

#### CELEBRATING HOLY WEEK...WHY BOTHER?

When I attend the week-long National Association of Pastoral Musicians conference every other year, one of the commitments I make is to attend Morning Prayer every day, Tuesday through Friday. Each morning, the convention planners offer a different experience for Morning Prayer, celebrating the diversity inherent in the Catholic universe—different musical forces, different languages, even different traditions (the Morning Prayer service offered by an Eastern Orthodox priest, deacon, and choir will be a lasting memory of mine for years to come!).

Getting up every morning to celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours doesn't seem like too big of a deal on the way to the conference. But after a day's workshops and lectures, an evening's concerts, and the late-night liturgies, the morning comes pretty early. And that's on Wednesday. By Friday, there's a strong desire to roll over when the alarm goes off and take the extra hour of sleep, skipping the week's final prayer service. But it is always worth it. And when I am on my way home, and in need of much needed sleep, I always count these Morning Prayer services among the most powerful moments of spiritual growth and refreshment that I experience at the conference.

For me, Holy Week is similar.

Next week, we begin our annual journey through the days of Holy Week and into Easter Sunday in which we mark specific elements of Christ's final days on earth—Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and the Easter Vigil—celebrating our Lord's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, his institution of the Eucharist, his death and burial, and his resurrection.

It's a lot of liturgy. And there is a real desire to skip something, to take a night off. We know the story. We know the ending! Who doesn't? In fact, can't I skip right from Palm Sunday to Easter morning without missing anything. We hear the Passion narrative on Palm Sunday, so I don't really need to hear it again on Good Friday. Right? We hear the words of institution at every Mass, so I don't really need to go to Holy Thursday's Mass. Do I? And all those readings at the Easter Vigil which we hear at other points throughout the year, do I need to hear them again. Really?

But this misses the point.

Yes, all of these things happen, but every liturgy within Holy Week puts these events in greater context. On Palm Sunday, the Passion narrative is preceded by the entry into Jerusalem, without which we miss noticing the speed at which Jesus' fate turned. The Institution of Holy Communion is preceded by the Washing of Feet, connecting the call to service to the call to be fed at the Lord's Table. The Passion narrative on Good Friday is followed by the Veneration of the Cross in which we can marry our individual crosses to the cross that Jesus carried. The scripture proclaimed at the Easter Vigil recounts the salvation story, all in one place, all in one hearing.

All of it points to the Resurrection.

Certainly, Easter Sunday is what we Christians are all about. And for some, it might be enough. But experiencing the entire story, the entire journey, following in the footsteps of Christ through the entire week, provides an opportunity for spiritual growth and refreshment that only comes once each year.

I hope you will join me. I hope you will join us!



## Young Adult Ministry

Young Adult ministry strives to reach out and minister to young adults so as to draw them into responsible participation into the full life and mission of the Church. It strives to connect young adults to Christ, His Church, and a faith filled peer community by offering various social, service, and spiritual opportunities. By reaching the young adults in this manner, our diocese has witnessed a New Pentecost. We focus on capturing, cultivating, and commissioning young adults on a regional and parish level; we are succeeding and growing. An example of such growth can be witnessed within the hearts of those who recently attended our September "Awakening" Young Adult Retreat.

This year during the retreat our small groups were based upon regions in the hope that the groups would continue to meet after sharing a powerful weekend together. Of the nearly 150 young adults on retreat and 18 small groups, 10 of them still meet weekly. Furthermore, the individuals within these groups have found ways to put flesh to their prayers by serving the poor, reaching out to the needy, and inviting their peers to do the same.

It is through these events as well as our speaker series, Christmas Gala, Mega-Mass, and Theology on Taps that we have been able to empower and effectively build an active Young Adult community here within the diocese. It is through our large events that we capture young adults. It is through weekly small groups and bible studies that we cultivate young adults. Finally, it is the through the mentorship and the discipleship of Young Adult Coordinators that we commission young adults to repeat the process among their peers and do the same.

Currently we have 24 weekly studies shared amongst 36 parishes with approximately 400 young adults actively engaged each week here in San Diego County. In Imperial County we are beginning to establish young adult ministry groups at 7 new parishes in conjunction with the already 5 groups in existence. From these 400 young adults we have found that nearly 800 are involved sometime throughout the year in some sort of

diocesan run large group event. Reflections of those numbers can be found at our 2015 Mega Mass held in August where 550 young adults were in attendance. With over 3,000 names in our database, we are blessed with technology that allows us to email these young adults on a monthly basis.

As a new full time staffed office within the diocese we thank you for supporting our movement through your contribution to the Annual Appeal. With your support our efforts to evangelize and bring home this missing generation will continue.


