SUMMER CAMP FOR CHOIR DIRECTORS

Last week on this page, I talked about finding opportunities for personal growth, spiritually, intellectually, and charitably. Have you found anything yet?

Next Sunday, I depart for four days of "summer camp" for choir directors just outside the town of Oakhurst in the foothills of the Sierras.

The California Chapter of the American Choral Directors Association holds its annual summer conference at Oakhurst each year. This year, I will join two hundred of my closest choral friends for workshops, lectures, laughing, commiserating, warm days, and starry nights, all devoted to choral music. Well, mostly devoted...

I will return home with a full bag of music and ideas—dozens of pieces of sheet music including choral "chestnuts" from the past four centuries and new music by our best modern composers, worksheets full of new ideas and borrowed techniques guaranteed to make any singer sing better—as well as memories of conversations around the dining room tables that remind

us why we love what we do.

Perhaps this last thing is the most important reason to attend. There will be conversations about the craft, discussions about the trials and tribulations of leading or even embarking upon a substantial music program, reminiscences from those who have done this for a long time about what has worked and what has not, and through it all, stories of the joys that keep all of us coming back to our choirs year after year.

It is critical for all of us who lead programs at church, whether staff members or lay people from within the community, to maintain and expand our understanding of what it is that we do for God and for the Church. Without new information and ideas, and without interaction with those who are in the same field, it is very easy to become stagnant or stale.

A story to illustrate: When my wife and I were on our honeymoon almost ten years ago, we attended church one Sunday and were excited to see guitars, drums, a piano, and chairs for singers. There was lots of music during our worship, but after



a few songs we noticed that every song sounded sort of the same. When we looked at the copyright notice, it became clear that all the music was from sometime between 1974 and 1978. For twenty-five years, the music had been stagnant because the music director had stopped growing.

For a few days this week, I will be having a professional growth spurt, learning new songs and techniques, recalling things I have been taught before during my church music career, rekindling the joy of amateur music making, and singing both music I love and music I have never seen before with 200 of my closest choral friends.

There's nothing quite like summer camp.

Our Faith Formation program offers you many opportunities for growth and support as we walk this journey of faith together.



Our Religious Education Program is called RE.A.CH, which stands for Religious Education for Adolescents and Children. It is a partnership with the parents, so there are two sessions a month at church and two sessions a month at home.

Ages 3-5 (Preschool and Kindergarten)

Children at this age level meet on Sunday mornings during the whole of the 10:30am Mass, September through May. Parents bring the child to the catechist on the lower level at 10:20am and pick the child up when Mass is over. The children are involved in age appropriate activities based on the Gospel of the day.

Ages 6-13 (Elementary and Middle School)

There are two sessions of RE.A.CH for this age level on two Sundays a month from 12:302:00pm **or** 5:00-6:30pm, September through May.
