FULFILLING GOD'S PURPOSE

Stewardship, as I have written over the past couple of weeks, requires the giving of your time and talent—or at least the allocation of some of your time and the openness to adapting your God-given talents to God-driven ministry in service to this faith community and the world beyond our walls.

But it also requires that we support our community through our monetary gifts. Fr. Mike likes to remind us that all that we have is gift, from God. We start with nothing, and we will finish with nothing to accompany us on our journey of everlasting life.

Now, I'm not saying that we have to beggar ourselves to enter the Kingdom of God. But doing our part is important. And despite the renewed focus from our pope on the needs of the poor, it is important to recognize that the scope of the mission and ministry of the church is broad. It includes the poor, the widowed, and the orphaned, the newly arrived and the soon to depart. But it also includes supporting the daily and weekly activities of the church. From a liturgical point of view, this means supporting the activities of the faithful (that's you and me) in our worship of God.

The "Did You Know?" Campaign was created to let all of us know the "cost of doing (God's) business" here at the Parish. Generally, we hear of the big ticket items, over \$5,000 per year. Taking a page from that book, let's take a look at the liturgical ministries from a "did you know?" perspective.

Each year we purchase 66,000 (!) hosts from the Cistercian nuns in New Mexico. Cost: \$1,500. We purchase 360 liters (over 95 gallons) of altar wine. Cost: \$2,100. We purchase candles, oil, palms, charcoal, and incense. Cost: \$1,250.

Each year we purchase music for the choirs as well as congregational licenses for copyright compliance (\$2,000 each), we replace equipment for the handbells and the praise team (\$1,000), and we tune the pianos (\$500).

These are just *some* of the daily, weekly, and yearly "costs of doing (God's) business." And then, let's look at that list of things still needed for our new permanent church (see page 5 of the bulletin).

There are a few liturgical things still on that big list—pews, chairs for the daily chapel and main worship space



Matthew 4:16

(for the choir and for the required flexible seating), and the pipe organ. Anyone who has shopped for a good, solid wood chair understands why pews cost about \$300 per seating space (18 inches). And we need to purchase seating for 1,000 people. The chairs for the daily chapel, the choir area, and the flexible seating around the baptismal font come in at the same cost per seat. On another page in the future, I will discuss the particular local need and broad historical requirement of having a pipe organ in a Catholic church. But did you know that our start-up set of handbells was donated by a Parishioner? Cost: \$15,000.

All of these things that we "need" for the mission and ministry of this faith community in this time and place cost money. 

Bringing the Celebration Home: Candlemas

Candlemas, celebrated on February 2nd, originated in the fifth century and represents the light of God's glory, which manifested itself in Jesus Christ. When Jesus is first brought to the temple - or presented - as a baby (Luke 2:21-38), Simon holds him in his arms and calls him "a light of revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of Your people of Israel." (Luke 2:32). The "light" he calls Jesus is what we celebrate with candlelight celebrating our Light of the World. In the beautiful portrayal of this moment above, you can even see the face of Christ shining with the beauty of light!

Candlemas is celebrated 40 days after the birth of Christ on Christmas Day. This is in keeping with the Mosaic Law, which stated that a woman needed to purify themselves for 40 days after giving birth. After giving birth, Mary would have taken 40 days to purify herself and then brought Jesus to the temple and made an offering...and it was then that Simon recognized the importance of this beautiful baby.
