Nothing Less Than All of You Is What I Want

This past Friday, January 31, 2014, marked the 39th anniversary of my Ordination to the Priesthood. I give thanks to God for the gift of my vocation and God's willingness to allow me to share in the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. I pray for continued strength as I head into "the home stretch."

I am so grateful for the Church of St. Thomas More, this Community of Faith that I have the privilege and joy to pastor.

A Pastor needs to be fed, just as the flock needs to be fed. Please know that I am being fed by you, the Church of St. Thomas More! Your commitment, your desire, and your efforts to live as Disciples of Jesus, and to witness to God's Kingdom in this time and this place mean much to me. You feed me and you strengthen my commitment to be faithful to my promises and vows. Always remember that we need each other. You need a pastor, and, just as importantly, a pastor needs his community.

As I celebrate 39 years of ministry, two phrases come to mind: "permanent commitment" and "humor."

Firstly, the most important charism that is needed for our time is, I believe, "permanent commitment." There are many people in our world today who believe that people cannot make a commitment that lasts "until death." All of us, married, vowed religious, and ordained are called to give to this generation the gift of "permanent commitment."

Our young people, especially, need to see that people can make commitments that last a lifetime. That is what I have chosen to do. No matter what the problem or difficulty, I choose to believe that, with the help of God, it can be worked out.

On January 31, 1975, in Mt. Clemens, Michigan, Bishop Thomas Gumbleton, the Auxiliary Bishop of Detroit, ordained me. I will not walk away from this commitment because I believe that this generation needs to see the charism of permanence. People can say "yes" and that "yes" can last until death.

Secondly, what has "saved" me in my ordained ministry over and over again is "humor," the ability to laugh at myself and to laugh, not at others, but with others. Our very existence is Mystery. Continually we face the unknown, and as we face the joy, the turmoil, and the tragedy of life, humor is a vital gift that sees us through.

I give thanks to God that, in my 39 years of ministry, the gift of humor has found its way into my life and ministry. So much of life is unknown, and, at times, may seem meaningless and even absurd! So, in the face of "not knowing" and consciously "living the questions," I choose to laugh, regale, and enjoy the Mystery, and to be in

awe of what life places before us, knowing that God walks with us through it all.

I ask that you celebrate with me. I ask that you pray for me in a special way. I need your prayerful support! Through your commitment to this Faith Community, help me to be a priest who is faithful until death.

These are the words of my Ordination Prayer Card. I pray this prayer often. Please pray it with your household from time to time:

Who is that Figure walking by the waters, along the shore white, shining, and terrible? He looks at me with Knowing eyes that hurt. I think He sees my every fiber with those Eyes... glowing, blazing, probing, loving Eyes, dreadful, asking Eyes.
They say straightforward
Nothing less than all of you is what I want.

I feel that I am giving more of myself to the Lord today than I did 39 years ago, but I still have a long way to go before I am able to give the Lord everything. I encourage you to join me on the journey.

Let us pray that all of us, as Disciples of the Lord Jesus, each day, give a bit more of ourselves to Him until the transformation is total and complete!

Called to Be People of Light

The Psalms of February

by Denise Simeone, from Celebration February 2014, with permission. Psalm 24 begins: "The earth is the Lord's and all it holds, the world and those who dwell in it" (v.1). It seems a fitting reminder on this Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (Feb 2), for through the prophet Simeon we hear how Jesus will be the salvation of all: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" (Luke 2:29-32).

Twice in the psalm we ask, who is this king, this Lord of glory? We are told to raise our heads and look at this king of glory as Simeon did and recognize the source of God's grace and compassion. This is the same message Malachi proclaims in the first reading. The Lord whom you seek is coming; make yourselves ready. We hear the call to repentance and the reforming of our lives.

Psalm 24 reminds listeners that it is the clean and pure of heart, those who remain true to God's message, who will be blessed with God's justice. On this feast we can align our way of living to reflect the God in whom we believe. The verses this Sunday remind us we have only to lift our heads to see this marvelous sight. "Who is this king of glory? It is the Lord!" (v.8).

The following three Sundays of Ordinary Time offer successive passages from Matthew Chapter 5 of Jesus' instructions to disciples. On Feb 9, we hear the images of salt

TERRY BRADSHAW Sang in Choir and light. If we choose to share in Jesus' mission, this is what we will look like. This is a disciple.

Psalm 112, sung this Sunday, gives clear examples of what it is to be a person of light. She will be gracious, merciful and just. He will be steadfast and firm, trusting in the Lord and lavishly giving to the poor. The first reading from Isaiah also gives a clear message of what it looks like to be faithful to the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and homeless, clothe the naked: "Do not turn your back on your own" (Isaiah 58:7).

Other translations of this verse are very clear: Do not turn your back on "your own flesh and blood." All are God's own. If we act accordingly, then light will rise, and darkness, gloom, despair, and injustice will be no more. Remember; do not forget. Do not become like a hidden light, or salt without flavor. The message echoes Jesus' words to the disciples as we proclaim the responsorial: "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright" (v.4).

We continue to hear the message of justice on Feb 16. The responsorial from Psalm 119 (the Bible's longest psalm) sets the stage: "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord" (v.1). Walk in the law of the Lord. Seek with your heart. Be blameless. Be firm in your observances. Our prayer to God is for instruction and discernment so that, as servants, we may follow in our hearts.

Jesus' continued instruction to disciples is clear. In fulfilling the law, Jesus expands beyond the legalism of some, and his interpretation magnifies the way to act in following the law. There are many ways to harm another person: We can kill by anger, by small demeaning actions, by suing



Luke 2:29-31

someone and exhausting all their resources in court. Understanding the expanse of God's plan for all of humanity and the breadth of God's love is the work of discipleship. Truly we need God's instruction so that we "may live and keep your words" (Ps. 119:17). Psalm 119 ends: "Seek out your servant, for I do not forget your commandments" (v.176).

Psalm 103, sung Feb 23, overflows with praise for all the Lord has done. We sing the responsorial "The Lord is kind and merciful" (v.8) as our litany of praise. The psalm recalls God's actions of forgiveness, healing, kindness, compassion, and redemption. God does not deal with us according to our destructive crimes or sins but has forgiven us beyond imagining: "As far as the east is from the west, so far has he put our transgressions from us" (v.12).

Jesus tells disciples that a follower strives for the same kind of love God offers. Knowing we are forgiven, who are we to hold a grudge? Who are we to call someone enemy when they are our own flesh and blood? We share the body and blood of Jesus as we gather at the table of word and Communion. We partake in this sign of God's loving redemption and forgiveness of sins. We accept God's faithful covenantal love for ourselves. Can we do any less than to follow that same path of compassion and love?
