#### Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: November 3-17, 2015

For me, Israel/Palestine is a place to which I want to return over and over again, because each time that I visit, my faith is deepened and I am more connected to the Scriptures and more centered in the celebration of the Eucharist. When you walk where Jesus walked, you are never the same again!

I am happy to announce that in November of this year (November 3-17), I will be leading a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

The pilgrimage will be a comfortable, two-week opportunity to grow in faith and to deepen your relationship with God.

Imagine visiting Tel Aviv, the Judean Hill Country, Bethlehem, Ein Karem (the home of John the Baptist), Tiberias, Caesarea and the Mediterranean Coast, Haifa, Mt. Carmel, the Jordan River, Nazareth, Cana, the Sea of Galilee, Capernaum, the Mt. of Beatitudes, Mt. Tabor, the Jezreel Valley, the Jordan Valley, Jerusalem, the Western Wall, Mt. Zion, the Upper Room, Dormition Abbey, the Mt. of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Old City of Jerusalem, the Pool of Bethesda, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Bethany, Jericho, the Dead Sea, Qumran, Ein Gedi, and more!

It is a well-planned pilgrimage, and it will be educational and prayerful.

#### THE APOSTLES' CREED

During Lent we are using the Apostles' Creed instead of the Nicene Creed.

The Apostles' Creed is the most ancient of the Creeds in the Church. Another word the Church uses for the Creed is the term "symbol," and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) states that the Apostles' Creed is "the ancient baptismal symbol (creed) of the Church of Rome," to which St. Ambrose adds: "It is the Creed of the Roman Church, the See of Peter, the first of the apostles, to which he brought the common faith" (CCC n.194).

In the early Church, Lent was a time of intense preparation for those who were to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. During Lent the candidates, referred to as the chosen, were brought together often and taught the beliefs of the Church as outlined in the Creed. When the teaching had been completed, the Creed itself was "handed over" to them so that they might learn it by heart. A week later the chosen returned and "handed back" the Creed, each person, in the words of the Creed, professing his or her acceptance of the faith.

#### Baptismal symbol of the Church

The Apostles' Creed may be used at any Sunday Mass, but the Church particularly recommends its use during Lent and Easter Time. Why? Because the words of this ancient Creed have been used for centuries as the basis of our baptismal promises, and the seasons of Lent and Easter put a strong focus on baptism. During Lent we prepare those who will be baptized at Easter while readying ourselves to renew our own baptismal promises. During Lent, as we recite the Apostles' Creed, we pray that it will stir up in our hearts our commitment to Christ which was first made at our own baptisms and prepare us to renew our promises this Easter.





#### Juggling and the Challenge of Lent

Have you ever seen a juggler? They're fun to watch. My husband has been juggling for several years. Learning how wasn't easy. At first he practiced with rolled up socks or bean bags instead of balls because they don't roll away when they're dropped. But after many hours of practice, he's become good enough to talk as he juggles. He doesn't drop things if he's distracted, either.

Jugglers generally start learning this skill by tossing one bean bag from hand to hand. They go on from there to two, and then three bean bags. In a way, stewardship is like juggling.

Some people think that giving time, talent, and treasure is too difficult. They may know of others in their church who do, but think, "Oh, they're so organized and generous and talented. I'm not like that, so I can't help as much."

It's true that some people are good at giving, just as some people are naturally well-coordinated. They start out with an advantage when they begin to practice stewardship or learn to juggle.

But giving is a skill that can be developed, just like juggling. It's up to us to become the best givers we can be.


