

A Lenten Examination of Conscience

Death and time seem to belong together as the conditions under which human beings can learn faith and love. Death helps us to see what is worth trusting and loving, and to see what is a waste of time.

- 1. If I were to die tomorrow, have I had joy? Have I cared? Have I had the best of what was available? Where is God in my life?
- 2. To what extent do I know the value and place of others in my life? Am I aware of and grateful for the roles others have played in making me, for better or for worse, who and what I am? Can I recognize the decisions of family, friends, or companions that have given me the freedom to make choices? Where is God in my life?
- 3. Am I capable of sacrificing my own desires, pleasures, longings, for the good of others? Can I see and be thankful for the sacrifices of others for me? Do I require praise for my self-giving, or am I willing to make mine an offering "in secret" solely for the good it can produce? Where is God in my life?
- 4. Who have I thought I loved? Was my motive self-giving or self-centered? When I hear the words "the joy of loving," do I think of what I can get or

what I can give to others? How often have I said, in words or deeds, "No Thanks!" to someone who has said to me, "I want to love you"? Does the Golden Rule have any practical place in my life? When have I last prayed for someone who hurt me; acted kindly toward someone who offended me; desired the good for someone who hates me? Where is God in my life?

- When I pray the Lord's Prayer, do I take seriously the words of the petition "Forgive us...as we forgive"? Am I willing to forgive others the wrongs they have done to me? Am I willing to ask forgiveness of wrongs I have done to others? Where is God in my life?
- How open am I to being healed? How open am I to exploring and recognizing and admitting those places in my heart and soul that need healing? Am I humble enough to recognize the role of others in the healing process, or does my ego insist that I "do it all myself"? Where is God in my life?

Human Trafficking News

On March 8 the world celebrates International Women's Day. It is an occasion to honor the economic, political, and social achievements of women past, present, and future. In some places (China, Russia, Vietnam, and Bulgaria) it is a national holiday.

Yet millions of women and girls lack basic human rights, such as education or the right to vote or to own property. Many are forced into marriage or tricked into slavery, especially since most are seeking work in order to help their families. They are promised false jobs, given false travel documents, and are subjected to physical violence, sexual assault, rape, battery, imprisonment, threats, and other forms of coercion, especially in poor countries or those at war. According to conservative estimates 21 million people, 80% of whom are women and children, are trafficked into forced labor and prostitution annually. Human trafficking has become a \$150-billion global industry.

During March let us remember the thousands of women and children of our own country who are caught and forcibly exploited by criminal gangs and unscrupulous traffickers.





Attendants in a "Field Hospital"

I believe one of the most enlightening comments Pope Francis has made thus far in his papacy is that the Church is a "field hospital" in the world. He believes our community of faith is called to "heal wounds" and to "warm the hearts of the faithful." Jesus modeled this so well in the Gospels, and we are called to actively participate in his life and ministry here and now.

As a visual person, our Holy Father's image conjures up for me images such as the story of the Good Samaritan, armed forces medical care units and the work of Blessed Mother Teresa. It also brings to mind early missionaries who brought Christianity to people around the globe.

I find the idea of a "field hospital" attendant somewhat overwhelming. But being good stewards of the Gospel, we are called to stand with and to serve our brothers and sisters during some of the most difficult times in their lives. This is a tremendous challenge and yet a sacred honor.



Recently, I was selected to serve as a juror in a criminal case. It was my first experience and I found it an unsettling and emotional experience for me. The fears and tears of witnesses as well as the defendant brought a very human and vulnerable dimension to this legal process. Though the outcome of the trial was based on the evidence and testimony provided, for me, the face of Jesus was everywhere in the courtroom.

After the trial concluded, I wondered if any of those who participated in the trial were ministered to in some way by the "field hospital" workers in their respective Parishes or worshipping communities. Was anyone visited, prayed for or given a compassionate ear and encouragement? I certainly hope so. There was so much opportunity here.

Until Jesus returns, our Church will always need to be a "field hospital." I thank those who have special gifts of empathy, compassion, courage, and love, and use them to be Jesus in the world. And, I ask you to pray with me that we will all recognize where we are called to heal wounds and warm hearts so we can share the love of Christ and be a witness to the Good News.



Announcement Regarding New Bishop for San Diego

I am happy to announce that Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Robert W. McElroy to be the sixth Bishop of San Diego.

Bishop McElroy was born in San Francisco in 1954. A fifth generation San Franciscan, Bishop McElroy lived until he was ten years old in Daly City. His family then moved to Burlingame. Feeling called to the priesthood, he entered Saint Joseph High School in Mountain View, the high school seminary of the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Bishop McElroy decided to pursue college studies outside the seminary system. He graduated from Harvard University in 1975 and then received a master's degree in American history from Stanford University in 1976.

Bishop McElroy reentered the seminary in the Fall of 1976 at Saint Patrick Seminary in Menlo Park, California. He was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of San Francisco on April 12, 1980. After a few years in a parish and diocesan assignment, he undertook graduate studies in the field of Catholic Social Teaching, obtaining a licentiate in theology from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley, a doctorate in moral theology from the Gregorian University in Rome and a doctorate in political science from Stanford. He returned to parish ministry in 1989. Bishop McElroy was appointed vicar general of the Archdiocese in 1995 and a pastor of a parish in 1996, where he served for more than fifteen years.

Bishop McElroy was ordained an auxiliary bishop of San Francisco on September 7, 2010 and served as the Archdiocesan Vicar for Parish Life and Development until his appointment to San Diego.

Bishop McElroy will be formally installed as the sixth Bishop of San Diego at a Mass to be celebrated at 1 p.m. at St. Thérèse of Carmel Parish on Wednesday, April 15.


