

#### **Come Home for Christmas**

We hear much about "coming home" for the holidays. My Christmas greetings and prayers for you and yours are contained in these words from Fr. Henri Nouwen:

#### Coming Home

There are two realities to which you must cling. First, God has promised that you will receive the love you have been searching for. And second, God is faithful to that promise. So stop wandering around. Instead, come home and trust that God will bring you what you need. Your whole life you have been running about, seeking the love you desire. Now it is time to end that search. Trust that God will give you that all-fulfilling love and will give it in a human way.

Before you die, God will offer you the deepest satisfaction you can desire. Just stop running and start trusting and receiving. Home is where you are truly safe. It is where you can receive what you desire. You need human hands to hold you there so that you don't run away again. But when

#### **New Construction Update—December 2011**

This is the first of what will be monthly updates to keep all Parishioners informed in regard to the progress of the construction of our Permanent Church and our Parish Offices.



1. The Interior Design Team with the help of our Liturgical Consultant, Robert Habiger, finalized the floor layout of the new Sanctuary for presentation to the Diocesan Art and Architecture Committee. The Committee reviewed the plan and Bishop

Brom gave formal approval on September 28.

- 2. Renzo Zecchetto, our Architect, has taken this floor plan and has begun the structural and mechanical design development tying it in with the exterior elevations of the Sanctuary on the site development plan.
- 3. We recently met with the City of Oceanside Planning and Building Department to present the latest floor plan and exterior elevations for conformance with our Conditional Use Permit. Our plans were well received by the department.
- 4. The Planning Department has requested another meeting before giving final approval to the Sanctuary and latest site development plan. Renzo Zecchetto is preparing the final submittal for this meeting slated for January 2012.
- 5. Also at this time Renzo Zecchetto is moving forward with the design development of the new Sanctuary and administration building with the assistance of the construction company, T.B. Penick & Sons of San Diego.
- 6. The Interior Design Team continues to meet and will soon be interviewing artists who will be commissioned to create the Marian and St. Thomas More shrines. Discussion also continues with our Liturgical Consultant regarding the design and creation of our altar, ambo, baptismal font, and tabernacle.
- 7. Our "Groundbreaking" ceremony will take place on Sunday, January 29, 2012, at 2:00pm. Bishop Brom will be present to lead us in this celebration.

#### Oplatki - Christmas Wafers

The word Bethlehem means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread is a sign of charity, unity, and friendship.

Religious family traditions and customs bring the truths of Faith into the home.

One of these beautiful Christmas customs is the Christmas Wafer. A Wafer bearing a simple design commemorative of Christ's birth is given to everyone present gathered together for the Christmas meal.

With a simple prayer for God's grace and the welfare of the present and absent members of the family, the designated family member then invites everyone to go to another person, and with a gesture of a hug, kiss, or handshake, ask forgiveness for anything they may have done to hurt that family member in the past year, and to seek God's blessings upon them in the coming year.

Each person, as the words are said, then breaks a piece off of each other's Wafer and consumes the piece that has been broken off.

The spiritual lesson in this age old custom is unity of the family—the main pillar of society. The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist among the members of the family.

The members of the family are the links in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and the One Church. The family is part of the eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing to be always with one another, with God.

All this brings to mind clearly our charity for one another, to seek salvation together. Family customs remind us that we seek and obtain salvation with the help of others at all times.

These Christmas Wafers, and the home ritual surrounding their use, originated in Poland. This custom and ritual is also popular in Slovakia, Lithuania, Ukraine, and other parts of Catholic Eastern Europe.

#### A Carol for Christmas?

Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King; Let ev'ry heart prepare him room, And heav'n and nature sing...

When is a Christmas carol not a Christmas carol? When it doesn't focus on the birth of Christ, perhaps?

Isaac Watts based his "Joy to the World" text on the last half of Psalm 98, which celebrates the coming of the Lord to judge the world in righteousness. The psalmist calls on all creation to sing and shout for joy at his coming. There is nothing in the psalm, or in Watts' paraphrase, that mentions the *birth* of Christ, just the Lord's return in judgment.

So should we stop singing this at Christmas? Of course not. But this carol brings to mind the bi-focal vision of Christmas, one eye to look back and praise God for the gift of his son, Jesus, and another to look forward to Christ's return, when God will bring a righteous conclusion to all things. Then we will begin to fully enjoy the "wonders of his love" for all eternity. Merry Christmas!

#### Christian Stewardship A Story of True Christmas Gift Giving

The first time I ever bought anyone a Christmas present was when I was in the first grade. As Christmas was approaching, I asked my mother if I could have one dollar to buy someone a present. She gave me the dollar, even though I could tell that she was a bit suspicious about what I was going to do with the money.

I went off to the corner drug store and bought a bright blue ballpoint pen for 79 cents. When I returned home, I gave my mother the change from the dollar and took my precious gift up to the bedroom where I could properly wrap it.

On Christmas Eve, my mother opened up a small and not too neatly wrapped object to discover the bright blue ballpoint pen. I was wondering just what her reaction would be upon opening the present. She broke out into a huge smile and thanked me for such a nice Christmas present.

Christmas stories do bring warmth and cheer to our hearts as we recall stories of caring and love. My little story has an interesting irony, doesn't it? The gift that pleased my mother was purchased by me, but with my mother's own money. Does that sound familiar to you?

In the U.S. Bishops document, *Stewardship, a Disciple's Response*, we see the insight that *everything* we have comes from God.

The disciple then is grateful for God's gifts and returns them to God with increase because, after all, those gifts belong to God in the first place. Our sacrifice of our prayer time, our parish and community involvement, and our financial giving is really a gift from what is God's all along. It's like buying your mother a Christmas present with her own money.

During the Christmas season, our gift giving is an imitation of the great giving-and-receiving that takes place between God and us every day. We receive everything from Him, and through our stewardship of love, give back to Him. Perhaps that is why the Christmas season is so special and heart-warming.
