(Born in prison and cared for by her grandma, this child talked with her mom on the phone every month but after eight years, this was the first time they met.) "I saw her face for the first time. I didn't expect my mom to be so tall!" (8 yr. old).

"Driving in to the prison is my most favorite suspense" (teenager).

This living, breathing, pulsating presence which, by grace, we know and freely experience—is the source of our authenticity, our holiness, our wholeness, the reason for our survival, and the singularly most important word and witness we have to offer to the world. God's presence with and within us, both as individuals and as church, is made manifest through many faces, through various modes of divine self-communication and through countless overtures of loving selfrevelation.

Some of the most significant of these faces and some of the most poignant and profound overtures come together during this month of May. We stand in awe and dumbfounded wonder while God is revealed as an all-pervading and creative Spirit (May 15), as a family of Persons in whose embrace we are privileged to share (May 22), and as

eucharistic Food to feed the hungers of sinners (May 29). While the mysteries revealed through these loving overtures of God are too profound for thorough our understanding, we look at each of these, in turn, like a facet of a gem. As we look on in wonder, grace challenges us to press on beyond mere understanding to faith, which is willing to learn, to grow, and to find joy and fulfillment in the process. Like the earliest followers of Jesus, with whom we renewed our acquaintance during the weeks after Easter (including May 1 and 8), we are a work in progress, not left to our own devices but always free to choose how carefully, how deeply we wish to cooperate with the presence of God with and within us.

In the very center of May, our celebration of Pentecost offers an opportunity to become more keenly attuned to the movements of the Spirit. Sometimes subtle, sometimes bold, these movements are meant to stir us, to shake us, to blow out whatever "cobwebs" might accrue within us. This is the same Spirit Jesus breathed upon his first disciples, empowering them for a mission of peace, forgiveness, and evangelization. From the Acts of the Apostles and ensuing church history, we know of their valiant efforts. We take them as our patrons and our inspiration as that same Spirit is breathed into us. Except for the Spirit, how else could we account for the church's survival? Through wars, schisms, sinful and corrupt leadership: through violent and persecutions periods ignominy; through disease, famine, and infidelities too numerous to count and too shameful to call to mind, the church has survived and thrived due to the unfailing presence of the Holy Spirit with and within the sinful, struggling body of Christ.

scripture themes for May

For this, our hearts must beat anew with humble, grateful praise.

We are also grateful for and humbled by the gift we celebrate on May 22-our triune God. God is revealed as three members who are one in mutual love. God is Trinity: Mother/Father, Son and Brother, and Spirit, a relational God whose very being invites us to share in that divine relationship. On Trinity Sunday, in what was to be the last year of his life, Henri Nouwen encouraged those with him at Eucharist to live out all of their relationships in human God (Sabbatical Journey, Crossroad Pub. Co., New York: 1998). By claiming the Holy Trinity as the home for our relational lives, we acknowledge the presence of God's grace to help us forgive and be forgiven, and thereby to be more authentic witnesses to the presence of God with and within us.

Our revelry in God's gracious presence comes to a climax as we celebrate Christ's Most Holy Body and Blood on May 29. Bread blessed, broken, and shared is the sign and the means whereby believers continue to encounter Jesus. Ordinary sustenance is assimilated by the one who eats, but with the eucharistic gift of bread and wine, the one who eats is assimilated by the One whose very body and blood are present in the eucharistic sacrament. In this sacred Food and in our sharing, we become our true selves, beloved children of our Mother/Father God: beloved brothers and sisters of our Lord, God and Brother Jesus; alive with the breath of the Spirit. In that capacity, we are graced so that we may be willing to be blessed, broken, shared, and fully consumed by the hungers of this world. Can there be any greater calling? Can there be any truer love?



Embracing Those Who Suffer From Mental Illness (Part 2)

When we encounter mental illness among family members, friends, neighbors, fellow Parishioners, what should we do?

- Seek understanding instead of passing judgment. Mental illness is a disease, one we may not initially understand.
- Get more information—read a book, do some research online, or perhaps even attend a workshop sponsored by the National Alliance on Mental Illness.
- Resist the temptation to believe that people in treatment have all their needs met; mental health professionals can't be expected to provide all the needs of one in treatment. It takes a community to provide acceptance, spiritual guidance, and compassion.
- Offer positive support and be sensitive to those seeking medical intervention
- Be silent if you don't know what to say—but be there for and merciful to those with mental illness.
- If you're not a mental-health professional, acknowledge your limitations, but remember no professional qualifications are required to be friendly and kind or to enter into a supportive friendship.
- Offer the dignity of a handshake and a smile, companionship and perhaps even friendship.
- Remember in your prayers those who suffer from mental illness, their families, caregivers, as well as all mental-health professionals.


