The 21st Century Challenge:
The Creative Interaction of Science and Religion

In the last several years, I have become acquainted with the John Templeton Foundation. Established in 1987, the foundation supports hundreds of programs worldwide, which serve three chief purposes. The first is to stimulate serious, rigorous, progress-generating links between the sciences and all religions. The second purpose is to encourage character development in schools and colleges. And the third is to stimulate greater appreciation worldwide for the benefits of freedom and free competition.

"The mission of the John Templeton Foundation is to pursue new insights at the boundary between theology and science through a rigorous, open-minded and empirically focused methodology, drawing together talented representatives from a wide spectrum of fields of expertise. Using the 'humble approach,' the Foundation typically seeks to focus the methods and resources of scientific inquiry on topical areas which have spiritual and theological significance ranging across the disciplines from cosmology to healthcare." 
Templeton believes there is much to be learned in all fields, including religion, by the successful methods of scientists—which occasionally means holding in one's mind seemingly antithetical ideas at one time. "No one knows the total truth," he points out, "but a rigorous method can start movement in the right direction."

The ancient fear of many scientists was the one predicted by J.B.S. Haldane in his 1923 book "Daedalus" that science, especially the technology of war, was destined to turn good into evil. John Templeton is intent on seeing that science turns good into more good.

The Foundation funds many projects that attempt to create an interaction between science and religion. The Foundation also offers "The Templeton Prize for Progress in Religion." This prize is given each year for extraordinary originality in advancing the world's understanding of God or spirituality. This award began in 1973. Among past recipients was Mother Theresa of Calcutta.

Science and religion, once seen as enemies, are now handmaids—together seeking truth and understanding of the Universal Mystery. Stem cell research is just one issue facing us that brings together the questions of "Can we do this?" and "Should we do this?"

Charles Townes, Ph.D., Nobel Laureate in Physics, Professor of Physics at the University of California, Berkeley, has said: "Science wants to know the mechanism of the universe, religion the meaning. The two cannot be separated."

Through all our efforts in our little corners of the global village, let us take on the 21st century challenge of a creative interaction between science and religion!



Christian Stewarding Our Families: When "Back to School" means "Back to the Family Dinner Table"

August brings us face to face with one of life's realities: summer vacation has to end. Children may groan and parents may breathe a sigh of relief, but one thing is certain. The beginning of school brings a return to routine, and this translates into less eating on the run and more scheduled meals around the family dinner table.

It's not always possible for the whole family to eat together, but making it a priority at least some nights of the week can pay big dividends for the Christian steward trying to raise a family of faith. Here are a few dinner table tips:

- ♥ Everyone should know certain nights are family dinner nights. Look closely at everyone's schedule, make a plan, and then hold family nights sacred.
- Whether frozen pizza or prime rib, set the table nicely and sit down. Maybe light a dinner candle or pull out the cloth napkins. Pick up a special dessert once in a while.
- Parents and kids often hit the dinner hour fatigued. Make an effort to relax. Start off with a smile and laughter, even when you'd rather hit the couch.
- If you haven't already, begin the family custom of praying before meals in a spontaneous way. What was I most thankful for today? Let everyone take a brief turn. It may lead to a great conversation after the "amen."
- Resist scolding or criticizing a child at dinner. Never demand to know why the math paper wasn't turned in, or why the kid will not get out of bed on time. Save it for a private discussion later. Allow the dinner table to be a place of welcome and support.
- As you review the day's events, don't forget God. Just as you are interested in what your children are reading in literature class or library hour, express an interest in what's being taught in religion class or in weekly faith formation.
- ♥ Set the rule that everyone remains seated until all are finished. Then the meal is complete.
- But the work's not done. Divide the duties of setting the table, clearing, washing, even cooking so that everyone has a role to play and the work goes quickly.
- Bring back the custom of an "after dinner" prayer, brief and blessed.

Missionary Cooperative Appeal

Fr. Antony Gaspar, a missionary from the Diocese of Dindigul in India, shared with us about their work and asked for our prayers and financial support on the weekend of August 16-17.

The Diocese of Dindigul was newly created in 2003 and serves the needs of 2.95 million people of different faiths, but Catholics are only about 133,000. So the need for evangelization work is huge. But the resources to train catechists and faith educators and construct faith formation centers, churches, mission chapels, schools, orphanages, and primary health care centers are all daunting tasks for their diocese. Currently their diocese has the responsibility to support 73 seminarians and 35 catechists who are in formation at various levels in order to meet future spiritual, pastoral, and missionary needs. In addition, they provide housing, education, and medical services to 300 poor and orphaned children in a diocesan-administrated orphanage.
