

Here is the List of things to consider giving up for Lent:

- 1. *Fear of Failure*—You don't succeed without experiencing failure. Just make sure you fail forward.
- 2. **Your Comfort Zone**—It's outside our comfort zones where new discoveries are made
- 3. *Feelings of Unworthiness*—You are fearfully and wonderfully made by your Creator (Psalm 139:14).
- 4. *Impatience*—God's timing is the perfect timing.
- 5. **Retirement**—As long as you are still breathing, you are here for a reason. You have a purpose to influence others for Christ. Our work is not always tied to a paycheck.
- 6. **People Pleasing**—I can't please everyone anyways. There is only one I need to strive to please.
- 7. *Comparison*—I have my own unique contribution to make and there is no one else like me.
- 8. **Blame**—I am not going to pass the buck. I will take responsibility for my actions.
- 9. *Guilt*—I am loved by Jesus and he has forgiven my sins. Today is a new day and the past is behind.
- 10. *Overcommitment*—Do less better and accomplish more.
- 11. Lack of Counsel—Wise decisions are rarely made in a vacuum.
- 12. *Impurity*—Live lives pure and without blemish.
- 13. *Entitlement*—The world does not owe me anything. God does not owe me anything. I live in humility and grace.
- 14. *Apathy*—Life is too short not to care.
- 15. *Hatred*—Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good (Romans 12:21).

- 16. *Negativity*—I will put the best construction on everything when it comes to other people. I will also minimize by contact with people who are negative and toxic.
- 17. *The Spirit of Poverty*—Believe that with God there is always more than enough and never a lack.
- Going through the Motions—The more you invest yourself, the more you will get back.
- 19. *Complaint*—Instead of contributing to the problem, be the solution
- 20. *The Pursuit of Happiness*—God wants something greater and more lasting than happiness. It is called joy.
- 21. *Bitterness*—The only person I am hurting by holding on to this is myself.
- 22. **Distraction**—Life is filled with distractions that will take our eyes off the prize.
- 23. *Giving up*—God never give up on us.
- 24. *Mediocrity*—If you are going to do something, then give it all you got.
- 25. **Destructive Speech**—Encourage one another and all the more as you see the day approaching (Hebrews 10:25).
- 26. *Busyness*—It is a badge of honor to be busy. But that does not always translate to abundance.
- 27. *Loneliness*—With Jesus, I am never alone. He is with me wherever I go.
- 28. *Disunity*—If two of you agree on earth about anything, it will be done for them by the Heavenly Father (Matthew 18:19).
- 29. *The Quick Fix*—Rarely does true transformation happen overnight.
- 30. *Worry*—God is in control and worrying will not help.
- Idolizing—Don't assign anyone a standard they cannot live up to.
- 32. *Resistance to Change*—Change is certain. It is not if we will change, but how we will change.
- 33. *Pride*—Blessed are the humble.
- 34. *Small View of God*—Don't tell God how big your problem is, tell your problem how big your God is.
- 35. *Envy*—I am blessed. My value is not found in my possessions, but in my relationship with my Heavenly Father.
- 36. *Ungratefulness*—You have been blessed in a way greater than you realize.

comfortable singing an opportunity to make music for the glory of God (although many in our handbell choir sing beautifully). The Praise Team emerged from the earlier Monday Night Mass band and introduced a whole new style of congregational song to our Parish. The Cappella Choir is our most recent group, focusing on the Church's long-cherished unaccompanied approach to singing. There have been other "start-ups" that haven't taken root, but which may return in the future when the time is ripe. There are musical activities that we did once upon a time and that I hope will return. And there will be other opportunities that we have yet to dream.

The Parish also continues its tradition of excellent liturgy. I am honored to be able to support Fr. Mike's vision of a church that incorporates so many of its people within its liturgical ministries. I am humbled to direct a large group of Parishioners who prepare and assist in our worship, faithfully, each and every day, week after week and year after year, both inside and outside our walls. We have lost some since those first days, to new homes and to eternal life, but many more have joined the liturgical ministries, stepping up as they are able, to serve the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ in this time and in this place. All of them-all of you-are an inspiration.

One of my great privileges during the past ten years has been contributing a small part to the design of our permanent church. Many, many people have been involved—too many to count if you include the all the committee meetings and the town hall events—but as we see the building rise from the dirt, it is a magnificent accomplishment, and with its completion, we stand poised to make an even greater Christ-centered impact on this community.

Looking back over these first ten years, and looking forward (very much so!) to the years to come, to the liturgies we will offer and the music we will make, I am confident in our future, knowing that the center of all our Parish activities is the worship of God, source of all that is good! God bless you all! And thank you.



What's in the Oven?

Pretend that you're in the kitchen. You've just closed the oven door when someone walks in and says, "What's in the oven?"

Do you answer, "It's a mixture of flour, baking powder, eggs," etc.? That's all it is at the moment. No, you'll just call it a cake. It won't be that for some time, but that won't change your answer. That's because you're taking time for granted.



Becoming something more . . .

Christian giving is something like that. Donations of food, clothing, money, etc., are like the ingredients, and talents (such as musicianship or organizational ability) provide the "mixing."

But time is what's needed to turn these things into the results of good stewardship. The time involved may be years, as in the construction of an addition to the church. (Sound familiar?)

It might be weeks, as in the preparation of a Lenten program. Then again, it might only be a moment . . . A moment in which people commit to Christ because of some word of witness.

Because our gifts and circumstances differ, we cannot all be missionaries or teachers. We cannot all witness to Christ in the professions, like Albert Schweitzer. During Lent, as we are all going an extra distance to sacrifice a variety of "things" and also taking on a greater prayer life, I am reminded of how much all of you mean to me, and to our Parish. We all make a good team! We do what it takes to make our world a better place! May God continue to bless us on our journey.



Immigrant Services

For the past 2 years Rasha tried everything she could to bring her family from Syria to the United States. The process was so discouraging that Rasha's mother, father, and siblings started to give up.



Rasha came in to the Refugee Services office and asked to transfer the case from another agency to Catholic Charities. She hoped Catholic Charities staff would advocate for her family. When staff investigated the details of the case they discovered a simple process that could possibly hasten the family's transfer to the USA. Soon, the family was approved to transfer. Staff called Rasha with the news. She was so happy: she was in tears.

Rasha called her family and told them to start packing. The family could hardly believe their daughter, but the next day they received notification of their flight date. We were on hand with our cameras to capture the moving reunion.

The Tomorrow Project

With training from Catholic Charities' Tomorrow Project, our participants learn usable skills for employment. Working the booth at fairs and outreach events helps overcome fears and provides excellent opportunities for social interaction. Some participants choose to continue their education. Maryanne is completing her Associate's Degree and works a part time job at

Jani-King and part-time at Qualcomm. Suzanne started a special training we offered on effective job search strategies. Soon afterwards, Firehouse Subs hired Suzanne and three others directly from our program. All four have successfully completed the probationary period and are moving forward in their lives and accomplishing their goals.




Homeless Women's Services

Marissa, 27, had been homeless for three years. She was a regular user of Rachel's Women's Center. She was initially very attentive to her personal hygiene and appearance and functioned well.

However, Marissa's function deteriorated rapidly after she was hit by a car last year. Soon after the accident, she acquired a wheelchair and adopted it as her "home," refusing to return for medical care, have her cast removed, or attend physical therapy to regain the use of her legs. Marissa declined offers of help; she refused food, water, clothing, or shelter. She sat on the street for hours in the hot sun: barely conscious and covered in her own body fluids. Police were called many times to try to get her help. She was taken to hospitals and even arrested, all of which resulted in her returning to the streets.

Rachel's staff made countless calls to entities that might be able to help, which were followed by a series of meetings. A coordinated response was created. Marissa was hospitalized and finally placed in conservatorship. She is now safely housed in a residential treatment facility.

Food Resource Centers



When clients come in to the Food Resource Centers they can feel timid, shy, embarrassed, sad, tearful, and depressed. But when they leave, they take with them hope, resources to improve the quality of their life, and the knowledge of new friends at Catholic Charities. Besides food assistance, we also help clients apply for CalFresh, the food stamp program in California.

In addition to food assistance and CalFresh, we also provide special holiday programs. For Thanksgiving we distribute packages of food, and at Christmas we provide shopping at our Christmas store, where parents can select gifts for their children free of charge.

This week a client told me that her family situation is starting to move in the right direction. She was scared when her husband lost his job and then his unemployment benefits. We helped her apply for CalFresh and she was approved. This same client was eligible for our Christmas store. She later gave me a big hug and said thank you for helping her family during the holidays. With the help her family received, she believes that 2015 will be a much better year!
