

#### Envy

The Gospel this Sunday reminds us that we are called to recognize, develop, and then share our gifts and talents with others on behalf of building God's Kingdom. The Gospel caused me to reflect upon and share this piece that I wrote a few years ago.

Envy is my first tangible memory as a human being. I carried that deadly sin with me into adulthood.

I was 4-1/2 years old, in kindergarten. Three or four of us were sitting on the floor and we were asked to place blocks of wood, with holes in their centers, on a string. It was a contest to see who would finish first. I did not win, and I was envious of the girl who had more dexterity than the rest of us to complete the task first.

#### **Did You Know?**

This year Christmas Day falls on a Sunday. I know that many of you will really like that because it means only coming to Mass once that week. It is like a "two for one special."

For a Pastor, though, this means a very real potential loss of significant revenue. My guess is that we could lose about \$10,000 in revenue because people give only once instead of twice (once for Christmas and once for the Sunday).

Please keep this in mind. Consider an extra gift or two between now and Christmas so that we do not lose that revenue. Also on Christmas remember to "give twice."

How sad! My first real memories of me, Michael, were those of envy spurred on by competition.

Thomas Aquinas said of it, "Envy according to the aspect of its object is contrary to charity, whence the soul derives its spiritual life...Charity rejoices in our neighbor's good, while envy grieves over it." (Summa Theologica)

I have often reflected upon Thomas' take on envy and finally in my late adult life, I feel confident in voicing a bit of different twist on his definition.

My kindergarten envy did not grieve over my classmate's good fortune in finishing first. The deadly sin of envy made me feel inadequate and incompetent. And I took those feelings of inadequacy and incompetence with me through the schools—grade, high, college, and seminary. Most times in the background, other times significantly in the forefront, the envy was always there, ready for a fight.

Only after very special moments of grace in my faith journey, in which God broke into my existence, over and over again through the encouraging words of fellow human beings, did I come to be aware of my gifts and talents. They led me out of my envy, in which I was grieving over myself. I was led to charity, in which I recognized the many gifts God had given me; and how I could use them to be of assistance to others.

Grieving, not so much over my neighbor's good, but rather, grieving more over my inadequacies blinded me to my own good. Thanks to God's interventions over the years, I am now charitable to myself and the world is a better place because of it.

#### Pies...Brother Benno's...Pies

Most of us have warm feelings about Thanksgiving dinner with family and friends. A time for good food, followed by the taste of homemade **apple** and **pumpkin pies.** Every year, Brother Benno's brings those warm memories to the poor and homeless by having a Thanksgiving feast for hundreds. For the past dozen years, the generous Parishioners of St. Thomas More have provided dessert. Please help again this year by bringing fresh baked **apple** and **pumpkin pies** (only) to the Parish office on Wednesday, November 23 (the day before Thanksgiving), between 8:30am and 12:00noon for delivery to Brother Benno's.

#### More's Workers

More's Workers has been presented with another opportunity to give back to the community through our time and manual labor. We have been asked to renovate an Interfaith Community Service (ICS) apartment in Escondido. This is a low income property; the people living there now will move out during the renovation and then move back in. It will be ours and ICS' Christmas present to them.

Our tasks will be to "demo" the unit, take out the kitchen cabinets, and repair the subfloors. After that we'll patch the walls and ceilings and paint them. We'll then install new kitchen cabinets and bathroom fixtures. ICS will have contractors come in to install hardwood flooring throughout and tile the bathrooms. Then we come back in for the final "sweep:" clean up the apartment, reinstall the blinds, and clean the kitchen and bath areas.

We expect the work to begin the first weekend of December and continue for two weeks. So please pencil in some time to help out during the first two weeks of December. We'll schedule some of the work on Saturdays to accommodate those who are working on weekdays. If you have handyman skills, can paint, or want to assist with the cleanup, please volunteer to help.

# Christian Stewardship "The Budget Book"

Long before Quicken existed to help manage personal finances, Tony and Dorothy Kerhin had a small burgundy book that contained about a dozen individual envelopes bound to its spine.

Embossed on the cardboard cover of this book was the word "Budget." This book of envelopes was the method they used to manage the modest income Tony earned as a postal employee. The envelopes were each labeled with one of the family's financial obligations and expenses.



The very first envelope in the budget was labeled "Church."

On Fridays, Tony would bring his check home and Dorothy would take care of cashing it. She would then divide the money into the envelopes. The church envelope was always filled first and it received its full budgeted amount every time.

Other envelopes on some of the leaner weeks might not be so lucky. With seven children in the family, unexpected expenses were the norm. Money might be borrowed from one envelope to lend to another, but the church funds would remain untouched until the weekly envelope needed to be filled.

They gave the first fruit of Tony's labor to God and in turn God rewarded their commitment with a life devoid of worries about money.

Tony and Dorothy were my mom and dad. I am still amazed at how they managed to raise our large family on such a meager income, yet always give the first portion to God.



"Look, besides the prayer and putting your trust in God, would you like me to go along with you to your tax audit?" Their philosophy was that if God was given his share, there would always be enough for everything and everyone else. I have adopted their budget plan with my computer instead of a red book. No matter what bills there may be, the Sunday envelope receives its pledged amount.

And today, too, there is always enough.

Advance planning with the parish office is essential, since the <u>office</u> will be closed from December 24, 2011/January 1, 2012. Gifts received in the offertory at Mass on Saturday, December 31 will be credited for year ending 2011.
- ♦ Envelopes POSTMARKED by Saturday, December 31, 2011 will be counted toward this tax year.
- ♦ Donations received on Sunday, January 1, 2012 will be credited in the new year, 2012.
- ♦ Annual Catholic Appeal ~ Parishioners with a balance due on their pledges made to this year's ACA are requested to conclude their payments by December 31, 2011. *Tithing families, know that your tithe covers your ACA contribution.*)
- ♦ Keep all gift receipts and acknowledgment letters, especially for gifts of \$250 or more.
- If you sold securities this year and will owe capital gains tax, remember that gifts of cash or other securities may partially or fully offset any tax on your gains.



Such a declaration is a finding by a church tribunal, or court, that no valid marriage bond was formed because the requirements for valid consent were not met at the time of the wedding.
