A Discipline of the Heart

Hopefully, we see our journey of life as a spiritual journey. We are a people who have come from "somewhere," and we are a people going "somewhere."

We have purpose, meaning, and destiny. In our modern world, filled with so many distractions, we can easily get "disconnected." We become lost, frightened, and we act out accordingly.

October, in the Catholic Church, is "Respect Life" month. We take time, in a special way, to weave the connections between all life issues. We are a people who believe that life is sacred from womb to tomb. We do not pick, choose, and say life is important "in this situation," but not "in that situation." We are called to develop a consistency in our approach to all life issues.

The very first step, though, is to take time, with and for ourselves. We need to get "in touch" with life.

It is very obvious that neither major political party in our country is "pro-life" in the Catholic understanding. Before we can advocate political changes to create societal laws that are "pro-life," we must be "pro-life" in our heart. The personal conversion must take place first in us, and then through our example and witness, we begin to make changes in the world around us.

A society that truly respects life will, ultimately, come about not politically, but spiritually, one person at a time through a conversion of the heart.

To keep focused, we need to be disciplined. I share with you the words of Fr. Henri Nouwen, taken from *Letters to Marc about Jesus*:

A Discipline of the Heart

The spiritual life demands a discipline of the heart. Discipline is the mark of a disciple of Jesus. That doesn't mean, however, making things difficult for yourself, but making available the inner space where God can touch you with an all-transforming love. We human beings are so faint-hearted that we have a lot of trouble leaving an empty space empty. We like to fill it all up with ideas, plans, duties, tasks, and activities.

It strikes me increasingly just how hard-pressed people are nowadays. It's as though they're tearing about from one emergency to another. Never solitary, never still, never really free, but always busy about something that just can't wait. You get the impression that amid this hurly-burly, we lose touch with life itself. We have the experience of being busy while nothing really seems to happen. The more agitated we are, and the more compacted our lives become, the more difficult it is to keep a space where God can let something truly new take place.

The discipline of the heart helps us to let God into our hearts, so that God can become known to us there, in the deepest recesses of our own being. This is not so easy to do; we like to be master in our own house and don't want to admit that our house is God's house too.

In this month of October, as we celebrate and respect the gift of life, may we remember that creating respect for life in our world today begins with each of us in our own lives and hearts. We must first make room for God in our lives and allow the author of Life to speak to us in the quiet of our hearts.

It is from that quiet space in our heart, in union with our Creator, that change in our world begins.

Make room for God! Celebrate and Respect Life!

LITURGY OF THE WORD continued

Last week: Overview, First Reading, Responsorial Psalm, Second Reading, Sequence

Gospel Acclamation / Alleluia

We sing the Alleluia to announce the Gospel, except during Lent. The Hebrew word "Alleluia" means "Praise God." During Lent we use another acclamation of glory to God.

Gospel

The reading of the Gospel constitutes the high point of the Liturgy of the Word, and we see this in special marks of respect that are given to this action. The Book of the Gospels may be carried in procession from the altar to the ambo. Candles and incense may lead the way. The people stand. The Gospel Acclamation is sung. An ordained minister prepares himself for the proclamation. He greets the people; they respond. The Gospel is announced and the Sign of the Cross is made over the book, the forehead, lips, and breast. The people respond, making similar gestures. The book may be incensed. Finally, the Gospel is proclaimed. A rich panoply of symbols unspools in rapid, smooth succession. The liturgy makes every effort to show how important this moment is.

At the conclusion of the Gospel, the deacon or priest finishes with a formula, and the people make a response. The text, "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ," affirms the people's belief in the presence of Jesus Christ in his proclaimed word. The same is true of the text before the Gospel, "Glory to you, O Lord," and in the acclamations that substitute for the Alleluia during the season of Lent.

The Gospel is the clearest and most complete revelation of God in the person of Jesus Christ. The parables he tells, the miracles he performs, and the teachings he offers are bread for our life.

Homily

The homily has antecedents in passages from the New Testament. On the road to Emmaus, Jesus explained the scriptures to two disciples before breaking bread with them (Lk 24:27). Paul held a discussion with the faithful in Troas when he met with them to break bread (Acts 20:7-12).

The homily is the preacher's tool to "unpack" the lessons of the Mass and the scriptures, the mysteries of the faith and the guiding principles of Christian life.

Profession of Faith (Creed)

The Creed unifies the voices of the assembly into the common faith it professes. When we profess the Creed, especially when we do so with thought and active participation, we strengthen our faith and build the rock upon which we stand, a rock which we can depend on no matter what.

The people have offered additional reverence during the words of the Incarnation since 1570, most recently making a profound bow in the direction of the altar.

Prayer of the Faithful

All the faithful make their petitions known to God. In doing so, we exercise our baptismal ministry as the priestly people.

The Order of Mass gives three different names for this part because it is variously titled in different parts of the world: the Universal Prayer, the Prayer of the Faithful, or Bidding Prayer. It is universal



because we pray for the needs of the entire world. It is the prayer "of the faithful" because the catechumens have been dismissed, and the faithful are exercising our priestly ministry. They are "bidding" because they take the form of a litany, and the one announcing the intentions bids the people to pray for them.

Since there are no pre-written official texts, these prayers are unique to each worshiping assembly, created by and for the members of the particular community. They are normally read by a deacon, underscoring his role as the one responsible for charity in the community, but may be read by another minister.

This discussion is adapted from Paul Turner's book, At the Supper of the Lamb, Amy Florian's book, The Mass, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, and Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, the last two prepared by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.
