Get on the Bus

Once again it is time to start planning our annual Get-on-the-Bus program. St. Thomas More Parish works with other San Diego churches to transport children to visit their mothers in prison. This annual event happens on the day before Mother's Day (May 10). For many children, this is the only time they see their mothers during the entire year. It's a very exciting day for the children but also very grueling. South county children got on the bus about 2:00am last year and didn't arrive home until close to midnight. To help provide this opportunity for the children and to make the trip a little easier, STM members offer assistance to the children in various ways:

- helping families with required paperwork so children will be allowed into the prison,
- financially funding the bus and other expenses,
- providing cookies and snacks to the children during the long
- accompanying children throughout the day,
- offering blankets to help them keep warm in the early morning hours,
- contributing items for the backpacks each child receives,
- and most importantly praying for the child, their families, and the success of the program.

Watch next week's bulletin for a flyer and donation envelopes. We'll also be on the Plaza April 27-28 and May 4-5 to answer questions and accept any contributions for the program. For this year, there have been some changes regarding what we are allowed to send on the bus with the children. We are not able to accept stuffed animals or beverages. All items must be new and unused. Especially welcome are small items for the children's backpacks and individually wrapped snack items (no raisins, nuts, candy, gum) for the long bus ride. JustFaith Program

Thanks JustFaith graduates, Parishioners, and the Youth Justice Foundation, who donated a total of \$510 to the tuition fund for children in El Salvador. This amount is enough to



sponsor six children for an entire school year. Here is the response we received from Rick Dixon, the Maryknoll lay missioner who is sponsoring this program.

The funds you sent will go to help children study. The children live in Cojutepeque, El Salvador in a zone of extreme poverty. Twenty five years ago this zone, known as La Esperanza, became a squatter settlement for people seeking safe-haven from the country's civil war (1980-1992). A peace accord was signed in 1992; but, unfortunately, not a lot has changed in the last twenty-five years. The people in La Esperanza still need dignified housing, title to the land they live on, and improvements to public education and schools. The funds you sent will help the children of La Esperanza study at the local Roman Catholic Parish of St. John the Baptist, which works together with the Salvadoran government to seek creative ways to bring better education to all Salvadoran children. Thank you for your generous gift of education.



PULLING THEIR WEIGHT?

Are the men of St. Thomas More Parish pulling their weight in this faith community?

Recently, one Knight of Columbus relayed to me that the Knights have been challenged to participate more in the liturgical life of the Parish. I am intrigued. Might there be a perception that our men are not participating as much as our women? If so, might this be because we do not see men participating equally during liturgy, because they minister away from our celebration of the Mass?

The Knights are active in a multitude of non-liturgical activities-the Lenten dinners and Sunday morning breakfasts come to mind, as do Tootsie Roll drives. efforts on behalf of Solutions for Change, and the St. Bonaventure clothing drives—giving supporting the mission and ministry of the church at local, national, and international levels. Beyond the Knights, men of this parish actively participate in our faith community through monthly men's fellowship and the weekly "That Man Is You!" gatherings on Saturday mornings. As I look around the Parish, there are men serving God this faith community everywhere: helping the

youth sell donuts on Sunday mornings, maintaining our sound systems, serving as our parish historian, helping to organize the scrip program, helping throughout the bereavement ministry, teaching our children through the Liturgy of the Word for Children (LOWC) during Mass most weekends. These are a few off the top of my head; there are many more.

Let's look at some numbers.

As of this week, our Parish has 2,877 active members—1,331 are men, and 1,546 are women, counting both adults and children. That's 46% and 54%, respectively.

So do our weekend liturgies—perhaps our most visible public faith presence to the community at large—measured by the ministers who serve in them, reflect these numbers?

Of our 22 currently active weekend altar servers, ten are male (45%). And three of our five Sacristans are male (60%). But, out of 67 Eucharistic ministers, fifteen are male (22%). Two of our fifteen Greeters (those who staff the Parish Information Table) are male (13%). Out of 59 Hospitality ministers, nineteen are male (32%). Of 32

Readers, nine are male (28%).

In the music ministry, there are 64 singers and instrumentalists currently involved in our various choirs and ensembles, of which only 14 are men (22%). The Praise Team is evenly split (50%), and of our five Cantors, three are men (60%). But, the percentage of men in the Sanctuary Choir is 22%, and in the Handbell Choir, 13%.

Looking at the numbers, we can see in some areas the ratio of men to women in our liturgical ministries parallels the demographics of our Parish. But in the majority of these "public" ministries, women are more visible.

So, are the men of St. Thomas More Parish pulling their weight in this faith community? Resoundingly, YES!!! And we thank you. Is it obvious? Perhaps not.

So, gentlemen, I ask those of you ministering to this Parish in a less public way—and especially those of you who haven't yet found a ministry suitable to your gifts of time and talent—is it time to increase your part of the mission and ministry of St. Thomas More Parish? Is it time to offer a more public expression of your part in this faith community?

Let me know. Opportunities abound.

Continuing our Christian Stewardship of the Easter Season

Last week the Gospel spoke of the disciples having a hard time recognizing the risen Christ. There he was, only 100 yards away, and the disciples didn't recognize him. Even when they came ashore, they were not absolutely sure.

The truth is, I have the same problem recognizing Jesus today when he is with me. Jesus did not die, rise, and go into retirement in some distant place. The risen Jesus is as present to me as he was to the disciples.

The hardest thing for a Christian is to recognize the presence of the risen Christ within you. Maybe the nearer Jesus is, the harder it is to recognize him.

Part of the Easter joy that we hold within us these 50 days of the Easter Season is to know and believe that the Lord is right here, always. —partially excerpted from the Little White Book-Diocese of Saginaw

Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him."


Who do you know who has sacrificed significantly for Jesus' sake?


