Envy

Envy is my first tangible memory as a human being. I carried that deadly sin with me into adulthood.

I was 4-1/2 years old, in kindergarten. Three or four of us were sitting on the floor and we were asked to place blocks of wood, with holes in their centers, on a string. It was a contest to see who would finish first. I did not win, and I was envious of the girl who had more dexterity than the rest of us to complete the task first.

How sad! My first real memories of me, Michael, were those of envy spurred on by competition.

Thomas Aquinas said of it, "Envy according to the aspect of its object is contrary to charity, whence the soul derives its spiritual life...Charity rejoices in our neighbor's good, while envy grieves over it" (Summa Theologica).

I have often reflected upon Thomas' take on envy and finally in my late adult life, I feel confident in voicing a bit of different twist on his definition.

My kindergarten envy did not grieve over my classmate's good fortune in finishing first. The deadly sin of envy made me feel inadequate and incompetent. And I took those feelings of inadequacy and incompetence with me through the schools—grade, high, college, and seminary. Most times in the background, other times significantly in the forefront, the envy was always there, ready for a fight.

Only after very special moments of grace in my faith journey, in which God broke into my existence, over and over again through the encouraging words of fellow human beings, did I come to be aware of my gifts and talents. They led me out of my envy, in which I was grieving over myself. I was led to charity, in which I recognized the many gifts God had given me; and how I could use them to be of assistance to others.

Grieving, not so much over my neighbor's good, but rather, grieving more over my inadequacies blinded me to my own good. Thanks to God's interventions over the years, I am now charitable to myself and the world is a better place because of it.

While many groups are beginning to try to develop fair and humane long-term remedies to this crisis, there are immediate needs to which we can respond.

Our Parish is a member of two organizations that are attending to immediate needs: ICWJ (Interfaith Center for Worker Justice) and SDOP (San Diego Organizing project), as well as becoming involved in long-term solutions.

WHAT IS MINISTRY?

A couple of weeks ago, Debbie Fredette asked me to talk to the teens that will be part of our 2015 Confirmation class (and their parents), and my task was to talk about ministry.

Ten minutes. Where to start?

As part of my responsibilities as director of liturgy and music, I work with many, many ministers. Some are explicitly named as such-Eucharistic, Hospitality, and Music, for example—while others are not— Altar Servers, Sacristans, and Readers (shorthand for Ministers of the Word). And then, there are also those on committees and teams who prepare the liturgy of the Parish behind the scenes, in the sacristy, on the lift, in the sanctuary, at the ironing board preparing environment.

But what, exactly, is a "minister"?

If we look at the word itself, a minister is a person of "lower" status, a "servant". The word goes back via Old French *minister* to the Latin *minister*, meaning "servant,

and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35). There are others. Many others.

As I was thinking about how to bring ministry into context for these soon-to-be young adults, I recalled a part of my childhood, where my sister and I began to have responsibilities as part of the family. These were tasks beyond our "chores" and didn't have any financial consequences (allowance). My first recollection of this sort of responsibility was helping to cook. In addition to the measuring, pouring, stirring, and blending (a perennial favorite as it involved the loud noise of the blender), my sister and I were asked to set the table and clean the kitchen after dinner (as the younger of the two of us you might guess which one my sister got!). Unless I was the principal cook for the evening, in which case someone else got to clean up! This sort of activity provided us an opportunity to participate in the life of our family.

Ministry might be described as participating in the life of one's *faith*



Matthew 13:3

And for them, and for you, there are many opportunities for ministry, for service as part of this faith family. In my world of liturgy and music, one can serve "within the walls" as an altar server (any height!), Eucharistic minister, hospitality minister, music minister, Reader, sacristan, or one who works behind the scenes to make our liturgical environment beautiful and worthy.

One can also serve "outside the walls" as a Eucharistic minister to the hospital or to the homebound.

There are also many, many other ways to serve in other parts of this big family we call the Parish of St. Thomas More. See the rest of this bulletin for ideas.

All of these ministries and the actions we make as part of one or more of them are seeds, like those of today's gospel, which bear fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold.

And then, when we have fully participated our faith family—this faith community—and when we must leave this faith community to meet Jesus face to face, may he say "Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master" (Matthew 25:11).



Christian Stewardship and the Need for Recreation

Is there such a thing as a stewardship of recreation? Some people might dismiss the thought. But they'd be wrong.

In his book, *The Gift of the Jews*, author Thomas Cahill observes that, in receiving the Ten Commandments, the ancient Hebrews did something no other ancient society had ever done: they established a day of rest. "The God who made the universe and rested bids us to do the same, calling us to a weekly restoration of prayer, study, and recreation (or re-creation)."

For those who live in the Northern Hemisphere at least, probably no other month bids us relaxation as the month of July. Backyard barbecues, days at the pool or the beach, a recreational outing or simply the lazy idleness of a mid-year Sunday afternoon invite us to slow down. And this invitation should be heeded by everyone.



Sometimes, our society induces in us a sense of guilt if we're not "doing." But turning off the computer and the phone and spending quality time with those around us, or finding time for our own interior lives, is stewardship of our time which leads to the place where God dwells. It's a good example for our kids as well: July presents a wonderful time to "rest" from all the electronic screens and busyness that dominate their young lives.

July is when U.S. citizens celebrate their freedom. When the Hebrew people first received the Ten Commandments, they too had just received their freedom from the Egyptians after a sojourn in the wilderness.

Cahill thinks it's no coincidence that a people recently liberated were in need of a directive to rest and reflect. He writes, "Leisure is the necessary ground of creativity, and a free people are free to imitate the creativity of God."

So, the next time you feel guilty about a quiet, reflective time of doing "nothing," remember that recreation also means "re-creation." To be a truly creative person, a steward of our interior resources, we must honor our need to rest, relax, be with others, read and play. —ICSC July 2014 e-bulletin (with permission)
