BREAKING OPEN THE DESIGN

understanding the design—the Reconciliation Chapel and the Chairs

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives sins and restores broken relationships—in our own lives, in relationships with others, and in our relationship with God—through the ministry of the Church.

The importance of this sacrament, indeed of God's desire for us to be in right relationship, is visible in our Church's design, that is, in the placement of the Reconciliation Chapel at the foot of the pinnacle of the building, the Tower of Light.

In its discussions of the design of the Reconciliation Chapel, the Interior Design Team focused on the requirements of the rite itself, specifically, that the room be large enough and set up to accommodate both sacramental options as required bv the Church—anonymous confession or face-to-face confession. For the former, we have hung a large screen between the penitent and the confessor, and for the latter, we have a chair for the penitent that faces the priest. Either option may be chosen.

One of the features of the chapel is a stained glass window that dominates one corner of the room. This piece. in the words of the artist brings God's light into the room. representing the fluidity between giving and receiving, between redemption and forgiveness, the ascending and descending movement of God's grace in the act of reconciliation. The color scheme allows us to reflect on the glory and mercy of reconciliation with the purple and lavender representing penance and the silver representing our salvation.

* * *

In the modern-day church building, flexibility is important. Not in the rites themselves, which are laid out in the liturgical texts, but rather in our execution of the liturgy so that our worship is a meaningful and fruitful encounter with our God.

To this end, we have chairs in four places in the Church: the front rows of the Church, the Daily Mass Chapel, the music ministry area, and at the back of the Church. Let's look at each of these, in reverse order.

First, the armed chairs at the back of the Church are for those who need a little assistance getting up and down before, during, and after during the liturgy. Like the slope that leads to the sanctuary, these chairs provide access to the liturgy for some that may have difficulty with the pews.

Second, in Built of Living Stones (BLS), the bishops write, "Music is integral to the liturgy. It unifies those gathered to worship, supports the song of the congregation, highlights significant parts of the liturgical actions, and helps to set the tone for each celebration" (BLS §88). Our parish's music ministry has grown over the past ten years, both in number and in type. The Interior Design Team asked the architect to design a space that allows the various choirs and ensembles to participate in the liturgy both independently and as a combined whole. To do this, flexible seating was critical so that the various groups can adapt the space to their particular needs.

Third, as discussed in last week's article, the chairs in the Daily Mass Chapel allow for the flexibility the Parish needs to expand from our usual complement of eighty chairs to the 100 or more that are sometimes needed for our well-attended smaller funeral liturgies.

Fourth, when the diocesan director of liturgy and spirituality came to visit just before we dedicated the Church, the chairs were not yet

placed. Her first words were, "How wonderful this would be for the ordination of our new priests." Although it is important for the assembly to be close to the sanctuary during the liturgy, it is also important that the space at the foot of the steps be sufficient to allow us to celebrate liturgies that require more room: the Sacrament of Marriage, especially for the larger wedding parties; Funeral Masses, especially when we have a casket; and the Ordination of Deacons and Priests. when the candidates prostrate themselves during the rite. To accommodate all these needs, removing chairs is much easier than removing pews.

So, as part of the design of our new Church, the Interior Design Team carefully evaluated those places where chairs would be needed to supplement the pews, balancing the sense of permanence that pews afford with the need for flexibility in certain liturgical situations.

And a final note...now that we have lived in the building for just over five weeks (!), we know that we are going to have to swap out the hard rubber pads on the feet of the chairs to alleviate the squeaking sound they make when they rub along the floor. Plans are being made, and we hope to have this taken care of in the next couple of months.


Good stewards rejoice in being followers of Jesus. They realize that Jesus' commission is their commission as well. They embrace it and adopt it as their own.


