Prayer—Looking at Life Through God's Eyes

Recently Fr. Freddy D'Souza, a Capuchin priest from India who is presently ministering in Bahrain, came to visit me. We met several years ago when I led a pilgrimage to Dubai and Egypt.

It was his first visit to the United States. In his ten-day visit, I had the opportunity to show him around San Diego and do the "tourist thing." We saw many of the wonderful attractions that are available to us in "America's Finest City."

The days were relaxing not only for him, but also, for me. I am always amazed at what I feel and what I experience when I act as

the "tour guide." San Diego looks so different. I see things again "as for the first time."

I am in the midst of this area day in and day out, but get caught up with Parish concerns, family concerns, and my own personal concerns, and lose sight of this beautiful locality in which we live. It takes another person, "from the outside," to visit and, somehow, I begin to look at the context in which I live in a fresh and new light.

Pastor's Column (continued from page 1)

As I begin to look at the area with the help of a tourist's eyes, I am more aware, once again, of my context. I see its beauty that I often neglect. I become more appreciative of my life and the wider world in which my life is lived. All my concerns, worries, and problems are then tempered by this wider context of life of which I am reminded.

This is what prayer is and does in our lives! If we invite God to be a guest in our lives, if we accept God's request to have a tour of our lives, if we act as the "tour guide" for God to see the context in which we live, we begin to look at our lives with a new and fresh pair of eyes.

Spending time with God in prayer helps us to see things again "as for the first time." We are reminded of the beauty of life, its fragility, and its shortness. The problems, concerns, and worries that we estimate to be so important and overwhelming are placed in the larger context of life. We find balance. We realize that we are not alone. Our concerns become manageable, sometimes even insignificant, as we look at the context of our life through God's eyes. We are reminded of what is really important. We are made aware, once again, of the bigger picture that life on earth is just one frame in the reel of eternal life with God.

God is the tourist who wants to visit you in the context in which you live. Invite God in! Give God a tour! You will see the people and the situations of your life again "as for the first time."

Social Ministries/Outreach

A Solution That Really Works!

North County Solutions for Change, a Vista-based non-profit organization, has a unique program that can solve family homelessness in our area. Their 1000-day program uses a university-style model that consists of 500 days at a family housing campus and 500 days off campus in independent housing. Adults must forgo drugs and alcohol, search for a job, pay a portion of their rent, and save 30 percent of what they earn. Families work with coaches in a team-oriented environment to focus on financial planning, parenting skills, recovery programs, and anger management. To date, Solutions for Change has helped 600 families transform their lives and become working, healthy, and productive members of our community.

STM Parishioners have been supporting various Solutions programs and initiatives for almost a decade, coordinated by a Social Ministries committee at STM. Last fall our Parish furnished food and entertainment for an open house at the Solutions Family Housing Center. Other activities have included providing financial support, plus donating furniture, Christmas gifts, school backpacks, books, and clothing for the residents, as well as preparing and serving a meal on the last Sunday of each month to residents at the Solutions Intake and Access Facility.

Last weekend STM parishioners learned about our Parish's commitment to offer financial support. For a family of three, Solutions needs \$7,500 per year for three years (a total of \$22,500) to supplement operational funds obtained from other sources. We can permanently change the lives of a homeless family. Special envelopes were attached to the bulletin last week and may be returned via the offertory collection or to the Parish Office any time during the month of August. WHY WE SING WHAT WE SING

Second in a three-part series from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians © 2002

Since music has such power to make things memorable for us, we sing certain texts at Mass to help us get them into our minds and hearts, and we sing at certain times so that music reinforces our memory of the actions as well as the words. Through our singing, we claim these words and these actions as ours and as important in our lives.

It's especially important that the we sing at Mass when the Scriptures are proclaimed and when we join in the Eucharistic Prayer. We sing the psalm to remind ourselves that the Scriptures belong to all of us and that we are all called to know and live the Scriptures. We sing Alleluia to welcome the Gospel reading because this text tells us about Jesus, whose life and resurrection we share and whose act of self-offering we are called to imitate. We sing at least three times during the Eucharistic Prayer: at the Holy, at the memorial acclamation, and at the final Amen. We sing the Holy to acclaim the God who has done such marvelous things for us, and we unite our song with all of creation (we join our song to that of "the angels and archangels and the whole company of heaven"). We sing the memorial acclamation to remind ourselves of the mystery at the heart of our faith: It is in Christ that we are made whole and united to God. It is through his resurrection that we will enter, finally and completely, into heavenly union with God. We sing Amen at the end of the prayer to signal our agreement with what the priest has prayed in our names and to acknowledge that we want to live as dedicated a life as Jesus Christ lived, faithful to the will of the Father. (This simple word is the most important text that we sing each week!)

We also sing each time there's a procession at Mass. We do this to remind ourselves that we are on a

pilgrimage, that we are headed toward a heavenly home, but we're not there yet. These are the songs of our journey from God, with God, and toward God: They get the words of faith and hope and love into our very being for the times when the journey becomes hard and the road rough. So we sing at the entrance of the ministers, at the presentation of the gifts, and at communion time. Each time someone recalls our journey by movement through the community, we sing. We even sing while we're in procession at communion, because this moment, as we move toward communion with Christ in the sacrament, is a model of our whole life, of our journey with and in Christ. By singing, we claim this action in all its richness.



We may sing at other times as well, at Mass and at other celebrations. Often, these additional times are also journey moments, times associated with our pilgrimage as God's people. At Mass, we may sing as we leave church, going out to be the body of Christ in service to the world. At weddings, we might sing after the bride and groom exchange

vows and rings, as they begin their iourney in sacrament together. Αt funerals, we sing the at final commendation and farewell, as this person's body begins its journey to its final resting place and as the spirit journeys to full union with God. A t confirmations and ordinations, we



sing for the Spirit to be with those who are beginning a new phase of their pilgrimage and their service to the church.

Whether the song is praise or petition, we sing to get that text into our hearts and to express the emotions that garb our faith. We sing because faith and hope and the love rooted in them are the most important things in life. Singing, the ancient Christian teachers said, is something that belongs to lovers. It's not something we do just to pretty up the liturgy; singing, like love, is an act that helps us find out where we belong and where we're going.

Singing calls us to focus our attention on what we're doing, more than anything else we might do. It makes us use our minds to attend to the words and the melody; it causes us to bring our whole body to this action of singing: We use our lungs, our diaphragm, our vocal cavity, our voice, and even our back and our legs and arms if we're going to sing well. Such singing, such attention, such total involvement was also commended by the ancient teachers. The old proverb that says: "Someone who sings prays twice."

Welcoming Strangers: A Mark of Christian Stewardship

Companies that specialize in household moving tell us that summer is their busiest time. Kids are out of school and families make changes. If you're planning an August move, at least in the Northern Hemisphere, there's a backlog for transporting goods.

The 2010 U.S. Census data revealed that 37.5 million Americans moved that year. Many of them were moving to take advantage of better housing or to find new jobs. Undoubtedly, each of them experienced a certain amount of upheaval and rootlessness.

Worldwide, the United Nations reports over 43 million people are refugees or people displaced within their own countries due to political conflict, persecution, and calamitous natural disasters.

Over half of these are children. These staggering numbers present a challenge and an opportunity for the Catholic steward.

A number of Catholic Charities agencies are actively involved in the resettlement of refugees. In our own country, many citizens have been uprooted from their homes due to recession and foreclosure. Most dioceses and parishes are actively involved in helping the homeless or the newly relocated. It only takes a phone call to discover how you can help with material assistance, food, or mentoring.

Many parishes experience a steady stream of new members, especially in the fall. It is important to be aware of this situation and welcome folks that we have not yet met. Remember the shortest distance between two people is a smile:-)

Recently, a news report featured a young man who had fled with his family to the Syrian-Turkish border to escape the Syrian government's repression. The man held his newborn son up to the camera. One could imagine a similar scene in the Gospel of Matthew where Joseph took Mary and fled with the infant Jesus into Egypt.

The movement of peoples is a story as old as history. At some time in our lives, most of us will probably feel as if we are strangers. How we respond to this feeling in others will be a mark of our Christian stewardship.
