

What is a Homily?

Homily? What is it? Is it just a fancy word for sermon? Or is there a difference?

Yes. There is a difference. A sermon's purpose is to educate in regard to some facet or tenet of the Faith. A homily is more of a personal reflection of the Scriptures that are proclaimed that day in the Liturgy.

The primary purpose of the homily is to help the congregation in their reflection on the Scriptures: "What am I hearing in these Scriptures that can be related to the events of my life?" "How is this Scripture being fulfilled in my life?" The homilist's reflection assists the individuals of the congregation to reflect upon the movement of God in their lives. A homily attempts to bring together Faith and the ordinary events of our lives. In that sense, it is a very personal, subjective effort.

A sermon is much more objective and attempts to hand on the doctrines and tenets of the Faith. The sermon attempts to teach objectively more than to share personally.

There are times in which people express a desire to hear sermons rather than homilies: "How will Catholics know the Faith if it is not handed on objectively?" "At Mass, we need to be taught! Where else will people learn?"

The need for sermons belies an attitude of "one-stop shopping," that is, it is an attitude of people who want to spend that one hour on Sunday and "get it all."

The Mass on Sunday, ultimately, is not about education. It is about worship. We come together to praise God and to enter into the Mystery of God's Presence. We delve into the Scriptures, the living word of God, to experience God's activity in our lives. Because we experience God's Presence in our lives and because we give God praise and glory, we desire to experience more. So, naturally, we desire to know and learn more about this God and about God's activity in the community, the Church. Now we have the need to be educated.

STRIVE TO KNOW BY HEART

the psalms of June

by Clara Dina Hinojosa, from Celebration June 2016, with permission. A friend of mine was raised playing a game of quoting Christian scripture. When he told this to me, we agreed to test his knowledge. After I posed several tricky questions, it was clear that his memory could still connect scripture with chapter and verse.

Similarly, I'm reminded of a Benedictine nun who could quote the psalms. Rather than challenging each other to a game of "name that psalm," she and her monastic community members learned these sacred texts by faithfully praying the psalms daily within the communal Liturgy of the Hours and in their own practice of *lectio divina*.

Within the collection of 150 psalms, the church proclaims the full array of human emotion. With that in mind, Benedictine Sr. Irene Nowell named her excellent primer on the Psalter *Pleading, Cursing, Praising: Conversing with God through the Psalms.* And so in June, we sing four psalms that reveal a wide gamut of feelings and experiences.

On June 5, we hear two passages of mothers losing their children (the first reading and the Gospel). In both instances, God intervenes, and their sons are resuscitated. The appointed psalm—I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me (v.2)—proclaims praise after being in the grip of extreme anguish. This psalm of confidence typifies the pairing of opposite emotions: desperation and exaltation.

Like the psalmist, have you experienced sinking into a pit, perhaps sensing that there was no way out? After you were saved from despair, what song of joy did you offer to God, who changes our mourning into dancing?

Although it is among the seven penitential psalms, Psalm 32 (June 12) is ultimately one of thanksgiving. Following an admission of transgression—Lord, forgive the wrong I have done (v.5)—there is a conversion of heart. This is pivotal to the resulting freedom that the writer later experiences. In parallel with today's 2 Samuel passage (Nathan confronting David for his premeditated sins) and the Gospel of Luke (the sinful woman who pours oil on and bathes Jesus' feet with her tears of repentance), we hear the psalmist acknowledge sins as well as exclaim joy when suffering is lifted.

As you explore your own heaviness of regret and freedom from guilt, what is aroused within you? As you approach those places needing God's mercy and compassion, how do you voice your admission of transgression?

Psalm 63 expresses lament. thanksgiving, and trust (June 19). As this scriptural song begins, the psalmist cries out, "My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God... like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water" (vss. 2,4). While describing feelings of longing, the writer draws upon themes within nature, as is common within Hebrew scripture. Similar to how the riches of a banquet satisfy the hungry, so too does God's blessing fill those seeking union with the Divine. "Under the shadow of your wings" is where the writer finds security in God's protection. As you listen to your inner voice, for what are you most hungry? When you have felt alone, how have you trusted in God's enduring presence, whose right hand upholds you?

In its first lines, Psalm 16 (June 26) reveals the writer's trust in God. In verse 6, we hear the appointed refrain—You are my inheritance, O Lord. Delighted in the portion awarded to the psalmist and his people, the poem speaks of the unwavering support offered by the one, true God. Confident in the path

of the life set forth, the psalmist celebrates the fullness of joy that comes when relying on God's presence alone.

In a world where property and money typically comprise one's inheritance, what is the spiritual legacy that you have received from God? As a Christian disciple, how do you, or will you, embody this grace?

I often recall the manner in which my friend and the nun proclaimed their respective texts. Under a closer review, there appears to be a distinct difference. The rote recitation of scripture by the former seemed to be an activity of the head. On the other hand, the proclaiming of the psalms appeared to surface from a place deep within.

As you approach the psalms, avoid simply reading them from the page or learning them by rote. Instead strive to know them by heart. Savor these words, and let them rise from the depths of your own emotion. Whether you sing them within the Sunday assembly or in the quiet setting of an intimate prayer space, imagine your proclamation aligned with the entire church's expression of faith. Allow your life circumstances of praising, pleading, thirsting, and celebrating to intertwine with the experiences of the psalmists and the entire People of God.




