# Pastor's Column

# The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)—Time to "Pay It Forward"

This week we will begin this year's Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). "Love letters" from me will be in the mail this week.

Please take time to read and reflect on this information. I pray that it will move you to support this Appeal.

\$1 million of this year's goal of \$3.5 million will be directed to the Parishes in the Imperial Valley which greatly need our assistance due to the phenomenal population growth they are experiencing.

As we, the Parish of St. Thomas More, have been helped by the Diocese, it is now our time to help our sister Parishes in our Diocese.

If you have not supported the ACA in the past, this is the year to begin to do so. If you have supported the ACA in the past, and you are in a position to increase your gift, this is the year to do so.



Here are some facts and figures that are important information for you to have as you reflect upon your gift to the ACA.

## Did You Know?

- The **ten acres of land** on which our Parish Campus is being built was a GIFT from the Diocese of San Diego. It has been the policy of the Diocese that it provides the land on which new Parishes will build their Campuses. Our Parish purchased an additional five acres of land several years ago, enlarging our Campus to a total of fifteen acres.
- 2. The Diocese of San Diego provided St. Thomas More Parish with a \$2 million INTEREST-FREE loan to help us in the building of our present Parish Center. We had been paying down this loan sporadically between 1999 and 2006. Then in January 2006 we began paying down the debt at \$11,000 per month. Our last payment was in December, 2011.
- The Diocese of San Diego is providing St. Thomas More Parish with a \$5.4 million loan which is allowing us to move forward and build our Permanent Church and the Parish Office Building. Due to our good financial standing, the Diocese granted us many exemptions to its loan policy so that we would be able to build in the present economy. **Building** now may save us up to \$1 million in construction costs.

- **4.** The **Annual Catholic Appeal** (ACA) is our yearly opportunity to engage in the Diocesan effort to participate in Jesus' mission of teaching, sanctifying, and serving.
- **5.** The goal of this year's ACA is **\$3.5 million**. The money will be directed for these purposes:

A. Imperial Valley Parish Development

\$1,000,000

**B.** Catholic Charities

\$ 500,000

C. Education in the Faith,

Priestly & Religious Vocations,

Marriage & Family Life

\$2,000,000

- 6. Our Fair Share Assessment this year is \$48,000. This provides us with the opportunity "to pay it forward" and to assist not only the ongoing mission of Jesus on a Diocesan level, but to directly help other sister Parishes in our Diocese who are in need. Just as we have been helped, it is now our turn to help other Parishes.
- 7. Last year, only 377 STM households out of 1,025 chose to participate in the ACA. Last year our assessment was \$48,000. We raised \$48,762 from 37% of the Parish. The average gift was \$129.34. Let us double the number of households participating in the ACA this year. I know that we can do this.
- **8. 100% of the money raised over** our \$48,000 assessment will be returned to our Parish and it will be directed to the Operations Budget to ensure that we continue to balance our bottom line.

Please respond favorably to my "love letter." Please prayerfully reflect upon this information and act accordingly.



# LENT

## A sense of the season

Return to me with your whole heart.

Luke's Gospel contains the Parable of the Barren Fig Tree; Jesus speaks to the crowd about the vineyard owner who tells his gardener to cut down the fig tree with leaves but no fruit thus barren. The gardener asks for more time to work on what was neglected and dying, he understands the need to cultivate the life still in the tree and bear fruit. We have this season of Lent to turn our hearts toward our works of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving allowing us to repent and focus intently once again on our relationship with God, so that we may bear good fruit.

How do we do this?


We stand in line for ashes and are given the invitation to "Repent, and believe in the Gospel." We end each week by walking "The Stations" on Friday nights. We reach out to our community to help prepare and serve a meal in nearby shelters. We deny ourselves an activity that takes us away from each other, a tasty morsel or beverage, or a harmful practice. We add something new to our spiritual life that builds us up. We are invited to place a written prayer in the basket near the altar that will be remembered during Mass.

The Season of Lent is a season of Penance—the liturgical color is purple, the environment is on a retreat if you will. Simpler elements that are quiet and not distracting give us room for reflection and response to the Gospel messages of spirituality. On the fourth Sunday of Lent, known as Laetare Sunday, rose-colored vestments will be worn by the Priest and Deacon. The Sixth Sunday of Lent is Palm Sunday of

environment will be punctuated with red, our blessed palm branches herald Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We will not say or sing the Gloria; we also refrain from using the Alleluia before the reading of the Gospel. The ancient Apostles' Creed will be prayed throughout Lent and Easter. The Apostles' Creed is a brief statement of our fundamental beliefs; those who pray the Rosary will recognize it. An ancient tradition holds that on the day of Pentecost, the apostles composed this Creed under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, each apostle wrote one of the twelve articles of faith expressed in the Creed.

We have this blessed Lenten season to look into ourselves, to see what we're holding back, to examine our fears and our wounds, acknowledge our sinfulness... and to return to God with our whole heart.



# The Fragrance of Baptism

The day after our grandson was baptized, I held him close and savored the lingering scent of chrism. I wondered, as I had the day before, whether a sacred sign could possibly multi-sensory more thoughts meaningful. My were interrupted when Cael's three-year offered her observation: "He smelled like baptize the whole entire day."

Addy's pronouncement still gives me pause, and it prompts my resolve as Lent approaches. What better time than Lent to revel in our baptisms, particularly the rite of anointing with the chrism of salvation: "As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of his body, sharing everlasting life." Live always, "smell like" always, be always—or at least this whole entire Lent—priest, prophet, and king.

Too often we think of priests only as the ordained, those acting in the person of Christ make present the Eucharistic sacrifice and offer it to God in the name of us all. But this Lent I want to more intentionally offer myself back to God in Christ. This means attentive participation during Mass but so much more. It means looking and acting like I really do belong to "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9). Just one Lenten sacrifice that will test my priestly mettle: I will sacrifice my need to always have the last word, the word that proves I am right. Fragrant incense it will be.



A "well-trained tongue" was the prophet Isaiah's gift from God (Isa 50:4). We tend to think of prophets primarily as agitators, thorns in the side of the institutional establishment. But the prophetic task was to offer comfort and consolation along with critique. As intermediaries between God and the community, prophets wanted their community to be better, to live like the beloved people of God that they were. This Lent I want to be more attentive to the good and goodness of the community I entered in baptism, the Catholic Church. One thing is certain: if I want to sound like a prophet, to be a herald of the good news of Jesus Christ, then stridency and sarcasm must go. The priest in me can help to offer up this sacrifice. Fragrant offering it will be.

As the magi—one of them bearing fragrant myrrh—went in search of the child Jesus, they asked, "Where is the newborn king?" Good question, but more questions arise: Who is he? What does our baptism call us to be in him? The answers are found not in a crib but on the cross. This Lent I want to face the crucifix and let the INRI settle in my depths—Jesus Nazarenus, Rex Judaeorum, Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews.

The King who did not come to be served but to serve, the King who washed the disciples' feet the night before he died, the King who gave his life as a ransom for us and was anointed with fragrant myrrh as he was laid in the tomb. Christ the Risen King who is present in the hungry and lonely, the fearful and frail. This Lent I want to be a better servant king to them. Fragrant oil it will be.

And it will be hard, hard, work. But if we live always as members of Christ's body, we will overflow with the grace and generosity of God that the sacred chrism symbolizes. And that's what baptism "smells like." This Lent—this whole entire Lent—may we be the priests, prophets, and kings we were anointed to be.

# Christian Stewardship ~ A Way of Life

Lent offers us forty days to review our lives and focus on conversion and spiritual transformation. It is a basically a spiritual "spring training" when we go back to the basics of our faith through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Consider the following ideas for making your Lenten season even more meaningful this year.

- 1. Identify a penitential practice you can realistically commit to daily. It's easy to become distracted and suddenly discover that Lent is half over. A daily commitment will keep you focused. (Our little black books/6 minutes daily are perfect)
- 2. Make time in your daily schedule for private prayer, even if it is only 10 minutes. Improving our spiritual lives starts with prayer, and the silence of an empty room where we begin to listen to God is invaluable.
- 3. Reduce your daily or weekly soft drink or alcohol intake as a spiritual discipline. Drink water and pray for those who lack access to a safe, reliable source of drinking water.
- 4. It's become a cliché that people are addicted to modern communication technologies. "Give up" some of your "screen time" each day, whether it's watching television, constantly checking your phone, or surfing the Web. Use that time to: read a passage from Scripture, call or visit a lonely friend or relative, or pray the Rosary.
- 5. Don't shop for clothes during Lent. Stay out of every store except the supermarket and pharmacy, and don't loiter at these places either. Reflect on what it is like for millions in the world who have little or no discretionary income.
- 6. Make a donation to the poor with the money saved. (See #5)
- 7. Find a way to reduce your daily home energy consumption. With just five percent of the world's population, people living in the U.S. consume 24% of its available energy.
- 8. Give up negative thinking. Work on a patient, positive attitude toward others. Catch yourself when you mentally berate someone and turn it into a prayer for that person.
- 9. Do you have extra clothes languishing in a closet? Take time to clean a closet, give a "tunic" or two to a good cause.
- 10. Pray with the Church. Attend an extra Mass during the week or participate in a devotion that inspires you.





# World Marriage Day



World Marriage Day honors husband and wife as head of the family, the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life. Our World Marriage Day Symbol speaks readily of the role and values we proclaim. Husband and wife are symbolically seen as two candle-like figures, reminding us that married love calls us to help enlighten the world. The couple is joined by a heart, focusing on love as the power that fosters unity within the couple and generates the capacity to be life-giving and inspire others to fruitfulness and unity.

The idea of celebrating marriage began in Baton Rouge, La., in 1981, when couples encouraged the Mayor, the Governor and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentines Day as "We Believe in Marriage Day". The event was so successful, the idea was presented to and was adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter's National Leadership. By 1982, 43 Governors officially proclaimed the day and celebrations spread to U.S. military bases in several foreign countries. In 1983, the name was changed to "World Marriage Day", designated to be celebrated each year on the second Sunday in February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessings on World Marriage Day. WMD celebrations continue to grow and spread to more countries and faith expressions every year.
