Where Are the Other Nine?

Whenever I begin feeling like it is time to throw myself a pity party, I go to the New Testament and read today's Gospel: Luke 17:11-19, the healing of the ten lepers.

All of us, from time to time, begin to feel weighed down with doubt, with a certain amount of despair, with feelings of being unwanted or under-appreciated.

We can find ourselves saying, "All that I have done for my family, for the Church, for my friends, for civic organizations, etc. and no one seems to notice. No one has offered a 'Thank You' for all that I have done. Why should I bother? Why should I continue in trying to do good? Why should I be making these sacrifices on behalf of the Gospel?"

The questions continue and the feelings of resentment build, and we find ourselves saying, "Woe is me!"

As Disciples of the Lord Jesus, we live the Gospel and we attempt to do the right things simply because they are the right things to do. Our sense of fulfillment should be in doing the right thing, not in getting recognition and reward for doing the right things.

That was the point of last Sunday's Gospel as Jesus said to his Disciples (and to us), "So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.""

We have been given the gift of faith, and as we live out this faith in our daily lives in service to our brothers and sisters, we are giving thanks to God for this gift. The living out of our faith on a daily basis is about gratitude to God, not about looking for a reward!

When we are looking for rewards, we will always be disappointed. Yes, we are human beings. Being thanked, being recognized feels good when it happens. But we should not live the Gospel with that expectation. When it does happen, we should view it as "icing on the cake."

When we need to be reminded of that, we should reflect on today's Gospel. Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one returns to say "Thank you." Jesus received a 10% return for his good work!

If Jesus only received a 10% return, should we expect more? I doubt it!

May the Eucharist on which we feast this Sunday strengthen us to keep doing the right things, simply because they are the right things to do.

Let's not look for rewards and recognition, but when there is that 10% return, let's make sure that we praise God!



Singing the Mass

As the ancient adage states, to sing is to pray twice. When we sing, we become more present, more attentive, more participative, and more powerful. When we sing, we enfold all the other members of the assembly with our voice, and communicate our choice participate fully in the liturgical action, and vice versa.

Over the past couple of weeks, we have been learning new music for the congregational music of the Mass. These songs appointed to and offered by the people of God can be litanies, acclamations, and hymns.

of Faith, and the Great Amendeveloped as a direct result of Vatican II's recovery of the priesthood of all the baptized and the essential nature of the liturgy as the celebration of all the people. They are *actions* in the form of song.

Singing the Gospel Acclamation, for example, announces our belief that the person of Christ becomes present in our midst in the proclamation of the Gospel. The accompanying verse sung by cantor or choir is usually taken from the Gospel text and acts as an invitation that we open our hearts to truly hear what will be

> sing We the acclamations, then, not only to address God but also to direct personal support to one another in living out our identity and mission as the Body

> The singing of the acclamations neither neutral nor inconsequential, for it expresses in an intense way the triple directedness of the liturgy toward God, toward

our fellow members in Christ, and toward the world. Our singing of the acclamations amplifies their energy and intent: their sound moves out from each of us as individual source, encircles all of us in mutual support, and sends us as a community on mission.

Five Ways the RCIA Matters for All the Parish

by Nick Wagner, Director and Founder of TeamRCIA

- The catechumenate serves as a constant reminder to the whole Parish of the vital importance of initiating new people into the community. The essential components of initiation are catechesis and the celebration of the initiation sacraments—baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist.
- The catechumenate is the responsibility of every member of the Parish. This is a radical decentralization of the missionary activity of the church and requires every Christian to think of himself or herself as an equal partner in the work Jesus left us.
- 3. The catechumenate is steeped in the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. Therefore everyone involved in the work of initiation must work hard to clearly reveal the paschal nature of our faith. The Easter Vigil is the source and inspiration for all catechesis.
- 4. The catechumenate is also an initial starting point for inculturation. The Son of God became human in a concrete place and time in history. That is to say, Jesus had a culture. Therefore, we accept and celebrate the cultures of all those who seek to become members of our church. Different cultures hear the word of God in different ways, and it is our job to find ways of incorporating all those different styles of hearing into the catholicity of the church.
- 5. Finally, we understand the catechumenate to be "a process of formation" (General Directory for Catechesis, #91). The catechumenate is not a textbook to be gotten through nor a series of meetings to attend nor a required number of service projects. It is a comprehensive formation, gradually accomplished in definite stages. It is marked and celebrated in "meaningful rites, symbols, biblical and liturgical signs" (GDC, #91). Most of all, it is a formation handed on by us, the Christian faithful, the Body of Christ.




