Proposition 47: The Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act

The California Catholic Conference of Bishops has endorsed Proposition 47 which will be on the ballot in the General Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2014.

Today's bulletin features a flyer from the California Catholic Conference of Bishops highlighting the details of this proposition. Last week I included the Bishops' statement about Proposition 47 in my Pastor's Column.

Please take time to review the flyer and read the statement if you haven't already..

The Social Justice Committee of our Parish is hosting a panel discussion on Proposition 47 on Tuesday, October 21, at 7:00pm here in our Parish Center.

The Bishops are encouraging discussion on this issue, and we are helping to provide that opportunity.

California Ballot Proposition 47 Panel Discussion

Tuesday, October 21 at 7:00pm at St. Thomas More Parish Center

The State of California has a chance this year to change the way that we react to nonserious crimes by investing in education and mental health services rather than more prisons.

Proposition 47—the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act—will reclassify six low-level crimes from felonies to misdemeanors and reallocate the money saved into services that prevent crime and invest in the future.

The California Catholic Conference of Bishops has fully endorsed the Act, saying: "All human life is sacred, and, therefore, all social policies and actions in the realm of criminal justice must begin with respect for the life and dignity of the human person...Proposition 47 addresses prison overcrowding and sentencing discrepancies in constructive ways...this will make our communities safer."

SINGING WITH THE SAINTS IN GLORY

I attend a lot of Funeral Masses. Certainly not as many as our pastor does, but I go to quite a few, ministering to the families of the deceased in my role as cantor for the

Over time, this regular dose of the Funeral Mass liturgy has become a pillar of my Christian faith, for it is here that I soak in a key piece of the Gospel message, that at the end of our earthly journey, there is hope, comfort, and peace.

This has become a vital supplement to the weekly Gospel story—with its supporting scripture from elsewhere in the Bible. As we wend our way through the liturgical seasons and the story encapsulated in the threeyear cycle of Sunday readings, it seems to me that the readings don't as much time discussing the end of our journey as I need, although we do get a few weeks here and there, especially during the Easter season:

Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be.

---Jn 14:1-4 (5th Sunday of Easter in Year A) At funerals, however, I regularly

hear passages about our last days. In

addition to the passage quoted above, I find support in Jesus' most declarations powerful consolation:

Come to me, all you who labor and are heavy burdened, and I will give you rest. —Mt 11:28

I am the living bread that came down from heaven, whoever eats this bread will live forever. -Jn 6:51

I will not reject anyone who comes to me...for this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life. - Jn 6:37-

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted. —Mt 5:4

In times of personal difficulty, these words refresh my faith. As I prepare our liturgies for the upcoming celebration of All Souls, they resonate with hope. As I remember those who have gone before me in death, they offer peace.

The Funeral rite and its companion, Baptism, make up the bookends of our earthly journey. They are critical to this journey of faith, and the Funeral Mass reminds that my journey of faith, my journey with Christ, is one that will end well-no matter what my current circumstances might be.



Matthew 22:21

The Funeral liturgies strengthen my belief that I am person of faith. I am a person of hope. I am a person who is loved by God. And I am not alone.

So I invite you to join with your sisters and brothers in Christ at Mass on All Soul's Day or at a Funeral Mass once in a while. Doing so may strengthen your foundation of faith, hope, and peace, and may even provide a timely reminder of the joyfilled conclusion to our story.



Christian Stewardship ~ Giving of Ourselves

Money can sometimes be our easiest method of giving. Everybody knows they should give money, even those who never give. There is no doubt that every Parish needs and appreciates our financial donations.

Giving of ourselves is our most difficult giving. Giving of ourselves means giving the best of our love, our devotion, our talents, our time, and our mind.

The Safe Neighborhood and Schools Act The Bishops of California Support Proposition 47

Summary: Proposition 47 would:

- Reclassify certain nonviolent crimes as misdemeanors which would reduce penalties and the overall prison population
- Utilize savings realized from a reduced prison needs to support dropout prevention programs, mental health and drug abuse treatment, trauma recovery and services to victims of crimes and programs designed to improve K-12 education.
- Enable law enforcement to focus valuable resources on serious offenders and stops wasting taxpayer dollars on offenders who pose no risk to society.

It also does very little to assist the most vulnerable in our society, the poor and disenfranchised, especially those with mental health issues. –U.S. Bishops *Responsibility, Rehabilitation and Restoration*

This obligation is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person. . . . As far as possible citizens should take an active part in public life" (nos. 1913-1915).



A majority of the people are under 18 or over 65 years of age. The weather in McKinley County is either below freezing or well over 100 degrees.
