#### Epiphany—A Festival of Inclusion

A number of Parishioners have asked that I post my Epiphany homily as a Pastor's Column for the bulletin...

Mark Twain once said that he put a dog and a cat in a cage together as an experiment, to see if they could get along. They did.

So he put in a bird, pig, and a goat. They too got along fine after a few adjustments.

Then he put in a Baptist, a Presbyterian, and a Catholic, and all hell broke loose.

Mark Twain did not even bother putting together a Christian, a Muslim, and a Jew. That was unthinkable in his days.

In today's world, however, it has become obvious that Christians live in the same cage, in the same city, in the same world, with people of other religions.

We do live in a cage! It is called the Global Village. Because of social media, and air travel, we are all thrown together. Either we learn to live together and respect differences, or we will destroy ourselves and our planet.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. We remember the Magi who came from the East to worship the infant Jesus.

They came guided by a star. Being nature worshippers who had no scriptures, God revealed himself to them through the means available to them in their own religion.

Through the stars they were able to learn of the birth of Jesus and find their way to him.

They came as pagans, they worshipped Jesus as pagans, and they went home as pagans.

They did not convert either to Judaism or to Christianity.

Their worship was acceptable to God and God directed them in their journey home through a dream.

This shows that God does have a relationship with people of other religions who are neither Jews nor Christians.

The Feast of Christmas tells us that God's Word, Jesus, became flesh.

This Feast of Epiphany tells us the implications of the Word become flesh. The Word that became flesh, Jesus, is God's love for everyone on the face of the Earth, not just for a few, not just for the many, but for all people.

Christians are crazy if we think that one day the whole world will be Christian. Muslims are crazy if they think that one day the whole world will be Islamic.

If that becomes one's intent, be it Christian or Islamic, all hell will break loose. It has happened in the past, and it is happening now in our present day. As long as we keep trying to convert one another, this will keep happening.

The Feast of Epiphany teaches us that, as Christians, our first responsibility is to not evangelize in the hope of making people Christian, but our first responsibility is to love one another, because that is what God's Word is.

All of us on the face of the earth, whatever religion or no religion, are capable of love. That is the call of Epiphany.

When we love, truly love, then, secondarily, we are evangelizing. not with words, but with actions.

Mother Theresa of Calcutta is a perfect model of the Epiphany message:

In her lifetime, Mother Teresa of Calcutta had treated over 50,000 dying people. Her Order, the Missionaries of Charity, today counts over 1,600 sisters in more than 60 countries around the world. She was honored by presidents and applauded by prime ministers. 50 years after she set foot in India, she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.

Mother Teresa's vision of the ministry of Jesus Christ and our sharing in that ministry, as Christ's embrace of today's world is simple but challenging.

She once described it this way: "Everyone is created by God and deserving of love. It does not matter if the person is male or female. Muslim or Christian or Jew. It does not matter the person's race or nationality. All that matters is that the person is created by God and deserves love. My sisters are there simply to give love.'

It seems fitting that Mother Teresa entered upon her life of ministry in India on the Feast of the Epiphany because the vision she developed is exactly the vision of this feast, described in today's readings.

The Epiphany proclaims that everyone is created by God and deserving of love. The person's race, religion, nationality, or sexual orientation does not matter.

All that matters is that this creature of God deserves love. And we—the arms of Jesus that now embrace the world—are simply here to give love.

The Epiphany vision, as phrased by Mother Teresa, is simple, challenging and utterly profound: Everyone is created by God and deserves love. Everyone—male, female, Muslim, Jew, Christian, Buddhist, atheist, agnostic, black, white, yellow, brown, gay, straight.

Everyone—people who are clumsy in their social graces, people who are imprisoned, thieves, murderers, rapists, and abusers... even Democrats and Republicans.

Because we Christians are Christ's embrace of the world, we are here simply to give love.

When we live out this Epiphany vision, we become God's epiphany for the world. We turn into stars to guide others to Christ.

The original Epiphany gifts were gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Today only one gift suffices: love. On this Feast of Epiphany, there is no greater way to adore Christ than to offer everyone love without distinction, without qualification, and without hesitation.

The Feast of Epiphany is a Festival of Inclusion. As we celebrate this day, may we be willing to ask ourselves:

"Whom am I letting into my life and whom am I keeping out?"

The "Friends of La Posada" is the financial and social support group for the men's shelter, La Posada de Guadalupe (the inn of our Lady of Guadalupe).

La Posada is special to St. Thomas More Parish because the shelter is within our parish geographic jurisdiction. The shelter we support has a diverse population: Caucasians, Hispanics, African-Americans. Last year, 24 were veterans. Besides room and board, these men receive a variety of case management services that help them to become independent, healthy, and contributing members of their communities. About 40 of the men are farm workers who formerly slept in make-shift shelters in the fields or in crowded apartments.

Last year, La Posada moved into a new mission-style building on the same site and doubled in size (going from 50 beds to 100, including 50 beds for farm workers. Naturally operating expenses have doubled as well.

We hope you will continue to show your commitment to La Posada and its programs for homeless men and farm workers by becoming an "official" friend.

Join us at an appropriate membership level for the year, \$35 for individuals, \$50 for families. There are other levels for businesses and organizations.

As we move through the next few weeks, our focus expands from celebrating the joy of Jesus' birth to recalling the initial steps of his ministry—his baptism, John's recognition of him as the Lamb of God, and finally, the calling of his first disciples.

Our own call to ministry as the people of St. Thomas More stems from Jesus' words to those first disciples, "Follow me..."

Each week, we are reminded of this call by the priest or deacon at the end of Mass:

Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.

Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.

"Go" is an action word. It isn't "go away," but rather "go and do!"

The weeks ahead are about doing—engaging in, as Fr. Mike likes to remind us, the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ for this time and this place. Both inside and outside the walls of our buildings, our ministry

is Jesus' ministry.

At St. Thomas More, we call this stewardship. And our stewardship pool is very deep, with many, many opportunities for ministry permeating this faith community. And, like any deep pool, if we haven't yet dived in to the stewardship pool, it can be a little daunting.

There is opportunity for everyone, whether you just want to dip your toe in the water or if cannonballing is more your style.

Time is one of our most precious personal commodities, and it takes effort to balance the available hours in our day with the service we want to bring to this community.

The liturgical ministries offer a broad set of opportunities to go, to love and serve, to announce, and to glorify the Lord. Whether you have minutes or hours, days or evenings, weekdays or weekends—whatever TIME you are willing to offer—we have an opportunity for you.

I look forward to hearing from you.

## 2015 ~ A New Year, New Beginnings for the Christian Steward

The practice of making New Year's resolutions goes back over 3,000 years. The start of a new year gives us the feeling of a fresh start, a new beginning, and new opportunities. It is a time when people feel that they can begin anew with their lives. Common New Year's resolutions are to lose weight, exercise more, and eat healthier; or to spend more time with family. Still others include managing money better and being more organized.

Although there is nothing in the Bible or notable in Christian tradition about New Year's resolutions, many good stewards take advantage of this time of year to become closer to the Lord. They may re-commit themselves to pray more, to read the Bible, or to attend Mass more regularly. If you are looking for some ideas for your New Year's resolutions, here are a few to get you started:

**Practice gratitude** – Cultivating a grateful heart is the hallmark of a Christian steward. Every day, express thankfulness to the Lord and to others.

**Encounter the Lord each day** – Find time to be with the Lord each day, whether it be an hour or ten minutes. Have a talk with the Lord. Give your joys and worries to him as well. Allow God's love to transform them. Our encounters will keep our eyes and ears open to the presence of Christ in our midst.

**Be present to others** – There is much celebration and mourning, joy and sorrow in peoples' lives. What a blessing it is to be able to share those times and not let others experience them alone. The gift of your presence to others is much more valuable than you realize.

**Resist overwork** – There is a pressure to produce, meet goals, be successful. But activities that lead us to overwork, constant fatigue and worry do not give glory to God. What God calls us to do we can do well. Be mindful that life requires balance, down time and letting go of unrealistic goals.



Remembering that the Holy Family fled violence and lived for a time as refugees, we ask that you protect all refugee families fleeing persecution, and provide them a place of safety and comfort.

For children who are making perilous journeys, often alone and without the protection of loved ones, we ask that you reunite them with their families and protect them from violence on the journey.

For all migrants, that they not feel compelled to migrate but have opportunities in their homeland where they can thrive and live fully human lives.

Open our hearts so that we may provide hospitality for those who come in search of refuge, through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

During this Christmas season, the Church celebrates the remarkable events of the Holy Family that remind us that we are all related as one family under God. The U.S. bishops have identified the Week of January 4 through 10 as National Migration Week highlighting the theme: *We Are One Family under God*.
