Deficit Spending

I share with you the blog of STM Parishioner, David Berry:

"Though we've got still three more months to enjoy 2011, my personal theme and takeaway from this year has already become clear to me. Namely, that deficit spending, doesn't work for me. I am not speaking of financial mismanagement, debt ceilings, or monetary policy of any kind. I am speaking of my attempts over

the last nine months to activate and extend my creative self at times when I did not possess the resources to do so.

What I have learned this year is that there is a line dividing my higher, creative self and my lower, surviving self. When I am operating below the line, it is because I am in need of renewal,

refreshment, restoration. When I am operating above the line I am capable of creativity, energy, extension.

The awareness I have gained is that I am not very gracious to myself when I am below the line and expect that I should be above it. Put another way, when I need to focus on renewal I need to focus on renewal; to focus on getting back to the line before I can again cross over it and above it."

As I reflected upon David's words, I thought: "You can't give what you ain't got!" (Excuse the poor English.)

For us, who are Disciples of the Lord Jesus, we need that renewal, refreshment, and restoration time in order to live as our higher self.

This means taking time on a daily basis for some prayer, quiet time, reflection, and meditation. We need also to be actively involved in the life of our Faith Community by participating in the Sacramental Life of the Church, especially in celebrating the Eucharist on a weekly basis.

There are no shortcuts and no magic bullets. When we need to focus on renewal, we need to focus on renewal. And what we learn over time is that this can not be sporadic. It needs to be part of our daily routine, just like diet and exercise.

May David's words remind all of us to seek our higher selves!

Social Ministries/Outreach

Christmas Angel Ministry

For many years, the Christmas Angel ministry has provided Christmas gifts to children at several local charities. The program has traditionally supplied *Catholic Charities* with stockings and gift bags for infants through pre-teens. Hundreds of toys have been distributed to *North County Solutions for Change, Casa de Amparo*, and *The Salvation Army*. In addition, individual children from *Casa de Amparo* have been "adopted."

Following Hurricane Katrina, families were adopted from our sister parish, St. Peter Clavier, in New Orleans. STM parishioners bought gifts not only for the children but for adults in the household as well. This continued successfully for three years.

Last year, attention was turned from New Orleans to a similar need in our own community. The Navy Hospital at Camp Pendleton was, and is, in great need of "angels" to adopt their families who have loved ones recuperating and struggling from the ravages of war. Our beloved Fr. Ken, as Navy Chaplain, tended to the spiritual and material needs of these families for many years. STM parishioners adopted 25 families in 2010, anonymously putting together gift packages for those families; families often with several children who are away from their homes at Christmas while visiting convalescing family members at Camp Pendleton.

Lastly, this ministry helps *Birth Choice* of San Marcos. After Christmas, our tree is adorned with "crowns" requesting baby items that are returned to the parish on the Feast of the Epiphany.

Christmas Angels succeeds through the generosity of Parishioners with their time and talent as well as their treasure. Volunteers are needed for prepping the tree and its ornaments, manning the table/ tree at Masses, shopping for needed gifts, sorting, stuffing, and transporting gifts, etc. The overwhelming response has truly been a sign of our willingness to accept our Christian calling to help those in need.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

The two-part worship service (Word and Eucharist) evolved from patterns of Jewish worship. Proclaiming the scriptures aloud expresses their original design. The Bible was written for public proclamation, not just for private devotion. Although some communities provide printed copies of the readings to follow, and other Christian denominations promote bringing a Bible to church in order to follow along, Catholic piety developed around a different value. God speaks to the people in the proclamation of the Word, not in the common silent reading of the Word; and Christ speaks to the people—in the present tense—whenever the Gospel is proclaimed.

The readings from sacred scripture form the community in its weekly gathering. After the Second Vatican Council, people started hearing more scripture than ever before. By expanding the number of Sunday readings from two to three, and the cycle of readings from one year to three years, Catholics now hear 14% of the Old Testament and 71% of the New Testament, up from 1% and 17%, respectively.

First Reading

This reading, usually from the Old Testament, regales, chastises, and sometimes shocks us with stories of the chosen people as they awaited the coming of the Messiah. During the Easter season, this reading is from the Acts of the Apostles and describes the emerging Church in the time after the resurrection and ascension. This is the history of our family, filled with stories of the heroes of our faith, lessons about how God has dealt with human beings in the past, discoveries about how Jesus fulfilled the predictions of

a Messiah, and is a reminder of God's compassion and steadfast love.

The First Reading always has a connection to the theme of the Gospel.

Responsorial Psalm

The next scripture proclamation is not a reading, but a song. It comes from the Book of Psalms, the hymn book that formed the basis of Jewish worship in Jesus' day. In these familiar verses, the authors poured out their hearts to god, trusting that God would always hear and answer them.

The Psalm is "responsorial" because of its form, not because of its function. It is designed to be sung in alternation between the psalmist and the people.

Second Reading

This reading, usually from the New Testament, only connects to the Gospel theme during major feast seasons such as Easter or Advent. Most of the time, it is a semicontinuous reading of the letters that Paul, Peter, James, or John wrote to the various communities or individuals in the early Church. The letters offer advice to these early communities and individuals, explaining doctrines or challenging errors, correcting community practices, and encouraging the listeners to faithfully live out their calling in Christ.

Sequence

Sequences serve the function of a hymn, except they are sung in the middle of the Liturgy of the Word.

There are four Sequences in the yearly cycle: for the solemnities of Easter Sunday, Pentecost, and the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ; and for the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows.



This is the third in a series on the Mass, a refresher course on its overall form and specific parts, reminding ourselves some of the things we may have learned some time ago.

This discussion is adapted from Paul Turner's book, At the Supper of the Lamb, Amy Florian's book, The Mass, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, and Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, the last two prepared by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.



Christian Stewardship The Harvest and First Fruits of Our Bounty

There's something almost hard-wired into the human heart which responds with joy and gratitude at the harvest season. Perhaps because our ancestors were tied so intimately to the soil, knowing that for them the success or failure of the harvest impacted their very survival and that of their children, our hearts gladden as well at the approach of the time of yield.

For many around the world, from the wheat fields of the Ukraine to the fertile plains of Canada and the U.S., the harvest is here. For the Christian steward, this is time for a deepening reflection on the harvest in our own lives and in how we are sharing the bounty which is given us.

The Hebrew Scriptures show us a people intimately aware of the earth and all it produces. They insisted that the first fruits of the harvest must be given to the Lord. They knew from whence their plenty came: "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it," wrote the Psalmist.

Today, most of us have left our agrarian roots behind. But even in urban areas, people love to sink their hands into rich soil, their own or community gardens, and Farmers' Markets proliferate. People are encouraged to plant one row for the hungry. The growing "eat local foods" movement speaks to our common desire to return to a closeness to the earth and its Creator.

Sadly, although the earth continues to produce in abundance, millions of our sisters and brothers go to bed hungry each night. The Christian steward looks at the world, and remembers the words of the late Indian spiritual leader, Mahatma Gandhi, "I must live simply so that others may simply live." How can our sacrificial giving help those who do not enjoy a single percent of the bounty we possess?

As the produce ripens, the corn stalks begin to yellow, the pumpkins are cut from their vines, the threshers are at work in the fields, our hearts are filled with a centuries-old cry of "thank you," and we ask, as we do each harvest time, how can we return the first fruits of our bounty to the Lord?

- ♦ BE SURE TO <u>COMPLETE</u> all gifts by December 31 to qualify for tax savings on this year's tax return. Advance planning with the parish office is essential, since the <u>office</u> will be closed from December 24, 2011/January 1, 2012. Gifts received in the offertory at Mass on Saturday, December 31will be credited for year ending 2011.
- Envelopes POSTMARKED by Saturday, December 31, 2011 will be counted toward this tax year.
- ◆ <u>Donations received on Sunday, January 1, 2012 will be</u> credited in the new year, 2012.
- ♦ Annual Catholic Appeal ~ Parishioners with a balance due on their pledges made to this year's ACA are requested to conclude their payments by December 31, 2011. *Tithing families, know that your tithe covers your ACA contribution.*)
- Keep all gift receipts and acknowledgment letters, especially for gifts of \$250 or more.
- If you sold securities this year and will owe capital gains tax, remember that gifts of cash or other securities may partially or fully offset any tax on your gains.

Marriage & Family Life Corner

In the Roman Catholic Church an annulment is the procedure, governed by the Church's Canon Law and the Catechism, whereby an ecclesial tribunal determines the sacrament of marriage was invalidly entered into. An annulment determines the Catholic marriage to be void at its inception. A "Declaration of Nullity" is not a legal dissolution of an existing civil marriage, but rather a determination that the sacrament of marriage was not entered into validly. Do you have questions on the annulment process? If you, or someone you know, is seeking advice or has questions on the annulment process, please contact Patt Goeltz.

The Bishops' Letter on Marriage—Same-Sex Unions: "Marriage is a unique union, a relationship different from all others. It is the permanent bond between one man and one woman whose two-in-one-flesh communion of persons is an indispensable good at the heart of every family and every society. Same-sex unions are incapable of realizing this specific communion of persons. Therefore, attempting to redefine marriage to include such relationships empties the term of its meaning, for it excludes the essential complementarity between man and woman, treating sexual difference as if it were irrelevant to what marriage is." Share with each other your first impressions and what initially attracted you to each other. Reminisce together. Giggle if you must.

Parenting Pointers—"I was in prison and you came to see me." (Mt. 25:35) Now this might seem like a hard work of mercy to do with a child. Consider, however, that sending a child to her room or "time out" is a kind of imprisonment. Give them a way to redeem themselves afterwards.


