It is these new groups of people, people of different races, ethnic backgrounds, and religions that bring a freshness, a new energy and enthusiasm into the life of our country. They are the life blood of our future...

Rather than fearing the unknown, we should get to know the unknown.

With that in mind, I want to call to your attention two events that will be taking place in our Diocese and in our Parish this month. These two events can help us to get to know those who many people are telling us that we should fear.

On Wednesday, February 17, at 7:00pm, Bishop McElroy, the Bishop of our Diocese, will be speaking with Sayyd Syeed, of the Islamic Society of North America, at the Joan B. Kroc School of Peace Studies at the University of San Diego. The title of their presentation is "Deepening Inter-Religious Dialogue and Community Alliances."

The context of the talk is: "Violent extremism, terrorism, and transnational violent movements under a religious banner have led to growing public concern. Security-based approaches to countering violence and extremism have in turn created new threats, particularly against the Muslim community in America."

On Sunday, February 28, at 12:30pm on the Upper Level of our Parish Center, Sheikh Yasser Qassim, the Imam of Masjid Al-Ittehad, the Mosque in Vista, will be here in our Parish. The title of this presentation, and our time together, will be "Getting to Know Our Neighbors: A Catholic/Muslim Dialogue." All are invited to attend.

Take time to get to know our neighbors. Do not let fear rule your lives as so many voices in our country are pushing us to do!

OUR PRAYERS LIKE INCENSE

We mark our days, not according to the numbers and squares on a calendar, but according to the observances of the liturgical seasons. Lent is the time for prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These ageold disciplines reflect our basic concerns; our relationship with God (prayer), with our bodies (fasting), and with each other (almsgiving) that ultimately help us to reflect on our life with Christ and prepare to renew our baptismal vows.

Our new church is filled with meaningful art and architecture; we have come to appreciate all the beautiful thoughtful fixtures and finishes that grace our worship space. We keep our eyes focused on the Sanctuary, mindful that Lent is a time for visual fasting; it is a time to journey with our Catechumens; it is a time to be personally confronted by the Gospel's demand for our ongoing conversion.

The color for Lent is purple. Purple is a symbol of penance. Scripture tell us that a purple garment was

Lent — a sense of the season

placed on Jesus during his passion as a mockery. The color purple and the days of penance themselves will eventually give way to the color white and celebration of Christ's victory over sin. At this time, less really is more.

Next to the change in color, you might notice that we do not sing the Alleluia. Alleluia is a term of great joy, and our use of the Alleluia Mass is a way of during participating in the angels' worship. It is also a reminder that the Kingdom of Heaven is already established on earth, in the form of Church. and that our participation Mass in is a participation in heaven. The Alleluia will joyfully return at the Easter Vigil.

In the days and weeks of Lent, we are invited to offer our prayers by writing them down using the prayer cards inserted in the Bulletin and available in the Church. Please place them in the large basket in the Sanctuary before or after Mass. You

are welcome to fill out as many as you would like for any personal petitions you may have.

In this Year of Mercy, may we pray for God's mercy in our lives that he might strengthen our resolved to extend mercy to all we meet, that we recognize that mercy is the bridge that connects God and man, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness. Amen.

A Christian steward works as an instrument of God. In all aspects of daily life, he or she cheerfully performs the work God has planned for his people. Being a Christian is accepting the role of steward.

There is no need to dwell on our responsibility, for it is clearly presented to us in Sacred Scripture—the command to take care of creation and the command to love one another.



A pastor was once asked to define "faithful giving." His eye-opening reply was simple:

"All I ask is that you apply the same standards to your church giving that you would to other areas important to your life!" Please consider:

- If your car starts one out of three or four times, do you consider it faithful?
- If the paper deliverer skips your Monday and Thursday editions, would you miss them?
- If you fail to come to work two or three times a month, would your boss call you faithful? If your refrigerator quits for a day now and then, do you excuse it and say, "Oh, well, it works fine most of the time"?
- If you miss a couple of mortgage or car payments during the year, would your bank say, "Oh, well, 10 out of 12 isn't really that bad?"
- Or, finally, if you count on someone to meet you at a certain place or certain time each week, and this person consistently stands you up, do you consider this person faithful in their promise to you?

Seriously think about applying the same standards to your faith giving as you do in other areas of your total life. God loves a cheerful giver.
