






Christian Stewardship

Everyone has some natural responsibility for a portion of the world and an obligation in caring for it to acknowledge God's dominion.

Although Jesus is the unique priest and mediator, his disciples share in his work. When we show our love for him in service to others we most fully realize the meaning of our Christian stewardship. It is what he means by keeping his word.

Part of what is involved for Catholics is stewardship of time in prayer. We should be setting aside time for daily prayer, reading Scripture, visits to church, and, above all, attendance at Mass.
