In our efforts to be financially transparent, we have included in the Bulletin each week, the monthly report on our mortgage.

Some questions have been raised regarding this, so I wanted to give a report as we complete the second year of our Mortgage/Building Completion Fund.



Most of us, if we have any family at all, know certain characters who have stood out in our memory and become a treasured aspect of our personal history. There's the uncle who served in the armed forces and needs no prompting to recount the battles he has fought. There's the aunt who never tires of sharing her "battles" on the operating table and is willing to give you a peek at her scars. Then there's the grandma whose prize-winning pies and cakes are known and appreciated by all. In our family, we had an adopted Uncle Bob who would come to every family event and show off the latest addition to his frog collection—the ceramic type, not the ribbiting kind.

These wonderful characters with all their qualities and idiosyncrasies are part of the fabric of our existence. In the sacred texts for October, we are reacquainted with memorable and admirable characters who are part of our spiritual heritage. In keeping with his penchant for choosing unusual and unexpected heroes, Luke will feature characters like the grateful Samaritan leper (Oct. 9). Doubly regarded as an outcast because of his ethnicity (Jews despised Samaritans) and for his illness (lepers were ostracized from society), this man is featured, nevertheless, as a model of faith to be emulated by Jesus' disciples.


In a world where widows had few—if any—rights, and were obliged to rely on the compassion of others for survival, Luke held out for admiration the example of a widow (Oct. 16). A judge who "neither feared God nor respected any human being" was stubbornly refusing to rule in her favor. Only her dogged persistence moved him to action. Through her example, Jesus wished his disciples to learn how to pray "always and without becoming weary."

### scripture themes for October

On Oct. 23, two contrasting characters will further the formation of Jesus' disciples, one a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. One presumed his own righteousness and proudly declared his virtues before God. He even compared himself favorably to others lest God underestimate his worth. In the end, he did not really pray to God; he merely advertised himself before God and the praying assembly. The tax collector, on the other hand, knew himself to be in the presence of his Maker. That awareness made him conscious of his sins and, humbly, he prayed for God's mercy. Most of us would like to think that our prayer is humble and authentic, but the examples Jesus holds forth challenge us to examine whether this is so. At whom are we looking when we pray? Perhaps we need to regain our focus and our center in God.

Wonderful, impulsive Zacchaeus will speak to our hearts on Oct. 30. Not content to remain just part of the crowd who watched and waited for Jesus to pass by, he climbed a tree to see the man from Nazareth whose reputation preceded him. When Jesus, who searches and knows every heart, saw him, he invited himself to Zacchaeus' home. Jesus was, in effect, asking if Zacchaeus would welcome him into his heart. This he did, eagerly and with joy. Open to Jesus and to grace, Zacchaeus was also willing to be transformed, such that he promised to right the wrong in his life and reach out, as Jesus did, to help the poor, not merely out of his abundance but of his substance. How many of us are willing to stretch the 10 percent tithe to 50 percent, as Zacchaeus did?

In addition to these uniquely Lucan characters, we are also privileged this month to encounter Paul, who,

in his pastoral advice to Timothy, reveals his good heart as well as his loving concern for the growing church. Like Zacchaeus, Paul underwent a thorough transformation from persecutor to preacher par excellence of the good news of salvation. Like Jesus, he suffered dearly for his convictions, but nothing quenched his spirit or dampened the fire of his faith. Pastors will find in his writings the inspiration and encouragement they need to persevere. People in the pews will be buoyed by his indomitable courage. His devotion to God's inspired word is second only to that of Jesus. We can only be proud and grateful to revere him as our mentor in the faith. Like him, we too are to proclaim the word and "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient." Like him, we are to "convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching" (Oct. 16). Amen.


