

Pastor's Column

For All That Has Been—Thank You! For All That Will Be—Yes!

July 1 will be my eleventh anniversary as the Pastor of St. Thomas More Catholic Church. I share with you, once again, my first Pastor's Column dated July 6, 2003.

It is my desire each year to give you my first Pastor's Column in which I shared with you the words of Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk, as he talks about the meaning and purpose of a Parish. His words have become over the years of my ministry, in the various Parishes in which I have served, my pastoral motivation and direction. May our yearly reflection upon these words help all of us in deepening our relationship with the Lord Jesus.

Over these eleven years, I have thanked God constantly for your overwhelming positive response in your willingness to work together as we continue to witness to the Kingdom of God and move into our future.

In my almost forty years of ministry, I have been in many faith-filled Parishes, but I must admit that St. Thomas More has strengthened me the most in my pastoral responsibilities. This Parish helps me so much to be a faithful pastor!

As I begin my journey with the Church of St. Thomas More and become a member of this Faith Community, I share with you the words of The Most Reverend Daniel Pilarczyk, the now retired, former Archbishop of Cincinnati, taken from his book, *The Parish: Where God's People Live:*

A Parish, then, is a moment, a chapter in God's love affair with us human beings. And being a member of a Parish does not mean just "belonging to something", but rather, being involved in a loving association with God in Christ Jesus and with each other in Him, and with all the world for Him. Parish is therefore concerned with relationships, our relationship with Christ and our relationship with each other in Him. Consequently, the main participant in every Parish is the Lord Himself. It is He around whom the people gather in worship. It is He whose word the Parishioners hear there. It is His work the Parishioners carry out in the context of the Parish's life and in their activity in the world, activity for which they are enlightened and strengthened in the Parish. It is for the strengthening and expression of His Body, the Church, that the Parishioners build buildings and carry out programs. It is in response to His love that the Parish engages in care for the poor and in outreach to those who have forgotten Christ or have never known Him.

I now have the privilege of joining you, the Church of St. Thomas More, on its Faith Journey, its Love Affair with God, in and through the Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that, because our paths now become one, we will continue to deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus, and that we will continue to center our lives more completely on Him.

As I begin my ministry as your Pastor, I commit all of my time, talent, treasure, and energy in building on the strong foundation that has already been set, that is, the ongoing creation of a climate and an environment of hospitality that says: "The Church of St. Thomas More is holy ground. As we begin to walk together, may our prayer be: "For all that has been—Thank you. For all that will be—Yes!"


Social Ministries & Outreach

THE APOSTLES PETER AND PAUL

One of the oldest saints' days in Rome, June 29 was dedicated to the memory of the apostles Peter and Paul as early as the fourth century. This day the church remembers two disciples who differed greatly in style and background, but who shared a tireless energy in spreading the gospel.

Rough-hewn and impulsive Peter left his fishing nets immediately to answer Jesus' call. Later, during the passion of Jesus, Peter made his denials just as impulsively, though he had pledged his loyalty to Jesus only that evening. Receiving Christ's gracious forgiveness after the resurrection, Peter went on to become the rock-steady and faithful leader of the disciples. Imprisoned three or four times, he eventually

was crucified during the reign of Nero. Legend has it that he was hung on the cross head down because he told the soldiers that he was not worthy to die in the same manner as Christ.

Once Paul, who had been a rigid and violent persecutor of Christians, experienced the love of Christ, he grew meek-though never shy. He founded many churches and was affirm the fledgling able to communities of believers even while he was admonishing them. Paul's writings are the first Christian scriptures: they are older than the gospels. After many imprisonments, Paul was executed during the reign of Nero. Since he was a Roman citizen, he was beheaded instead of crucified.

Coastal countries like Chile and Paraguay remember Peter the fisherman with nautical parades. In Hungary and in rural England, people braid straw from the wheat harvest into crosses and crowns to honor the two martyr saints.





Christian Stewardship ~ Our Way of Life

Stewardship comes from the Greek word "oikonomos," which refers to a person who is the manager or administrator of a household. "Oikonomos" is also a derivative of the word from which we get the word "economics."

In the original sense of the word, we are stewards of God's creation. That is, God entrusts his creation to us and holds us accountable for the way we manage it, just as a house owner entrusts his household affairs to the steward.

In another sense, stewardship is a term frequently used to describe a Christian's response to the loving activity of God. God has blessed us with so much.

What we do with the blessings God has given us is our Christian stewardship. In this sense, stewardship is a lifestyle. As such, there are two kinds of stewardship:

- 1. There is the responsible and caring management of God's creation . . .
- 2. or the irresponsible, ungrateful management of that which has been entrusted to us.

Similarly, there are two kinds of stewards:

- 1. Faithful stewards carefully administer the gifts given to them,
- while unfaithful stewards show no regard for God's gifts.

Christian Stewardship, the way in which we manage the gifts given us, is not only an act of love; it is a statement of faith. It is a declaration of our response to everything that God has done and continues to do.

Christ died upon the cross for each of us. Each of us can return this love to Christ by being a co-worker with him in our church family. We acknowledge that all that we have, all that we are and all that we shall ever have, are God's gifts to us.

Therefore, in recognition and gratitude for God's goodness to us. each one of us should volunteer to be a co-worker with Christ by participating in church activities, giving of our time and talent.




