The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA)—Time to "Pay It Forward"

This week we will begin this year's Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA). "Love letters" from me will be in the mail this week.

Please take time to read and reflect on this information. I pray that it will move you to this Appeal. This year's goal is \$3.5 million.

As we, the Parish of St. Thomas More, have been helped by the Diocese, it is now our time to help our Diocese and our sister Parishes.

If you have not supported the ACA in the past, this is the year to begin to do so. If you have supported the ACA in the past, and you are in a position to increase your gift, this is the year to do so.

Here are some facts and figures that are important information for you to have as you reflect upon your gift to the ACA.

Know that all that you do is much appreciated by me!

DID YOU KNOW? LOOKING BACK

The Diocese of San Diego **gifted** our Parish with the original **ten acres of land** on which our Parish campus is being built. It has been the policy of the Diocese to provide the land for new Parishes to build their campuses.

The Diocese of San Diego provided St. Thomas More Parish with a **\$2 million interest-free loan** to help us build our Parish Center, which we paid off in December 2011.

The Diocese of San Diego is providing St. Thomas More Parish with a **\$5.6 million loan** that allows us to move forward and build our Permanent Church and Parish Offices. Due to our good financial standing and support of the Diocese, the Bishop granted us many exemptions to the loan policy that allows us to build in the favorable present economy.

The goal of this year's ACA is \$3.5 million. The money will be directed for these purposes:

Catholic Schools Emergency Fund	\$400,000
Marriage & Family Life	\$200,000
Imperial Valley Parish Development	\$1,000,000
Vocations for Priests & Religious Life	\$555,000
Catholic Charities	\$500,000
Education in Faith	\$845,000

PAYING IT FORWARD

Our Fair Share Assessment this year is \$48,000. This provides us with the opportunity to "pay it forward," not only to assist the ongoing mission of Jesus on a Diocesan level, but also to directly help sister Parishes that are in need.

Last year, **383 STM households** supported the ACA. I know we can **double** the number of households participating this year.

Last year, we raised \$51,000 with an average gift of \$133.

All money raised over the \$48,000 assessment will be returned to our Parish and directed to our Operating Budget to ensure that we continue to balance our bottom line.

CELEBRATING THE WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY (A BIT LATE)

January was a busy month at St. Thomas More. We finished our celebration of the Christmas season, and then, with Ordinary Time upon us, we immersed ourselves in all things stewardship—our time, talent, and treasure, offered for the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ for this time and this place.

In January, the Church also marks the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, in which ecumenism, defined by Webster as "the principle or aim of promoting unity among the world's Christian churches," is a primary focus.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated January 18-25, bookended by the former feast of the Chair of St. Peter on the 18th and the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on the 25th. The Week of Prayer is now a joint project of the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and the Commission on Faith and Order of the World Council of Churches.

On the final day of this year's Week of Prayer, I attended an Anglican-Roman Catholic Day of Dialogue, co-sponsored by the Diocese of San Diego Office of Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs, in which fifty interested people from the Episcopal and Roman Catholic traditions gathered to discuss how music provides a path to greater understanding and bridging. You

can imagine the discussion that flows from a program entitled, "We're Going to Sing *What*?—Our Shared Musical Heritage."

At St. Thomas More, we experience this quest for Christian Unity in a number of ways, beyond intentions in our Prayers of the Faithful.

On a musical front, we participate in the annual Twelfth Night Choral Festival, in which churches from a variety of faith traditions gather to sing their faith together in the songs of Christmas. This year, we had nine choirs from seven churches and almost 500 people of different backgrounds raising their voices as the people of God.

Beyond the music, most of the work of our Social Justice Committee is ecumenical (inter-Christian) and interfaith. Even though we did not hear much about the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity this year, I encourage you to keep unity in your



Stewardship: Living the Beatitudes

Three weekends in our February liturgical calendar will turn our attention to Jesus' teachings in the Gospel of Matthew explaining what is to be expected of those who choose to follow him. This is the familiar Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5:1–7:29), the most quoted part of the Bible. Jesus' sermon begins with messages of comfort, the Beatitudes (Matt. 5:3-12).

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ♥ Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.
- ♥ Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.
- **♥** *Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.*
- ♥ Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.
- ♥ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you (falsely) because of me, Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

The word "Beatitude" refers to a state of deep happiness or joy. But these sayings are paradoxes and they turn our normal expectations upside down. Jesus is bringing us a new law, new expectations on how to live. He is bringing the Kingdom of God.

The U.S. Bishops wrote in the 1992 Stewardship Pastoral, "Jesus does not waste time proposing lofty but unrealistic ideals; he tells his followers



how they are expected to live. The Beatitudes and the rest of the Sermon on the Mount prescribe the lifestyle of a Christian disciple."

Each of these "blesseds" is a statement about an important aspect in how we exercise stewardship of our lives. Each of them offers us an ideal of how to live and how we find God living within us.

Pray and ask the Lord for the wisdom and strength to follow this Christian Stewardship way of life, a path that follows in the true footsteps of Jesus.

SENIOR NUTRITION PROGRAM

Recently, the quality assurance case manager of Catholic Charities Senior Nutrition Program received a call from a 60 year old man who was just released from the hospital. Upon returning to his home, he discovered that he had no electricity and no food. He asked to receive home delivered meals, but due to budget cuts the program had a waiting list and the case manager could not add him to the program. Undeterred, however, she picked up a hot meal from the kitchen and food from the agency's Food Resource Center and delivered these to the senior the same day. When visiting with the senior, the case manager discovered that a city council member was already working on restoring his electricity. She also discovered that the senior was ambulatory and could manage attending one of our congregate sites with the assistance of transportation.

He began coming to the site the following day and attended the site Monday through Friday for the rest of the month. He has become a regular attendee at that site. He has benefited from his daily attendance at the site by receiving a daily meal and becoming more social and therefore less isolated.
