

Did You Know?

also reflects a misunderstanding, that is, I believe, commonplace in our culture today.

Christmas has become "The Holiday Season," the time between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. Now devoid of most of its religious roots and meaning, it has become a time for celebration, good will, and commitment to family and community.

Celebrating "The Holiday Season" is a good thing, not a bad thing! It strengthens us as a people and creates a desire to reach out to one another in care and concern. It also creates a neutral umbrella under which people of all faiths and people with no faith can come together and mutually celebrate the strengthening of our community and society.

But as we do so, we should not remain ignorant, or not share the proper meanings, for fear of offending others, of the various feasts that we celebrate.

We need to be aware that the roots of "The Holiday Season" are Christian. Christians are celebrating the Feast of the Incarnation, the birth of the Christ, the Messiah, who came in the person of Jesus of Nazareth some 2,000 years ago. Christians believe that God became flesh in the person of Jesus. That is the origin and reason for this time that so many Americans now simply call "The Holiday Season."

The Christmas Season, for Christians, begins on December 25 and continues through the Feast of Epiphany on January 6. It is from this celebration that the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas" is derived.

So in our "Holiday Season," one feast we celebrate is the Christian Feast of Christmas.

Also in this "Holiday Season," the Jewish feast of Hanukkah takes place. Hanukkah is an eight-day celebration also called "The Festival of Lights." This feast celebrates the rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem in 165BC. This year Hanukkah begins on December 20 and continues until December 28.

Hanukkah is not a Christmas celebration. It is a Jewish feast that falls within the cycle of what we Americans call "The Holiday Season."

Kwanzaa is a Pan-African celebration of family, community, and culture. This celebration, that has its roots in the first harvest celebrations of Africa, begins on December 26 and continues through January 1.

Kwanzaa is not a Christmas celebration. It is becoming an evermore-popular celebration that takes place in "The Holiday Season."

Celebration of faith, family, community, and culture is good! In "The Holiday Season," we Americans celebrate the Jewish Feast of Hanukkah, the Christian Feast of Christmas, and the Pan-African Feast of Kwanzaa.

May we enjoy this diversity and celebrate with each other, rather than claiming the Season for ourselves—for one specific faith or culture. But to honestly celebrate, let us know what we celebrate and why!



ADVENT

A Sense of the Season

Kathy Arciero chairs our Parish's Liturgy Committee Hey, there's a big tree branch up there!

Have you ever traced your family tree? Looked at old photos, read letters from grandparents checked your family bible for births, marriages, and deaths? We use the tree symbol to help us sort out relationships and how we got here. The symbol of a tree is a vehicle to tell the Story of God in the Old Testament and to connect the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history. The Branch is a biblical sign of newness out of discouragement. which became a way to talk about the expected messiah. It is therefore an appropriate symbol of Jesus Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God in His Incarnation.

The story begins with 1 Samuel 16:1-13—Samuel follows God's direction and anoints David, the youngest son of Jesse.

Samuel said to Jesse, "Send for him; we will not sit down to eat until he arrives here." Jesse had the young man brought to them. He was ruddy, a youth with beautiful eyes, and good looking. The LORD said: There—anoint him, for this is the one!

And Isaiah 11:1-10—a prophecy of God's deliverance of the chosen people from exile and cessation of enmities:

A shoot shall come out from the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

Advent reminds us that we need to be alert to the signs of the times, the signs when Jesus is truly present. Advent teaches us that we first need to be patient. We can't be alert if we are in too much of a hurry. We need

to slow down, look around and see when, where and how Jesus is present. When we hurry we miss opportunities and moments to see and make Christ present. Advent teaches us humility. We can't be alert if we think that Jesus cannot be found in certain places and faces, like the silence of our hearts or in the faces of the lowly, the poor, the aged or those different from us. And Advent teaches us about hope. We can't be alert if we think that this world of ours is beyond hope.

Our environment reveals the color purple for Advent, the Branch and the Advent wreath with four candles to count the weeks until we celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. This week we celebrate *Gaudete* Sunday—Rejoice in the Lord always! The pink candle is lit, our wait is almost over!

Thank you to our Banner team led by Joe Buhlert, Dean McCoy and Michael Provinse, and to Ginny Cornwell, Sondra Parks, Beth Brewer, Tim Wilbur, Carol and Larry Thompson, Siggie Ogan, Charlene Buhlert, and Kathy and Tony Arciero for implementing the design for our celebration. 

Christian Stewardship The Human Challenge in December

Probably nothing challenges a Christian steward's use of time as much as the seasons of Advent and Christmas. Each year, we marvel at the irony of it: a time to honor and ponder God's great mystery, the Incarnation, somehow falls prey to a time of stressful shopping, endless "to do" lists, strained checkbooks, and guilt over what's not getting done. Sometimes those nonstop Christmas tunes begin to grate on our senses.

How does the Christian steward answer this challenge to devote time to reflection and prayer while incorporating the best and most fruitful of our cultural traditions into this festive season?

One suggestion would be to set aside a special time of reflection right at the beginning of Advent for determining what our priorities for the season will be. Set aside an hour and begin by rereading the Christmas story in the Gospel of Saint

Luke. Ask God to help you know what is the most generous and beneficial use of time in God's service during this season.

Ask for help in setting aside time for prayer each day. Don't be afraid to cross things off your "must do" list if they add stress to what should be a peaceful time.

Only you and God can determine the best use of your time. For instance, some people find annual Christmas cookie baking a reflective, creative time and a wonderful way to share. For others, it's a self-imposed burden and a sure-fire way to a messy kitchen and a calorie overload.

Likewise, that extra party may be just what someone needs to unwind and commune with friends while for another it may be the gateway to exhaustion or a temptation to overindulge in food or drink.

Ask God which traditions are life-giving for you, and be bold enough to leave the others behind.

"I just don't have time," is the frequent lament of the holiday season. But the Christian steward is aware that we all have the same amount of time, and to each is given an opportunity of returning the first fruits of that time back to God. The season of Advent offers just such a grace-filled opportunity.
