Epiphany Quiz Answers

1. How many Wise Men (Magi) visited Joseph, Jesus and Mary in Bethlehem?

Nobody knows. The tradition that there were three arises from the three gifts that were given to the Holy Family.

2. Which King of Israel wanted to kill the baby who would grow to become the Messiah?

Herod. Caesar Augustus was the chief of the Roman state. Quirinius was the Roman governor of Syria. Flavius Josephus was the Jewish historian who chronicled Herod's reign.

3. Who wrote the text of the Epiphany carol "We Three Kings of Orient Are"?

John Henry Hopkins Jr. The Rev. John H. Hopkins, an Episcopal priest, wrote the text of this hymn in 1857 for a Christmas pageant at the General Theological Seminary in New York City. Phillips Brooks, also an Episcopal priest, wrote the text to "O Little Town of Bethlehem" in 1865. Charles Wesley, the brother of John Wesley, wrote the text to "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing" in (about) 1739. Father Josef Mohr wrote the text to "Stille Nacht" ("Silent Night") in 1816.

4. The story of the visit of the Wise Men (Magi) appears in the Gospel according to whom?

Matthew. Mark begins his Gospel with John the Baptist and the baptism of Jesus. Luke jumps from the Nativity to when Jesus was twelve years old. John begins before the creation of the earth and then recounts Jesus' adult ministry.

5. Which of the following is not a kind of Three Kings Cake?

Kulitch. La Rosca de Reyes is the Mexican Three Kings Cake. Galette des Rois is the French Three Kings Cake. Dreikonigskuchen is the German Three Kings Cake. Kulitch is a Russian Easter Cake.

6. Whose poem "The Journey of the Magi" begins "A cold coming we had of it, just the worst time of the year for a journey, and such a long journey"?

T.S. Eliot. William Butler Yeats wrote a short poem called "The Magi". O. Henry wrote a short story entitled "The Gift of the Magi". Henry Wadsworth Longfellow wrote a Christmas poem named "The Three Kings".

- 7. What is the origin and meaning of the word "epiphany"? From the Greek, meaning "to show forth". The Greek components are epi- (meaning "on" or "to") and -phainein (meaning "to show").
- 8. What are/were the three traditional names assigned to the Wise Men (Magi)?

Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. Huey, Dewey, and Louie are Donald Duck's nephews. Peter, Paul, and James are all apostles. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were the three young Hebrew men cast into the fiery furnace by King Nebuchadnezzar (Daniel 3:1-29).

9. "The Adoration of the Magi" was commissioned in the late 15th century as an altarpiece for the Augustinian monks of San Donato a Scopeto in Florence. It was unfinished and now hangs in the Uffizi Gallery in Florence. Who painted it?

Leonardo da Vinci. Andrea del Verrocchio was Leonardo's master and teacher. Sandro Botticelli painted "The Adoration of the Magi" for Santa Maria Novella in (about) 1476. Fra Angelico and Fra Filippo Lippi collaborated to produce a round (tondo) painting of the "The Adoration of the Magi" in the 1400s.

10. What is myrrh?

The dried sap of an African tree used anciently in embalming ointments and burned at funerals.

FULFILLING GOD'S PURPOSE

Offering your TIME in the Liturgical Ministries

As we move through the next few weeks, our focus expands from celebrating the joy of Jesus' birth to recalling the initial steps of his ministry—his baptism, John's recognition of him as the Lamb of God, and finally, the calling of his first disciples.

Our own call to ministry as the people of St. Thomas More stems from Jesus' words to those first disciples, "Follow me..."

Each week, we are reminded of this call by the priest or deacon at the end of Mass:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.

Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.

"Go" is an action word. It isn't "go away," but rather "go and do!"

The weeks ahead are about doing—engaging in, as Fr. Mike likes to remind us, the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ for this time and this place. Both inside and outside the walls of our buildings, our ministry is Jesus' ministry.

Christian Stewardship and Trust

Good stewards acknowledge God as the ultimate source of all their gifts. Their natural response is gratitude to God. When we are always and everywhere grateful to God, we should then easily place our trust in God as well.

Yet, sometimes we misplace our trust. When we put our trust in 'at-risk' things like our jobs, our bank accounts, or our 'own' abilities, rather than in God, we become vulnerable to anxiety and fear. The outcome is worry! We worry because 'at-risk' things can be taken away in a heartbeat.

Trusting explicitly in God opens the door to lasting peace of mind and joyful stewardship. Trusting in God means that we have to let go of our need to be in complete control of our lives and let go of our need to possess.

The foundation of any healthy relationship is trust. How does a person develop their trust in God? As with all virtues we can only possess the virtue through habit. One of the very best habits for deepening our trust in God is to reflect on His Word daily.

For example, St. Paul tells us:

God gives seed to farmers and provides everyone with food. He will increase what you have, so that you can give even more to those in need. You will be blessed in every way, and you will be able to keep on being generous. (2 Corinthians 9:10-11)

The virtue of trust is indeed the precondition that enables us to joyfully and generously share our gifts. It's easy to give what we do not need. However, stewardship calls us to give out of our need, not from what is left over. The confidence to give our gifts sacrificially is found in trusting that God will always provide for our needs.

One final thought about trust; this virtue is surprisingly influential in the stewardship of our physical and mental well-being. Have you ever worried yourself sick? If you are prone to worry, reflect on these words from the late spiritual master, Mahatma Gandhi: "There is nothing that wastes the body like worry, and one who has any faith in God should be ashamed to worry about anything whatsoever."

Your list undoubtedly has several valuable and uplifting resolutions but it's not likely that any of them, even if fulfilled, has the power to save a life and to change a family's future.

We're reminded of this in the passing of a 50-year-old relative who collapsed at his desk. No one did CPR. There was no AED nearby. He never saw his children graduate from high school.

A little more than one year ago the heart of an 11-year-old Carlsbad girl suddenly stopped. In less than a minute a school employee started chest compressions. About 2 minutes later the AED delivered a shock that resulted in a normal heartbeat.

That little girl will perhaps someday have children of her own. By that time all children will learn CPR at school and every public building, including schools, will have an AED. At least I hope so!

In the meantime, each of us will need to take the initiative to learn this lifesaving skill.

Will you put it on your list of New Year's resolutions today?

This is the schedule of CPR classes at the Church of St. Thomas More in early 2014. These are all Saturday classes. They begin at 9:00 a.m. and usually end at about noon. All classes include use of the AED (Automated External Defibrillator). The cost is \$37 for the first person in the family, \$27 for the remainder.
