Advent Awakening

Advent is a time for rousing.

Human beings are shaken to the very depths,
so that they may wake up to the truth of themselves.

The primary condition for a fruitful and rewarding Advent
is a renunciation, a surrender...
a shattering awakening; that is the necessary preliminary.

Life only begins when the whole framework is shaken.

—Alfred Delp

As we reflect upon our lives, and as we remember those tragic events—the sudden death of a loved one, an unexpected illness, financial failure, divorce, or betrayal—we know the truth of these words.

When we are shaken to our roots, when we need to "put it all together" one more time, we then experience our fragility and we see life once again, as for the first time.

When we surrender to this reality, we then begin to really live and take hold of life.

In the Gospel today, as we begin this Season of Advent, we hear Jesus say to us: "Stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come."

"The time," whatever that event may be, will come upon us, and shake us to our roots, maybe for the first time, maybe for the second, third, or fourth time.

Advent is meant to be a season in which we are to prepare ourselves in faith so that we continue to trust in God as we go through what we know we could not go through without God.

The only constant in life is change. All is transitory and imperfect. We are a people waiting for the return of the Lord. One day we will die and will have to give all back to God.

Advent, with the help of the Scriptures, offers an opportunity to reflect upon these realities.

Our present culture rallies against such thinking. These days before Christmas we "medicate" ourselves with parties, food, drink, gifts, and continuous busy-ness; and we do so relentlessly, more than during any other time of year.

It is a challenge, but let us attempt to infuse this Season with Advent reflection. May this be a time in which we do not run away from life, but a time in which we more fully embrace it, with all of its beauty, but also with all of its tragedy and pain.

May Advent shake us to our roots, once again!

Martin Luther King Jr. also had a vision. He called it a dream that "one day our nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal." King worked tirelessly toward the realization of his vision and died a martyr for the cause of civil rights. Oscar Romero also died for his efforts at realizing his vision of an El Salvador free of tyranny. Mohandas Gandhi had a similar vision of his native India free of British rule and free of its own caste system. Gandhi prayed, fasted, and cared for the poor, himself a living witness to the vision he hoped to see fulfilled.

Pope John XXIII had a vision of the church returning to its roots and welcoming the Holy Spirit so it could more authentically witness to Christ and be the salt, light, and leaven our world needs so much. To see this vision fulfilled, Pope John convened a worldwide XXIII council of clergy and laity who, graced by the Spirit of God, began a spiritual renewal that continues to challenge the church's integrity, identity, relevance, and mission, even after 50 years. Today, Pope Francis is actively sharing his vision of a church that seeks out and cares for the poor, as Jesus did.

When Dorothy Day allowed herself to be found by the Hound of Heaven, she envisioned a community that truly lived according to the Great Sermon, feeding the poor, clothing the naked, and sheltering the homeless. Day spent the rest of her life realizing that vision. A similar vision compelled Mother Teresa to found her own religious order dedicated to serving the needs of the poorest of the poor while offering them love, compassion, and deep respect.

What do all of these visionaries have in common? Each was able to voice his or her vision so powerfully and poignantly that others wanted to be drawn into the experience. Isaiah of Jerusalem will offer a similar experience to the praying community during Advent. On each of the Sundays of Advent, the prophet will give voice to a vision about the reign of God; that vision will stoke our hopes and encourage our efforts at realizing God's reign in our lives and, through us, in our world.

In his first vision (Dec. 1), Isaiah a cavalcade of nations streaming toward Jerusalem to hear the word of God. Isaiah lived in a time much like our own, with political conflict and war ever threatening and ever near. His vision of peace would have offered great comfort. Isaiah's vision will be realized only when implements of war (swords, spears, tanks, IEDs, drones, bombs, missiles) are truly and forever beaten into plowshares and pruning hooks. Until then, we wait, we hope, we pray and we choose peace rather than conflict, and mutual respect rather than alienation.

In his second vision (Dec. 8), the prophet describes the bringer of God's reign as filled with the Spirit and all good gifts. Thus endowed, the Messiah will establish God's own justice upon the earth, so that the poor will have an advocate and the ruthless will no longer hold sway. So far-reaching is God's justice that it will be reflected in

nature. Predators and prey will live in harmony, and all the earth will be filled with knowledge of the Lord. While helping to realize this vision, we wait, we hope, we pray, and we work for true justice for all.

Isaiah's third vision (Dec. 15) is full of promise. When the Lord appears, there will be healing in his hands for the meek, the frightened, the blind, the deaf, the lame, and the mute. Sorrow and mourning will flee, and all of creation will bloom with new life. While we wait for the Lord, we hope, we pray, and we reach out to one another with words that soothe, with hands that heal, and with loving hearts that extend mercy, compassion, and encouragement to one another.

Advent's fourth Sunday (Dec. 22) centers on a sign. Isaiah envisioned a virgin who would bear a son and name him Emmanuel, or "God-withus." This sign, this vision came to fruition in Mary, Mother of Jesus, Mother of God. We celebrate the realization of this vision; we acknowledge that the very Lord and Master of the created universe has come among us in flesh and blood. Ours is a God who wants to be known, to be touched, to be near, to be loved. No matter that this world is fraught with ugliness, violence, hatred, and evil, God is with us. All of Isaiah's visions have been realized in the person and through the mission of Jesus. This is our faith; this is our hope!


