge us to greater goodness? Doesn't that word tell us that war is not a means to peace and that violence will simply reap more violence?

That same word that calls us to personal repentance this Lent also challenges us to work at reconciling the wrongs in our world. This will require that we approach each moment and every situation with, as Karl Barth once recommended, the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other. In order to do this effectively and authentically, we must be as immersed in the wellspring of the word as we are in the world. We must, as Fr. Michel Quoist once said, "reflect on the passages put before us each week as well as upon the slices of our life, relating them together and to the will of the risen Christ for us."



Be Good Stewards of Netiquette

Christian stewards are called to be witnesses to Jesus Christ and to proclaim the Gospel in word and deed. Pope Benedict XVI recently reminded us that the steward's witness extends to the internet as well.

In a message to mark the Vatican's 45th World Day of Social Communications, Pope Benedict gave his blessing to social networking, urging Catholic internet users to adopt a respectful, Christian "netiquette" when interacting with others online.

Etiquette is concerned with rules governing socially acceptable behavior. "Netiquette" is a new term dealing with the importance of appropriate behavior and conduct in the social setting of cyberspace.

The pope acknowledged that new technologies were creating unprecedented opportunities for establishing relationships, building fellowship and spreading the Gospel. He wrote: "The proclamation of the Gospel requires a communication which is at once respectful and sensitive."

When communicating via the internet, one danger is to express oneself in word, manner or tone that would never be considered when communicating "face-to-face."

Thus, expressing and applying Christian love of others through the keyboard and monitor toward the person on the other end of cyberspace requires more thoughtfulness and consideration.

The pontiff maintained that there was "a Christian way of being present in the digital world: this takes the form of a communication which is honest and open, responsible and respectful of others."



The pope observed that with all the internet's positive aspects, which included dialogue, solidarity and the creation of positive relations, there is a downside: "the one-sidedness of the interaction, the tendency to communicate only some parts of one's

interior world, risk of creating a false image of oneself, which can become a form of self-indulgence."

Pope Benedict also expressed concern about the dangers of too much social networking such as "enclosing oneself in a sort of parallel existence, or excessive exposure to the virtual world. In the search for sharing, for 'friends,' there is the challenge to be authentic and faithful and not give in to the illusion of constructing an artificial public profile for oneself." He also warned against replacing real friendships with virtual ones.

The Holy Father's message is, in part, a call for Christians to exercise good stewardship of others when communicating online, and to remain mindful of one of the fundamentals of the Gospel message when using the internet: to love one's neighbor.

Uniting children with their mothers and fathers in prison



What is Get On The Bus?

et On The Bus brings children and their guardians/caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. An annual event, Get On The Bus offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, comfort care bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home)—all at no cost to the children's family. On the bus trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post-event counseling.


Why do the children need transportation?

hildren with a parent in prison are usually cared for by relatives, often grandparents.

Many caregivers are unable to make the drive due to distance or expense. Get On The Bus offers a priceless opportunity—a mother's touch, a father's hug, a family photo, a private conversation and a connection with hope and healing.

When does it take place?


ach year around Mothers Day and Father's Day, hundreds of children and their caregivers board buses and travel from cities all over the State of California to be united.

- An estimated 856,000 children in California have a parent currently involved in California's adult criminal justice system, nearly 9% of the state's children. (approx. 200,000 have one parent in state prison, 97,000 have a parent in jail, and 564,000 have parents on parole or probation.)
- . One in 5 of these children have witnessed their parent's arrest.1
- Police and courts do not regularly inquire at the time of arrest or sentencing whether a prisoner has children.¹
- 60% of parents in state prison report being held over 100 miles from their children.²
- In 1999, the federal Bureau of Justice Statistics found that 54% of mothers and 57% of fathers in state prisons reported never having had a single visit from their children.¹
