As We Approach the Altar...

On this *Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*, as we approach the altar,
let us reflect upon the words of those who have gone before us:

St. Augustine

The Lord left us in this sacrament his body and blood. Now we are called to become his body, and through his mercy, we are what we receive.

Just as you see that the bread is one loaf, so may you be one body by loving one another, by having one faith, one hope, and undivided charity.

Thus too, the wine existed in many clusters of grapes and now it is one. It is one in this cup after the crushing of the grapes in the wine press.

And now, you, in the name of Christ, have come to drink of the cup of the Lord. There you are on the table, and there you are in the cup, for you are one with us. We receive together, and we drink together because we live together.



St. Ignatius of Antioch

Come together in common, one and all without exception in charity, in one faith and in one Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Son of man, so that with undivided mind you may break one bread which is the medicine of immortality and the remedy against death, enabling us to live for ever in Jesus Christ.

St. John Chrysostom

God gave one house for all of us to dwell in. It is called the world. God distributed all created things equally. God kindled one sun for all; stretched above us one roof, the sky; and set up one table, which is the earth.

But God also gave us a much greater table than this. It is the table of one loaf and one cup. We have been made rich and one in this bread and wine.

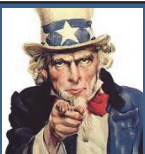
Brother Benno's

The ICSC Family Celebrates Bishop Robert Morneau This May

A beloved founding father of the Christian stewardship movement in the Catholic tradition celebrates his 50th anniversary as a priest this month, May 28. Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus Robert Morneau of the Diocese of Green Bay, Wisconsin, was ordained there in 1966.

Although his ministry assignments have kept him close to his Wisconsin roots, his impact on the Christian Stewardship movement has extended nationally and internationally.

Bishop Morneau served as a member of the ad hoc committee on stewardship which produced the U.S. Bishops' pastoral letter, "Stewardship: A Disciple's Response," and following its adoption by the Bishops' conference, Bishop Morneau became one of the most eloquent and effective proponents of stewardship in the Catholic Church, and a resource on stewardship for dioceses and parishes worldwide.



A much sought-after writer, speaker, and retreat leader, Bishop Morneau's speaking style, folksy and soft-spoken, yet peppered with literary and poetic references, has made him a favorite at Catholic conferences, including at the International Catholic Stewardship Council (ICSC) stewardship conferences.

Calling stewardship "a way of life based on conversion of heart," Bishop Morneau would often use garden imagery, challenging his audience to respond to the question, "What have you done with the garden entrusted to you?"

In 2013 he told the *Compass*, Green Bay's diocesan paper, "In preaching, I try to image a tired housewife or a stressed-out father who sits in the back pew. What will help them to grow in faith and make it through the next week?" A golfer, runner, avid reader, and Green Bay Packers' fan, his essays have appeared in publications including *U.S. Catholic* and *St. Anthony Messenger*.

Bishop Morneau is also the author of several books, including one he cites as a favorite, *Spiritual Direction: Principles and Practices*, as well as a children's book, *The Gift*, which carries a stewardship theme. He is the pastor of Resurrection Catholic Church in Green Bay, and a number of his homilies and pastoral reflections can be found on the parish's website (www.gbres.org). Catholic stewards owe Bishop Morneau a deep debt of gratitude, and will remember him in prayer in a special way on his 50th anniversary as a priest.
