Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross

On the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross (or Triumph of the Cross) we honor the Holy Cross by which Christ redeemed the world. The public veneration of the Cross of Christ originated in the fourth century, according to early accounts, beginning with the miraculous discovery of the cross on September 14, 326, by Saint Helen, mother of Constantine, while she was on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem—the same day that two churches built at the site of Calvary by Constantine were dedicated.

The observance of the Feast of the Exaltation (probably from a Greek word meaning "bringing to light") of the Cross has been celebrated by Christians on September 14 ever since. In the Western Church, the feast came into prominence in the seventh century, apparently inspired by the recovery of a portion of the Cross, said to have been taken from Jerusalem by the Persians, by the Roman emperor Heraclius in 629.

Christians "exalt" the Cross of Christ as the instrument of our salvation. Adoration of the Cross is, thus, adoration of Jesus Christ, the God "The Word Made Flesh," who suffered and died on this Roman instrument of torture for our redemption from sin and death. The cross represents the One Sacrifice by which Jesus, obedient even unto death, accomplished our salvation. The cross is a symbolic summary of the Passion, Crucifixion, and Resurrection of Christ—all in one image.

The Cross—because of what it represents—is the most potent and universal symbol of the Christian faith. It has inspired both liturgical and private devotions: for example, the Sign of the Cross, which is an invocation of the Holy Trinity; the "little" Sign of the Cross on head, lips, and heart at the reading of the Gospel; praying the Stations (or Way) of the Cross; and the Veneration of the Cross by the faithful on Good Friday by kissing the feet of the image of Our Savior crucified.

Placing a crucifix (the cross with an image of Christ's body upon it) in churches and homes, in classrooms of Catholic schools and in other Catholic institutions, or wearing this image on our person, is a constant reminder—and witness—of Christ's ultimate triumph, his victory over sin and death through his suffering and dying on the Cross.

We remember Our Lord's words, "He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. He who finds his life will lose it, and he who loses his life for my sake shall find it" (Mt 10:38, 39). Meditating on these words we unite ourselves—our souls and bodies—with his obedience and his sacrifice; and we rejoice in this inestimable gift through which we have the hope of salvation and the glory.

Dying, you destroyed our death; rising you restored our life. Save us by your cross, Christ our Redeemer!

MAKE MY SOUL TO GLOW

approaching God—Vincent and Mary

by Erin Ryan, from Celebration September 2014, with permission. You yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed (Luke 2:35).

The phone rings. "Good morning, Charlotte Fine Art Gallery," I answer. "This is Erin speaking." Several times a week, the voice on the line starts telling me about a piece of art they found at the Goodwill, or bought at an estate sale, discovered while doing renovations on a house. They tell me the artist's name. Is it worth anything? I stop them. "I'm afraid we don't do appraisals here." Most of the time, I give the caller the name of an area appraiser. They thank us and go their way. Other times, my "We don't do appraisals" comment is met with confusion. "But I just wanted you to tell me a little bit about it," they'll say. "Can't you do that?" As in, right now?

On "Antiques Roadshow" or "Pawn Stars" or "Storage Wars," somebody walks up with a painting and the appraisal expert immediately rattles off the artist's life story and reveals what the art is worth. What they don't show on these programs is the mountain of research that the expert did off-camera.

It always boggles my mind that people think I can evaluate a painting instantly, based on a signature they read to me over the phone. Every decent-sized town has an art guild attached to it. That's thousands—millions—of artists to be discovered in attics or thrift stores. How could I possibly know them all? But of course, there are some artists whose names are known to everyone.

A few weeks ago, I went with my family to an exhibit called *Van Gogh Alive!* Before coming to Charlotte, it had toured in Istanbul, Phoenix, Ankara, Tel Aviv, Santiago, Milan, and Moscow. It was not your traditional art exhibit. It contained no

actual paintings.

"More than 3,000 Van Gogh images at enormous scale create a thrilling display that fills giant screens, walls, columns, ceilings and even the floor—immersing you entirely in the vibrant colours and vivid details that constitute Van Gogh's unique style," the website explains.

The exhibit was crowded. Van Gogh is a popular artist. When we went to the Van Gogh exhibit in 1999 in Washington, we waited in line for hours to get tickets.

Alive! started off with plaques that explained the details of the artist's life: Born in the southern Netherlands, Van Gogh was an art dealer and a minister before devoting himself to painting in 1880, at age 27. His art was a near-religious calling. He exhibited and associated with artists of his day, but it is often said that he sold only one painting during his lifetime, "The Red Vineyard" (ca. 1888). He shot himself at 37, fearing he was a burden on his beloved brother Theo, an art dealer, who consistently supported him.

Next we filed into the multimedia presentation. It took us over the last 10 years of Van Gogh's life—Paris; Arles, where he turned out canvases of poppies and sunny landscapes suffused with his favorite color, yellow; the asylum at Saint-Rémy, where he painted "Starry Night." As the colors glowed luminous and then grew darker, the music changed, too. First the calm tones of Vivaldi; then the melancholy piano of Satie; then "Danse Saint-Saëns' jagged Macabre." Ouotes drawn from Vincent's letters to Theo appeared on the walls, showing the artist's intense struggle to stay afloat:

I wish they would only take me as I am.

Only when I fall do I get up again.



John 3:17

I wish to express, not sentimental melancholy, but serious sorrow.

It ended with one of his last paintings, "Wheatfield with Crows," completed shortly before his death. I felt as though I had been inside the man's mind. The room pulsed with Vincent's naked, hopeful, desperate feeling, his struggle to make others realize the overwhelming love that he wrote about in his letters, even in the midst of his pain. Art was love for him; his way of approaching God. In the end, he succumbed to the pain, though he left the fruits of his struggle for us to see.

At that moment, I thought: This is why we remember him, among the multitude of artists who have come and gone.

On September 15, we remember Our Lady of Sorrows. We sing "Stabat Mater," one of four pre-Gospel sequences still preserved in the liturgy of the Western church.

"At the cross her station keeping, stood the mournful Mother weeping, close to Jesus to the last," go the familiar words. We sing about her struggle, her pain. About the sword that has pierced Mary's heart. And then we ask her to help us know how to go through the struggle and come out the other side, to see what she has come to see.

"O sweet Mother!" we implore her,

Make me feel as you have felt; Make my soul to glow and melt With the love of Christ, my Lord.




